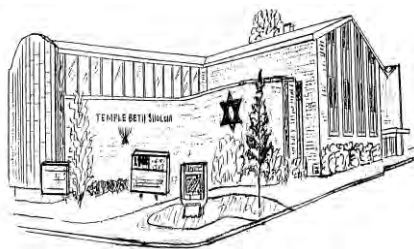

From the Rabbi's Desk *Shanah Tovah!*

As September begins, many of us have returned to work from our summer vacations; our children are getting ready to return to school. The process of *teshuvah*, or return, (from the Hebrew root shin-vav-vet) has also begun, as we prepare for the High Holidays with self-reflection and introspection.

With that in mind, I ask you all to join us for a wonderful "Return to Temple" Pasta dinner on September 5, which will be followed by our *Selichot* services formally ushering in the High Holy Day period.

Return to TBS as we have an exciting year planned: Join us for a Shabbat afternoon picnic on September 19; we will conclude with a lovely outdoor *Havdallah* service as we bid farewell to Shabbat.

Return to learning: I have heard from some members who wish to learn Hebrew and perhaps continue on for an Adult Bar/Bat Mitzvah. I would be more than happy to begin a class. Please contact me

at rabbi@templebethsholom.org if you are interested so that we can set a weekly day and time. If that is too intense for you, I am once again planning to hold the "Chai Mitzvah" adult learning classes beginning monthly in October. Finally, sit and schmooze about Judaism, Torah, or current events each month at a different local coffee shop with "Coffee, Tea & Torah," a monthly "coffee klatch" discussion program. The learning begins in October!

I leave you with these words: "Rabbi Levi said, 'Great is *teshuvah*, for it enables a person to reach the throne of God,' as it says, 'Return, O Israel, to Adonai your God.' (Hosea 14:2)" [B.T. Yoma: 86a]

No matter how far away you are, it is always possible to return. All it takes is the first step. Walter and I wish all of you a sweet and healthy New Year!

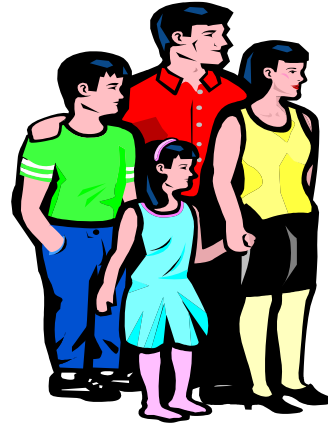

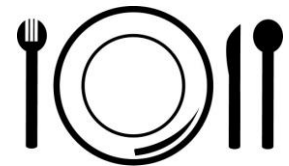

I hope everyone had a good summer. For some, this summer has been challenging or painful. For others, it has been relaxing, but for the most part, it has been a comfortable summer, - not too hot and not too humid.

I hear that this is to be an El Nino year, which means a mild winter in the Northeast. We can sure use it after last year!

The High Holy Days begin with Selichot on September 5th (the Saturday evening of Labor Day Weekend). We will be having a delicious pasta and salad dinner at 6:00, followed by a moving Selichot Service during which we change the mantles of our Torahs from their yearly covers to white covers. White signifies our longing to be pure; to be free of sin. The word for sin in Hebrew is *kheit*. It is the same word that is used for missing the bullseye in archery. When we "sin" we are missing the mark. It is not that we are willfully walking away from G-d's commandments, it is a failure to attain what we seek - this time. We resolve to do better in the coming year. Rosh HaShanah begins on Sunday evening, September 13th, and Yom Kippur begins on Tuesday evening, September 22nd. We will not only have our wonderful cellist, Maxine Neuman and Gail Tishcoff, our resident flautist on Kol Nidrei, but Charles Sachs will be accompanying on piano both on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

We are all looking forward to our freilich family services, beginning after Simchat Torah on October 9th, where we join together for a Shabbat service including the sweet voices of our children and the wonderful strains of music with The Waffles. We are exploring starting a choir again this year, which would rehearse on Friday evenings.
