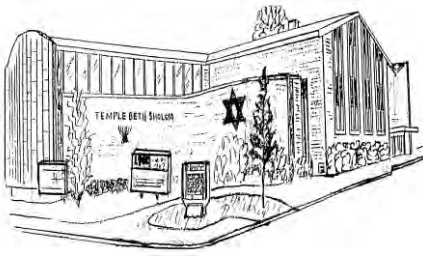

*From the
Rabbi's desk*

As June arrives, many of us are already planning for the summer, and vacations! I for one am looking forward to a little respite from all the hubbub of the boxes and chaos of moving. But an exciting month is in store for us in June! We begin with the Celebrate Israel Parade on June 5. A bus will pick us up and for the first time TBS members will march in the parade together. The following week we will celebrate Shavuot, *zman mattan Torateinu*, the time of the giving of our Torah at Sinai. This will, I hope be even more meaningful this year as all of us can be active participants in the restoration of our *sifrei Torah* (Torah scrolls). After all, the Torah is our most precious and sacred possession.

There is a midrash from Exodus Rabbah (29:9) that says, "When God gave us the Torah, no bird twittered, no fowl flew, no ox lowed the *ophanim* did not flutter a wing, the seraphim did not say, 'Holy, Holy, Holy,' the sea did not roar, no creature made a sound, the whole earth was hushed into breathless silence. The voice went forth, 'I am *Adonai*, your God.' When God spoke on Mount Sinai, the

whole world became silent so that all the creatures might know that there is none beside God." That must have been an awesome moment. During Passover, we are required to act as if we personally went forth from Egypt. So too, on Shavuot we need to feel as if we personally received the Torah at Mount Sinai.

I hope you will join us Friday evening, June 10th to spiritually experience the receiving of Torah when Matthew Fertig, Max Kaufman and Morgan Schnitzer lead us in prayer, accept the Torah and become Temple Beth Sholom's 5776 confirmands. Mazal Tov to them and their families!

As we look forward to graduations, summer vacations, and taking it a little easier in the hot months to come, know that at Temple Beth Sholom we are busily preparing for next year. If you get a call asking to participate in our High Holy Day services – please say yes! Our congregation needs you in more ways than one. Make sure to join us for our lay-led summer services or even volunteer to lead.

Finally, join us for Shabbat in the Park on June 24 at 6:30 pm at Bowne Park. Bring a picnic dinner. Details are in the Voice. May you go from strength to strength, and may you be blessed with peace.

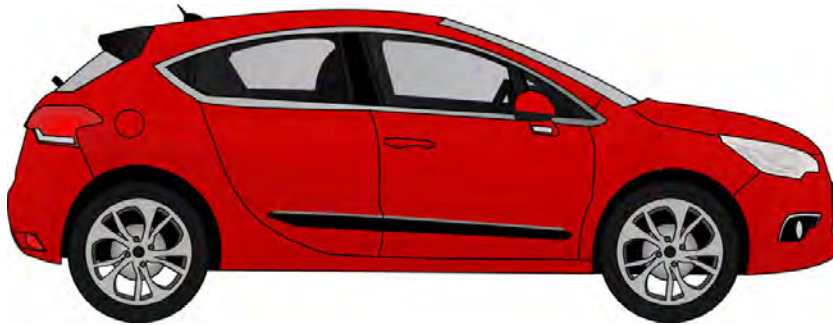
