From the Rabbi's Desk

Shalom and a *zissen* Pesach to everyone!

By the time you read this you most likely will be celebrating Passover and munching on Matzah (though as of this writing I haven't even begun my Pesach preparations and cleaning, but I digress).

We often associate Passover with miracles. Yet the story would never have happened without the kindness and bravery of two Hebrew midwives who refused to kill the male babies, Miriam, who watched over Moses as his mother put him in a basket in the Nile, and Pharaoh's daughter, who pulled him out of the Nile and raised him as her own. These are acts of loving-kindness, going beyond what is expected of us.

We learn in the Mishnah: The world stands on three things: Torah, *Avodah* (service), and *Gemilut Chasadim* (acts of loving-kindness). One wonders why the word *tzedakah* (charity) is not used here instead. After all, *tzedakah* is a commandment.

In the Talmud, [Sukkah 49b] "Our masters taught: Loving-kindness is greater than *tzedakah* (charity) in three ways. Charity is done with one's

money, while loving-kindness may be done with one's money or with one's person. Charity is given only to the poor, while loving-kindness may be given to both the poor and to the rich. Charity is given only to the living, while loving-kindness may be shown to both the living and the dead."

As Rabbi Michael Strassfeld puts it, "To act out of loving-kindness is to identify with other people, to feel for them, to want to help them or ease their burden even if simple justice would not require it. To act out of loving-kindness is to understand we are all lost in a broken world, yet together we can improve the journey of life. *Gemilut hesed* means to care even when it is 'not deserved.'"

TBS gives you many opportunities to offer *gemilut hesed*: Our Caring Committee is getting underway; we can still use more volunteers to send cards, visit those who are ill or are in mourning, and giving people rides to TBS Friday evenings. Please let me know if you are interested in joining the committee.

Finally, Walt and I would like to thank all those who sent cards and well wishes for Walt's speedy recovery. Every day he gets a little better. I hope by the time you read this he will be able to walk up the stairs and join us for services!

March Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, March 9, 2015. The Board passed the February Financial Report as presented by Treasurer Mike Temares. Three new member units were presented to the Board, and they were all approved, bringing the current number of membership units to 139. It was stated that it is very important that whenever there is a Temple event planned, that the date be communicated and cleared with the TBS Office first, to assure that the space is not already taken. The Board approved a motion to authorize the Pulpit and Ritual Committee to explore the cost for additional musician's fees/expenses for High Holidays. Vice President Joy Bobrow reported that the Temple has switched gas provider to Veridian, a green-energy company, modeled such that Temple will get a small percentage for anyone who signs with Viridian through TBS. There will be a short presentation on this on Sunday morning, March 29th at 10:30 AM. Many mentioned the successful Purim Ball and Vice President Fay Schildkraut reported that they are considering making it an annual event and even adding an additional dance event in the fall.

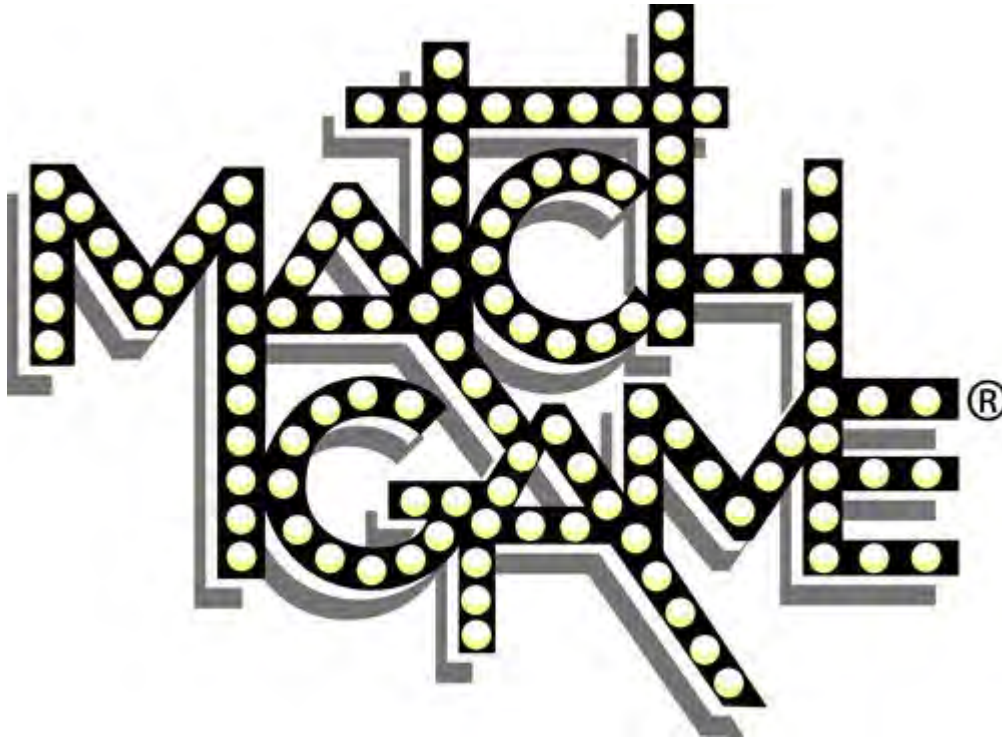

Spring is finally here! It is my favorite time of year. God brings everything back to life. The flowers bloom, many animals are having babies, trees flower and leave, but most of all, this year, April 3rd is the first seder. Passover is a holiday that is celebrated by Jews, both observant and secular around the world. Even Conversos celebrate it with a festive meal, although some of them don't know where it came from. I can't wait for all the Passover foods (except for the really terrible substitutes - I just don't eat them for a week). Passover (Pesach) is my favorite holiday. I became a cantor because of what I heard and experienced on Pesach. We always celebrated at our neighbor's apartment, which was filled to the brim with Judaica and ruach. The haggadah we used was Reconstructionist, the matriarch of the house was raised Orthodox, taught art and sang beautifully, the patriarch of the house was an atheist, a doctor, and marched with Dr. King in Selma. We had Jews around the table from every walk of life; owners of a borscht belt hotel to Hebrew school teachers, doctors, lawyers, salesmen, scholars - you name it. No wonder I ended up at a pluralist school to become a member of the clergy!

I just wrote an article for Ten Minutes of Torah (a free URJ online publication) about art in our haggadot. Throughout the ages, since the 12th Century when the earliest existent haggadah was first created, Jews have expressed themselves artistically by decorating the pages of their haggadot. The first Sephardic haggadah is known as the Birds' Head Haggadah. All the characters have birds' heads, probably because of the proscription against making a graven image. (As humans were created in God's image, drawings of humans could constitute graven images.) These are all very interesting to see, and I show a fair amount of examples as well as give suggestions of others. The article was due to come out on March 24th. If anyone is interested, I can send you a link.

Mark your calendars! Sunday, May 31st at 4:30 pm, will be the Cantor's Cabaret. This will be a concert/talent show, right here at Temple Beth Sholom. We will be singing a few non-liturgical choral pieces, but not to be missed are the other things as well torch songs, comedy and sing alongs, as well as food. 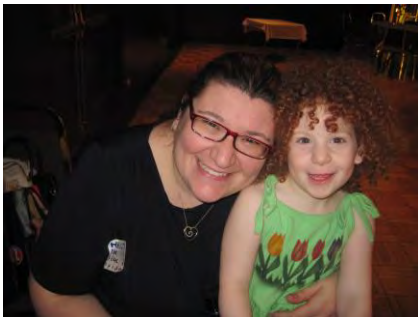
