With that in mind, I ask you all to join us for a wonderful "Return to Temple" Pasta dinner on September 5, which will be followed by our *Selichot* services formally ushering in the High Holy Day period.

Return to TBS as we have an exciting year planned: Join us for a Shabbat afternoon picnic on September 19; we will conclude with a lovely outdoor *Havdallah* service as we bid farewell to Shabbat.

Return to learning: I have heard from some members who wish to learn Hebrew and perhaps continue on for an Adult Bar/Bat Mitzvah. I would be more than happy to begin a class. Please contact me



I hope everyone had a good summer. For some, this summer has been challenging or painful. For others, it has been relaxing, but for the most part, it has been a comfortable summer ,- not too hot and not too humid.

I hear that this is to be an El Nino year, which means a mild winter in the Northeast. We can sure use it after last year!

The High Holy Days begin with Selichot on September 5th (the Saturday evening of Labor Day Weekend). We will be having a delicious pasta and salad dinner at 6:00, followed by a moving Selichot Service during which we change the mantles of our Torahs from their yearly covers to white covers. White signifies our longing to be pure; to be free of sin. The word for sin in Hebrew is kheit. It is the same word that is used for missing the bullseye in archery. When we "sin" we are missing the mark. It is not that we are willfully walking away from G-d's commandments, it is a failure to attain what we seek this time. 
