We are well into the festival of Sukkoth, my favorite holiday. I hope you had a good time with us at our Pizza in the Hut dinner in our brand new Sukkah, lovingly decorated by our Religious School students!

Sukkoth reminds us of the time of wandering in the desert under God's protection and shelter, as the Children of Israel camped out in temporary dwellings. As with many of our holidays, Sukkoth is dual in nature—both historic and agricultural. Most likely Sukkoth originated as an agricultural holiday. In fact, in ancient times it was the most important holiday, so important that it was called heChag "The" Holiday. The ancients celebrated the bounty of the autumn harvest and prayed for rain on Hoshannah Rabbah (the last day of the festival) to fall during the winter to insure future harvests.

In a way, Sukkoth is a holiday of contrasts—we thank God for our abundance of food and we rejoice, but at the same time we are commanded to dwell in very temporary, makeshift huts. All at once the fragile nature of our dwelling places reminds us of how tenuous our lives really are. We are thankful for the abundant harvest, for what we have, but at

the same time we are fearful of what the future will bring. The ancients worried about surviving the ensuing winter. Would nature, which was totally out of their control, be kind to them? So too, it is a physical reminder to us that there are many who do not have the security of a warm home and enough food to eat.

I encourage everyone during the holiday of Sukkoth to perform an important mitzvah — to use the opportunity to continue to donate to our Temple Beth Sholom food bank. You all received a grocery bag during the High Holy Days. If you haven't already filled your bag and returned it to Temple, please bring your bags back with unopened, unexpired non-perishable food items and place them in the marked container that is outside the sanctuary. If you already donated, we can always use more food!

As Sukkoth draws to a close, we have yet another celebration—Simchat Torah. We rejoice in the Torah and celebrate the end of our Torah reading cycle and the beginning of a new one. Come down to the synagogue and join us on Sunday, October 4 at 6 pm for a potluck dinner and stay for the celebration! We will march with the Torahs, sing, dance and unroll an entire Torah, so we can read from Bereishit (the first book of the Torah) and Devarim (the last book) at the same time, and we will inaugurate our children into the world of Torah learning as we invite our newest Hebrew and Religious school

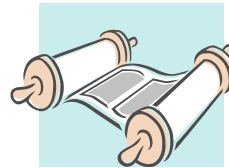

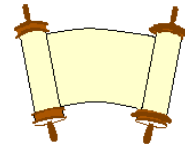

High Holy Days are almost over! We have one more wonderful celebration: Simchat Torah. After a short service, we unwrap the entire Torah in the Ballroom, and read from each of the five books, as Rabbi Ballan and I point out several parts of the scroll for all to see. We march around and sing and wave flags and special treats are given to our children. The next morning, Rabbi Ballan and I will read from the end of Deuteronomy to the first 7 days of the world. We go straight from D'varim, Deuteronomy, which ends with the letter lamed, to B'reishit, Genesis, which begins with the letter bet. Lamed Bet also spells lev, heart, and the Torah is the heart of the Jewish people. Simchat Torah is Sunday evening, October 4th. There will be special session of Religious school at 4 instead of 10, preceded by a Junior Choir rehearsal at 3, during which we will practice for the upcoming Family Service on October 9th.

You do not need to know the prayers yet to be in Junior Choir. You just need to love to sing. Rehearsals are held right after Religious school on Sundays when I am there twice a month to do music. Please check the flyers out front in the lobby (or your child's backpack). The full schedule will be there, and it's never too late to join.

The high point of my summer was the Cantors' convention in Florida this year. We had four days of music, the new Reform machzor, concerts and workshops. Of course we prayed each morning and night. You haven't lived until you have sat in a room with 150 or more cantors and musicians all davening with ruach (spirit), and all making beautiful music with harmonies, accompanied by pianists, drummers, guitarists, clarinetists, flautists - what have you. Cantors delivered the sermons of course, and we have quite a few talented writers among us. Torah is read on Monday and Thursday mornings. That week's portion happened to be Balak, the Torah portion with the talking donkey. One of our Torah chanters this year, Cantor Leigh Korn, actually brayed the donkey's words in trope! I will never forget it!

