

From the Rabbi's desk

As I write this during our first (major) snowstorm of the season, it reminds me of the adage, "March comes in like a lion." I'm praying that it indeed "goes out like a lamb," and the weather warms up. Our motto this month should be "March comes in with Shabbat Across America and goes out with Purim!" Shabbat Across America falls on Friday, March 1, and Purim on March 23—both very joyous occasions. As I mentioned in last month's Voice, we are in a leap year, and an entire month is added to the calendar - Adar II. The saving. "from the beginning of Adar, we increase our "simcha" — joy" [B. Taanit 29al is doubly true, since we have two full months of Adar, and an extra month to get ready for Purim, hence the joy!

Purim is always associated with iov and silliness—with a command to actually get drunk: the Talmud (Megillah 7b) teaches, "Rava said, 'It is a person's duty to intoxicate themselves on Purim until they cannot tell the difference between 'cursed be Haman' and 'blessed be Mordecai." Yet, on the other hand, it is very serious. It is a story about a plan to exterminate the Jews. And, as approach the holiday preparation, on Shabbat Zachor, we are obligated to read the passage in the Torah about what Amalek did to us when we left Egypt (Deut. 25:17-19); how he snuck up on the Israelites and cut down the infirm and weak who were in the rear.

We are living in difficult times. Antisemitism is on the rise, there is war in Israel and as of this writing, there are still many captives in Gaza. The tragedy in Israel began on Simchat Torah and many wondered how we could experience joy on that horrible day. I acknowledged that we Jews often mix joy and sorrow. Purim will be one of those times as well.

Purim is a story of opposites. But perhaps that is the point. Life is a series of opposites as well. We are forced to laugh in the face of sorrow, pain and even fear. These times that we are living in are no exception. In this year of ups and downs, light and darkness, joy and sadness, we are given permission to let go.

I am looking forward to celebrating with all of you.

Did you know that the creators of Curious George, Hans and Margret Rey, were Jewish refugees saved during World War II?

Temple member Eva Heisler alerted me to a fascinating event by the Sousa Mendes Foundation exploring the Reys' lives. The event featured a documentary, *Monkey Business: The Adventure of Curious George's Creators* based on the Louise Borden's book *The Journey that Saved Curious George.* The event also featured a streaming discussion with filmmaker Ema Ryan Yamazaki and historian Dr. Susan Zuccotti.

Founded in 2010, the Sousa Mendes Foundation is dedicated to honoring the memory of the Holocaust rescuer Aristides de Sousa Mendes and to educating the world about his good work. Aristides de Sousa Mendes was recognized as a "Righteous Among the Nations" for saving the Reys and countless others. A brief discussion on the "Rights Among the Nations" was incorporated into the Adult Education Chiune Sugihara event last June.



Scoop's Schmooze

"Life is Good".

For those of you who maintain a library of past editions of The Voice, you will be able to see that that was the opening theme of my Schmooze from October of 2018; which obviously was before our world forever changed just over a year later. And, even with all of those changes and life alterations over the last five-plus years, no matter how painful, as Joe Walsh sang in his 1978 hit, "Life's Been Good To Me So Far."

All I have to do is look at the first handful of weeks of 2024. For as I celebrated the 49th anniversary of my bar mitzvah, Geri Weiss granted me the honor of reciting the Kiddush that Friday night, January 26—Parshat Beshalach. As Renee and I sat where we usually do---on Rabbi Ballan's side, about three rows back on the wall-aisle seats, many past moments and future aspirations flashed before me.

About 12 hours later, Renee and I headed north on I-95 to spend the weekend with my parents, where we celebrated my birthday with them and my sister; who managed to set up a FaceTime with my college sophomore niece to help make that weekend complete. A week later we celebrated here with Renee's side of the family and was greeted by my mother-in-law Rose joyfully and proudly singing Happy Birthday as soon as I walked in her front door.






