From the Rabbi's desk

In the spring, summer and early fall, I enjoy sitting outside on my back porch to sip coffee, have my morning meal and listen to the birds. The flowers and trees are usually in bloom and fragrant. Much to my surprise, I was able to sit outside this past December! The weather has been very temperate as of yet and although I loved taking advantage of it, my flowers are a little confused. Daisies have come up in my flowerbeds, my rose bush is still blooming and there are little vellow flowers on my forsythias. I'm not sure what this all signifies, but I for one am glad that 195 nations of the world ratified the climate accord in Paris. It may not solve the world's problems, but it is a start. There is still much to do, however.

We have just ushered in the New Year 2016. On the Jewish calendar, it is still 5776, and the month will turn from *Tevet* to *Sh'vat*. We will celebrate a New Year, as well—the New Year for trees on *Tu Bishvat*, the 15th of *Sh'vat*, which falls this year on January 25.

Although *Tu Bishvat* originally was meant to determine when we could use the fruit of trees planted in Israel and for tithing first fruits when the Temple stood, the holiday has been transformed time and again. Today, we celebrate *Tu Bishvat* as a kind of "Jewish Earth Day." It is a time for honoring the cycles and recycling of nature. It is a time to learn about the concept of "*bal tashchit*" — not to destroy or waste — and how we can affect some change in our environment for good.

There are a number of ways you can work to repair the world and our environment. COEJL, the Coalition on the Environment and Jewish Life has some recommendations:

- **Reuse.** Use reusable items rather than disposables. Bring water bottles, shopping bags, mugs, utensils, plates, etc., to work and when traveling.
- Energy. Conserve electricity by unplugging as many surge protectors and appliances as you can while not at home, turn off lights in the work place and at home when not in use, and turn off computers and monitors when not in use. To save even more money, buy CFL eco light bulbs and other energy-saving appliances for your home and office.
- **Travel.** When traveling or commuting, opt to walk, ride your bike, carpool or take public transportation.
- **Paper.** Go paperless when you can. Pay bills online, request paperless payments from work, try not to print unnecessarily, and send e-invites rather than paper invitations.
- Water. Turn off the water when washing dishes and brushing your teeth. When running the laundry and the dishwasher, wait until you have a full load in order to use less water per dish/article of clothing.

May this year be one of renewal, growth, and healing. Walter and I wish you a very happy and healthy secular New Year!

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, December 14, 2015. His group currently rents a room in the upstairs area of TBS and had regularly provided counseling services in the building. He has been asked to cease all individual counseling as of the end of December. The Board passed the November Financial Report as presented by Charlene Metz. Financial Secretary Joyce Moss reported our current number of membership units currently remains at 139. Reports were made by Arms of the Temple and all Committees. The Board voted to enter into negotiations with Cantor Kathy Barr for a one year contract with no changes to salary or benefits.






