From the Rabbi's Desk

On the secular calendar, we are in the month of February. In the Northeast, we are typically in a deep freeze (at least we are as I write this!). On the Jewish calendar, we are in the middle of the month of Shevat, and by the end of February we will be well into the month of Adar.

Many of our Jewish holidays fall when the moon is full. Tu Bishvat, literally, "the 15th of Shevat" was the date assigned by the Rabbis of the Mishnah to determine how old a tree was so that the first fruits of the tree calculated would be and collected for the Temple at the proper time. Tu Bishvat came into disuse after the fall of the Temple, when it was no longer necessary to collect these tithes. However, the mystics in Safed sought to renew the practice because one of the S'phirot, the emanations of God, is that of a Tree. They began the custom of a Tu Bishvat Seder, and with it tried to incorporate the fruits and produce of the Land of Israel.

It wasn't until the midtwentieth century, that Tu Bishvat became the "Jewish

Arbor Day." Before Israel was a modern state, the Jewish National Fund's primary purpose was acquiring land in Israel. After the war of Independence in 1948, the Jewish National Fund began to focus settling new areas; absorbing immigrants and providing them with employment working the land; reclamation for agricultural purposes, and then to the reforestation of the land. Nowadays, a major focus of the JNF is greening the land and it become has а global environmental leader.

We, too, have reclaimed Tu Bishvat, connecting the concept of "*bal tashchit*" —not to destroy or waste — and using it to effect some change in our environment for good. We will be honoring the holiday this year on Friday evening, February 6 at our Family Shabbat Service at 7:30 pm.

As February ends, we will be in the month of Adar, when we "increase our happiness" (B. Taanit 29a). This is in anticipation of Purim. Although Purim does not fall until March 4, it's right around the corner. Once again Temple Beth Sholom will put on a Purim Shpiel. This time it will begin at 5:30 pm, followed by a light supper and dessert. I am encouraging everyone to come and try out for the play – and that means adults, too! Contact Cantor Barr if you want to participate. Shalom uv'racha,

Purim is time for fun and happiness. Our celebration commemorates the victory of Mordechai and Esther over Haman's wicked decrees against the Jewish people. The observance of Purim serves to strengthen our people by inspiring us to work together in advancing the cause of Jewish unity. We express the joy of Jewish survival by reading the *Megillah*, partaking in a festive holiday meal and performing the beautiful mitzvah of "*mishloah manot*," sending gift packages of sweets to friends and neighbors.

As we did last year, Temple Beth Sholom is offering all of our members and friends the opportunity to participate with minimal effort in the joyous tradition of *mishloah manot*. An elegant package brimming with *hammantaschen*, candy and other goodies will be packed for each person you designate. Temple Beth Sholom will coordinate the distribution in such a way that only one Purim package will be sent to any specified family. Each parcel will include a card with a listing of all donors who designated the family as a gift recipient. Packages will be available at the Purim Ball on February 28 and at Temple the night of the *megillah* reading on March 4 and through Sunday, March 8th. Packages not picked up by March 15th will be donated to charity. The cost is \$18 for the first designated family and \$2 for each additional name listed.

In order to avoid any omission in gift lists, members are encouraged to register in advance for the reciprocal exchange of Purim packages. By marking the appropriate space on the form provided on the back of this sheet, you can ensure that each individual designating your family as a gift recipient will in turn automatically receive a Purim parcel bearing your name. Notes From Cantor Kathy Barr

Shalom!

T'*u BiShvat higiya, chag ha-ilanot* (T'u Bishvat is coming, holiday of the trees) T'u Bishvat, the 15th of of the Hebrew month, Shevat, is one of the four new years mentioned in the Talmud. Did you know that Rosh Hashanah is not the beginning of the year? It is the Tithing New Year. The actual beginning of the Jewish year is the 1st of Nissan, the month that Passover is in. In the Torah, it is known as Aviv.

Both the Torah and Talmud stress how important trees are. In fact, if you invade a place, (the Torah is full of invasions) you must leave the trees. If the Messiah comes, and you happen to be planting a tree, finish planting before you follow him. We plant trees in Israel commemorating a special occasion or person. Trees shade us when we are hot, they hold water with their roots and prevent landslides and arid conditions, they predict the weather and give animals places to live.

In Israel, Tu Bishvat signifies that the end is coming to the winter rains, and that spring is near. The almond trees start to blossom with beautiful pink flowers, and the country starts to come back to life.

It is customary in many places to have a T'u Bishvat Seder. There are different minhagim (customs). Some, like us eat different kinds of fruit (with seeds you cannot eat, with seeds you can eat, hard shells, edible shells, etc.) There are four cups of grape juice - all white, a little pink, half red and half white, and all red. Our T'u Bishvat Seder will be held on February 4th (one month before Purim and two months before Passover.) during school hours.

Mark your calendars: Nefashot is coming back to Temple Beth Shalom on March 20th. Last time they played and sang at services, everyone there felt uplifted and joyful. We will have electric and acoustic guitars, drums, a piano and voices - not to be missed! **Religious School News**

As I write to you, I am still thinking about how proud I was of the Academy Class as they led us in prayer at January Family Services, and I am already looking forward to the grade 5-6 Shabbat. I am also extremely proud of Joseph Gandelman organized and conducted our January Junior Congregation when I was away! Thanks to the PA moms who have been organizing our yummy onegs and game nights!

I would like to know what you want from your Sisterhood. If you have any ideas of suggestions, please feel free to contact me.


