From the Rabbi's desk:

In just a few days, Chanukah will be upon us. This year, it actually coincides with Bazaar, as we light the first candle on Sunday night, December 6. It is hard to believe that we went almost eight weeks without a major Jewish holiday to celebrate. Sometimes we focus so much on the next holiday or event that we forget to see the blessings in our every-day routines of life, and we often take them for granted. I, for one, am trying to remember to be grateful for the little things—the beautiful fall colors; being able to take a brisk walk on a cold winter morning; watching the sun set over the horizon. The days are much shorter now, and it is easy to focus on all the darkness that surrounds us at this time of year. Thankfully, have our chanukiyot we (Chanukah menorahs) brighten our evenings.

As Rabbi Michael Strassfeld writes in his book, The Jewish Holidays, "By lighting the menorah, we ignite the flame in our souls, the sparks that cannot be extinguished, that will burn not for eight days but for eternity. We place the menorah in our windows to be visible to those passing by, just as our inner light must shine against the darkness of evil and indifference and must kindle the spirits of our fellow humans. The menorah reminds us of the miracle that no matter how dark life may be, there remains a source of light deep inside us. The light in our souls reflects and refracts the light from the One who is all brightness."

Another way to spread light and warmth during these cold, dark days is to help repair the world - tikkun olam. You can help do this by participating in our religious school's holiday gift drive. We encouraging all of our students to donate a Chanukah/holiday gift to a child in need. On the sixth night of Chanukah, December 11, bring these unwrapped gifts to synagogue during our family Shabbat Service at 7:30 pm. Please also donate to our on-going food drive.

Finally, the last Friday of the month falls on December 25. Since many people will be away and we would like to give our very hardworking staff (Jose & Santos) the day off and close the building, I will be having a Shabbat evening "Open House" dinner and z'mirot (lots of songs!). Come by at 5:00 pm for a short kabbalat Shabbat service followed by a light dinner and freylach singing. Notes From Cantor Kathy Barr

Shalom!

Chanukah, Chanukah, chag yafeh kol kach... ask any child what their favorite holiday is, and they will invariably say, Chanukah. In fact, if one asks them what is the most important holiday of the year they will also answer Chanukah. (It's Shabbat.) Chanukah is actually a minor holiday. In this country, it has become a bigger deal, because of the need to contrast with Christmas, which many of our children celebrate too, either with a non-Jewish parent or relatives. Instead of just gelt, some children get eight days of presents, chocolate gelt, and dreidle candy. It's traditional to eat foods cooked with oil, to represent the midrash of the oil for lighting in the Temple. Ashkenazim eat potato latkes, and Sephardim eat sufganiyot (jelly doughnuts). Thank goodness for modern food processors and Dunkin' Donuts!

The most important thing to do, is to light the Chanukiah, the Chanukah candelabra. A menorah is actually the seven candled one. The eight candled one (with the shamash) is called a chanukiah. We will be lighting our favorite chanukiot on December 11, for our grand Chanukah light-in. It will be the 6th night of Chanukah, so if you remember, bring 7 candles. We put the newest candle on the left (we fill them right to left, and then we light them left to right (i.e. starting with the newest candle.) This goes back to an argument between the House of Shammai, and the House of Hillel. Shammai said we should start the holiday with eight lights and end with one. Hillel said we should start with one and end with eight. We follow Hillel's example, but in deference to Shammai, we light them the other way. December 11th is also our Family Service and the Junior Choir has some special Chanukah songs for you. See you there!

Exciting new things are going on in TBS Religious School this month. We have a beautiful group of new families participating in Jewish Start! Our newly combined grade 2-3 class is busy learning Hebrew with an exciting new resource. We have purchased a primer with an online Hebrew learning component. This enables students to both hear and see exercises and games, as well as providing their parents with a tool to learn with their children.

The Rabbi, the Committee, and I are working on a new Religious School Handbook and Curriculum Guide, which will be available at the beginning of January. It will be a valuable resource for all of you to keep current with programs, policies, and academics for students in all grades.

Our Academy students have been participating in several projects to help our Temple, including helping to set up for Rummage. They have also shared in adult ed. programs. They are especially interested in the study of *mussar*, positive personal character attributes, using video produced by Hillel and other sources.

Our classes are excited to have performed at Pancake Breakfast and are eagerly anticipating Chanukarama, which will include arts and crafts, games, music, video, menorah lighting, special treats and more!

Please don't forget our annual holiday toy drive, culminating at Family Shabbat Service this month.

As we prepare to kindle the lights of Chanukah, celebrating the defeat of the Syrian Greek forces who tried to force us to give up our Judaism, let us remember those who are struggling against the evil forces in today's world that oppress through terror and violence in Israel, in Paris, throughout the world... wherever they arise. Let us be modern Maccabees striving for justice, peace, and freedom in our time.




