From the Rabbi's desk

We learn in *Pirkei Avot, The Ethics of our Fathers,* [1:2] "The world stands on three things—Torah, service to God, and deeds of loving-kindness."

This month we have a wonderful opportunity to be active participants in ensuring that the first of these three pillars, the Torah – our TBS sifrei Torah (Torah scrolls)—will be will be around for many years come. We have Sofer commissioned Neil Yerman who is a scribe to restore two of our sacred Torah scrolls. But taking care of our sifrei Torah is not the job of a professional scribe alone. We as a community need to take ownership and care for them as well. On Wednesday, May 25 our entire TBS community can learn how to care for and restore our Torahs as Sofer Yerman will be leading a special educational and instruction program. From 5-6 pm he will hold an interactive program for our Hebrew and Religious school students (parents are invited). From 6-6:30 pm the entire congregation is invited for a light dinner (pizza and salad), and at 6:30 pm Sofer

Yerman will hold a similar program for the general congregation. I hope you join us for this very important event.

TBS also affords us the opportunity to perform acts of loving-kindness. This May 1 is Mitzvah Day; we come together to donate blood, raise funds for Temple and of course to help feed the hungry and care for the poor.

Last (but not least) each week we also come together in service to God—this month we will be commemorating *Yom HaShoah* (Holocaust Remembrance Day) on May 6, *Yom Ha-Atzma-ut* (Israeli Independence Day) on May 13, and celebrating with Sisterhood and Men's Club on May 20. I hope to see many of you this month—as we take part in upholding our world together.

April Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday April 11, 2016. Financial Secretary Gail Olenick reported we now have 134 Membership Units, having had 2 resignations this past month. Robin Myers reported on the March Financial report for Treasurer Charlene Metz, which was passed by the Board. The Pulpit and Ritual Committee reported on the repairs being done to two of our Torahs and the Magillah Scroll which was repaired and returned in time for Purim. The Pulpit committee will be honoring Lee Temares at the Shabbat Service on Friday, April 15th. Cantor Kathy Barr reported that she was able to get a donation of a number of gendersensitive High Holiday Prayer Books for the Temple, for use by the Congregation. The House Committee reported they met and made a comprehensive list of all building needs, with the top three priorities being: the roof repairs, the cooling tower, and the need to replace the dishwasher. These three building needs will cost approximately \$45,000.00 which is more than we have budgeted. Barry Packer reported on the progress toward the Chicken Soup Cook-Off scheduled for October 2016 - and volunteers are welcome to work with him on it.



Thanks to the PA for the treat, and to Mrs Belsky for transporting all of us. We tasted and share some amazing food, and experienced wonderful hospitality. Rabbi Ballan, Mrs. Belsky, and I also enjoyed real quality time with Jesse, Leora, Ben C., and Ben B.

As we return to school following our Passover break, we will jump right into Mitzvah Day. You can help us by supporting students who walk in our walkathon, and by contributing non-perishable food items to our Food Drive, and household cleaning supplies, toiletries, feminine hygiene products, and paper towels, toilet tissue, and tissues that we will donate to the River Fund. These items will then be distributed to needy individuals and families. We have selected these items for collection because none of them are covered by Food Stamps. Our L'Ag B'Omer picnic will take place, as usual, on May 15, in Cunningham Park. It's a great chance to enjoy fun with friends and fresh air!

We have added a special event for May 22: our first community field trip to Ellis Island. We will travel to Battery Park by Long Island Railroad and subway, and ferry to the Island for a tour. 