Another high point every 2 years is the Reform Movement Biennial. 5,000 gung-ho Reform Jews gather (this year in Orlando) to learn, discuss, pray, listen, shop, and of course, eat. There are workshops about growing your congregations, financial planning, ritual, social action, workshops just for temple presidents, and lots and lots of music! The president of the URJ, Rabbi Rick Jacobs, has opened up the Biennial to all Reform Jews, *(continued on page 8)*

The participation of so many people in our activities has made the New Year even sweeter! May we continue to celebrate together for years to come!

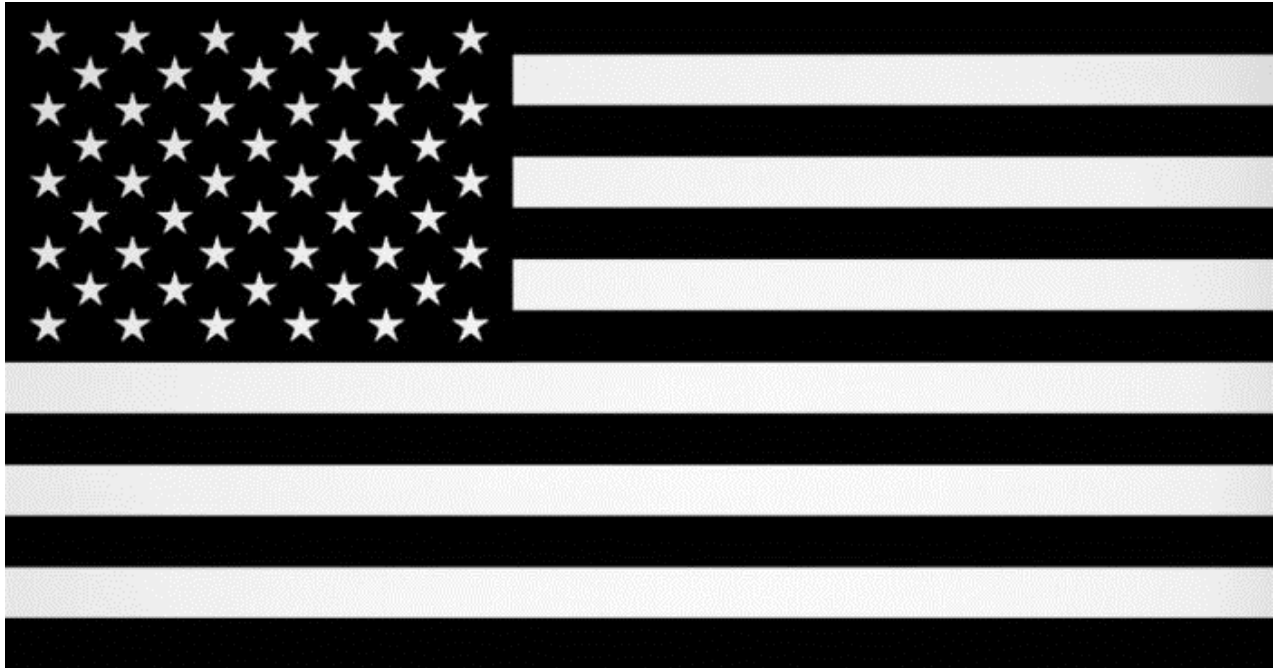

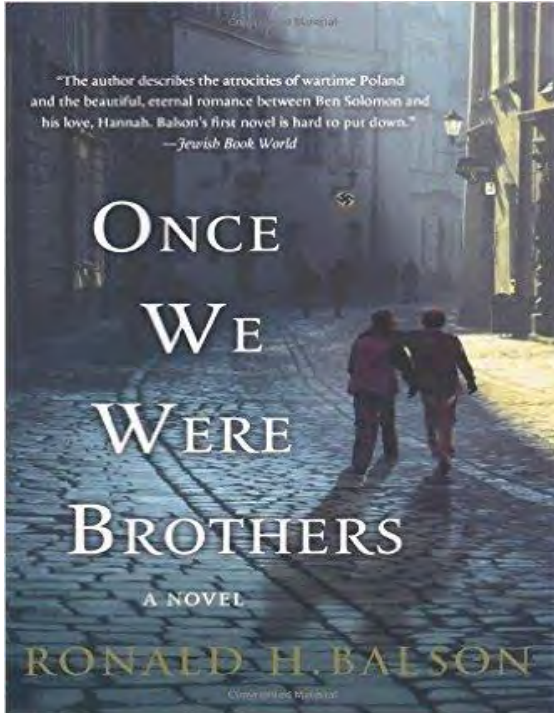
