

*From the  
Rabbi's desk*

On the secular calendar this month, we have a special event. It is a leap year. We add one more day to February every 4 years, because as you know, there are 365 1/4 days in a year (365 days 5 hours 48 minutes 46 seconds to be exact!). This year, two leap years are coinciding. On the Jewish calendar, it is also a leap year. Seven times within a 19 year cycle we add an entire month to the calendar, which works out to every two to three years or so. The Jewish months are directly related to the cycle of moon's orbit around the earth. Each month (think "moonth") in the Jewish calendar begins on a new moon. The moon takes 29.5 days to orbit the earth and we have twelve months in the year. Those of you who are good at math will know right away that this means that we have only 354 days in a regular Jewish year. If we didn't account for the difference, we would lose 11 days a year. Before long, we would be celebrating Passover in December and Chanukah in the summer! We learn in the Torah (Ex. 23:15) "You shall observe the Feast of Unleavened Bread...at the set time in the month of Abib" (literally "Spring"). This means that we cannot go by the moon cycle alone and we add an extra month after the last month in the Jewish calendar, Adar. When we have a leap year, the month is Adar II, so this year we have both

Adar I and Adar II. Adar I begins on February 10.

We celebrate Purim on the 14th of Adar. But what do we do when there is a leap month? We celebrate Purim in Adar II, because according to Talmudic tradition, the story of Purim actually took place in Adar II. The rabbis also wanted to keep the time period between Purim and Passover the same thereby linking the redemption of Esther with the redemption of the children of Israel at the Sea of Reeds (Meg. 6b).

So do we acknowledge the 14th of Adar I? Yes. It is called "Purim Katan" or little Purim. Although we do not have two Purim celebrations a month apart, in traditional circles prayers of supplication (tachanun) are not read and fasting and eulogies are prohibited on Purim Katan as they are on Purim.

What happens if you are observing a yahrzeit in Adar? The exact opposite of Purim— the yahrzeit is observed in Adar I if the original date occurred in a non-leap year. If it occurred in in a leap year, you simply observe it on its actual date (either Adar I or Adar II). Some hold that you can even observe the yahrzeit twice if the original didn't fall in a leap year, with a lesser observance on the same day during the second Adar (Adar II).

There is a Talmudic saying, "From the beginning of Adar, we increase our happiness." (B. Taanit 29a) This is in anticipation of Purim. This year we have an extra month to increase our happiness, and also an extra month to get ready to celebrate and party. Once again we will have a Gala Purim Ball on March 19 as well as a Purim Shpiel on Wednesday evening, March 13. Start thinking about your costumes; I surely will be thinking about mine!




