From the Rabbi's desk

As I write this article, it is Rosh Hodesh Adar I. Rosh Hodesh is the celebration of each new month on the Jewish calendar. In Temple times, special sacrifices were performed. Unlike Shabbat, one is permitted to do work. A *midrash* is told that because the Israelite women did not hand over their gold jewelry to build the Golden Calf in the desert, women were rewarded with the holiday of Rosh Hodesh where they are given a day off times some women have reclaimed the Rosh Hodesh holiday by forming Rosh Hodesh groups in which they celebrate together through prayer, ritual, study, or discussion of relevant topics. In Israel, a group of women who call themselves "The Women Of the Wall" gather each Rosh Hodesh at the Kotel, the Western Wall, to pray and read from the Torah scroll aloud. Often they are harassed and even arrested, because in the Ultra-Orthodox tradition, women are not allowed to do this. Since 1988, the group has worked tirelessly for full equality and access to religious freedom at the Western Wall-freedom to pray in peace, as a group, out loud, with *tallit*, tefilin (phylacteries), and Torah. Finally, this past February, the Israeli government passed the Mendelblit Plan-to create a third, pluralist prayer section at

the Western Wall. This pluralist area will be located at the southern section of the wall. It will take time to open up this space, but I am excited that there finally is agreement.

It seems odd that something that we take for granted here in the United States, to pray freely as one chooses, is not an option at our holiest site. Women are not as prominent in the Bible as men, and many are never mentioned by name. Yet an entire book is named after a woman, the Book of Esther. It reminds me that it is important to stand up for what is right even though your own life may be at risk, as Esther boldly approached King Ahashverosh and stood up for her people.

Rabbi Bea Wyler, however, teaches and did not work. In modern that the "Book of Esther tells of the complete liberation of the Jews – and the incomplete liberation of women. This is perhaps most evident in chapter 9 in which Esther silently vies for power with Mordecai through dueling letters sent to the populace, proclaiming the ways in which to mark the holiday. At first, Esther seems to have the upper hand. "And the pronouncement of Esther established this tradition of Purim, and so it was written in the book." (9:32). With that, the story appears to end. Only just as we are about to close the book do we see another three verses, which speak of the authority of Ahashverosh and Mordecai and not say a word about Esther. "For Mordecai the Jew ranked next to the king and he was highly regarded by the Jews...He sought the good of his people and interceded for the welfare of all his kindred." (10:3). Rabbi Wyler suggests that we dedicate the Fast of Esther, which occurs the day before Purim, to this incomplete liberation of women."

February Board of Trustees Meeting


The New Board of Trustees had its first meeting of the Fiscal Year on Monday, February 8, 2016. Outgoing Financial Secretary Joyce Moss reported that our current number of membership units are now 137. The Board passed the January Financial report as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz. Rabbi Ballan reported that the gift of the Confirmation Class of 1965, a Magillah housed in a beautiful silver cover, has sustained damage over the years and will need repair. Our Torahs also require care to preserve them. Sisterhood President Barbara Gandelman reported Sisterhood is donating \$3,000.00 to Temple. A request has been made to establish a committee of members who are willing to make Shiva calls when needed, and Jody Harkavy volunteered to help organize this much needed service. Anyone willing to volunteer should contact Rabbi Ballan. Jim Kettig, Chair of the House Committee, reported on the recent roof work, and that the big snow storm resulted in serious leaks despite this work. The Board voted to authorize funds necessary for roofing repairs. The Board approved motion to continue negotiations with Cantor Kathy Barr.

Rabbi Ziona Zelaso will be our guest speaker

Rabbi Ziona is the daughter of Holocaust survivors, and was born and raised in Haifa, Israel. She served in The Israeli Defense Force as an Electronic Intelligence Sergeant during the War of Attrition, and studied Biblical archaeology and ancient languages in Tel Aviv University under Professors David Ussishkin, Nadav Na'aman and Anson Rainy (just to name a few). Rabbi Ziona completed her academic education in Cultural Anthropology at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and taught as an adjunct professor of cultural anthropology at Montclair State University, Jersey. Her research focused on the New acculturation process of five Ethiopian families who immigrated to Israel with Operation Moses. As an anthropologist, she loves to travel and saw many corners of the big world. She participated in expeditions to Egypt, Jordan, Eastern Turkey, Kenya and Tanzania. She also traveled to the Far East --Japan, China, Malaysia, Singapore, India, and Korea.

All lectures begin with breakfast at 9:30 am and discussion at 10:00 am. There is a \$3 charge for bagels.

Shalom!

March is Purim, Purim, Purim! (OK, it starts out with a celebration of Shabbat Across America on March 4th. See about that elsewhere in this issue, but then it's all Purim.) The children are busy preparing for a special treat; our Purim Spiel will be based upon The Lion King this year. I will tell you more later in this article, but first, March 18th is Shabbat Zachor. It is not uncommon to start celebrating Purim early at this service. Some people even come in costume! We will be having our fun and entertaining Purim Ball on March 19th. If it's anything like last year's (and it will be) it will be a real gas! We have a professional DJ, who plays a lot of 60's music and we dance and dance and dance. There is sumptuous food and drink, and you can come stag or drag. Then, the next day, after Religious School, from noon to 3:30, the children (from outside the temple too) are invited to a Purim dance in the Frank S, Greene room. There will also be a DJ and food, so come one and come all. Purim itself begins at sundown, Wednesday, March 23rd. As I said before, the shpiel this year is based upon The Lion King, only it's the Lion Queen --Hadassah-Nala, also known as Esther. She has a cousin named Simcha. Her uncle Mordechai is Rafiki-El, the king is Mustaferosh, the villain is Scarface Haman, and the other players include, of course, the hyenas, and Pumbah and Timon. The spiel will be narrated by Zazu I and her sister, Zazu II. The service starts at 5:30 pm, during which the Junior Choir (with our new name, Shir Chadash, will be singing some very interesting melodies to some of our prayers! Of course, we will read from our newly restored Megillah, and there will be hamentaschen for all. (I will even bring some gluten-free ones!) It is a mitzvah to hear the Megillah read. The Megillah is chanted using Esther trope, which sounds very different from Torah trope. It is ten chapters long, but I usually just chant part of it from Chapter 5, which contains the most hamans.

By the way, I am collecting hamantaschen recipes as usual this year. I have yet to find the one I made in kindergarten. Maybe it was because I made it, but it was delicious!

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
