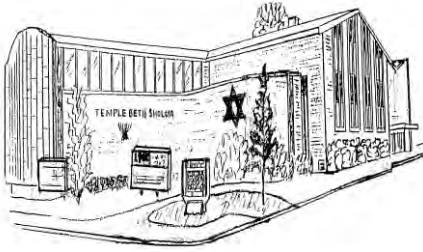

Shalom,

I hope you are all enjoying your summer. As I write this I am reflecting on recent events – a wonderful Confirmation service led by Matthew Fertig, Max Kaufman and Morgan Schnitzer. It was a pleasure to work with and learn with our students this year and I am so proud of them. Shavuot, the holiday upon which the Confirmation service is founded is about our receiving the Torah. Each year we re-enact this event and we are encouraged to re-commit ourselves to “Torah.” What does this mean? For some, it can be taking on a new mitzvah or ritual; for others it can be making a commitment to Jewish learning. We have many opportunities to do this at TBS. You can help restore our Torahs and ensure that our sacred Torah scrolls are kept “alive” here at Temple. Currently, we restored one of our scrolls and another is now out for repair. Many of our Religious School students actually helped clean this Torah and learned about what it takes to make a Torah with our scribe, Sofer Neil

Yerman. We hope to hold another special program for everyone in the fall to welcome back our second repaired Torah scroll. Look for flyers and e-mails about it this summer.

We also have many opportunities to learn at TBS. This fall we are offering once again the Chai Mitzvah program. Past participants deepened their Jewish engagement, learned about our Jewish heritage, engaged in Jewish social action, and picked up a new ritual or two. June Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday June 13, 2016. Financial Secretary Gail Olenick reported we now have 132 Membership Units this month. The Board passed the May Financial Report presented by Trustee Robin Myers for Treasurer Charlene Metz. The Pulpit and Ritual Committee reported that the Yahrzeit list will be updated. Summer Service Leaders have been selected. The committee is re-evaluating having two 7:30 PM Services per month, as only one is well attended. Rabbi Ballan reported we are scheduling the repair of the 2nd Torah and hopefully have a celebration up on its return on Simchat Torah. On July 22nd, the Summer Service will be led by Betty Zimmermann and will be recorded. Cantor Barr reported next year's Cantor's Cabaret will be scheduled on April 22nd. Financial arrangements for High Holiday musical accompaniment will be discussed at the Pulpit meeting. The Religious School presented a \$500.00 check to Temple. This year's Sisterhood Rummage Sale raised \$1,600.00; Sisterhood presented a check for \$3,000.00 to Temple. Parent Association Co-President Lauren Lazarus presented Temple with a \$550.00 check from PA, and she announced she will step down and Alana White will take her place as Co-President. The House Committee was authorized to get quotes to replace the dishwasher.

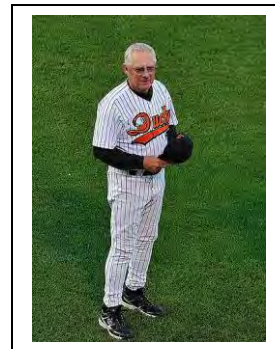

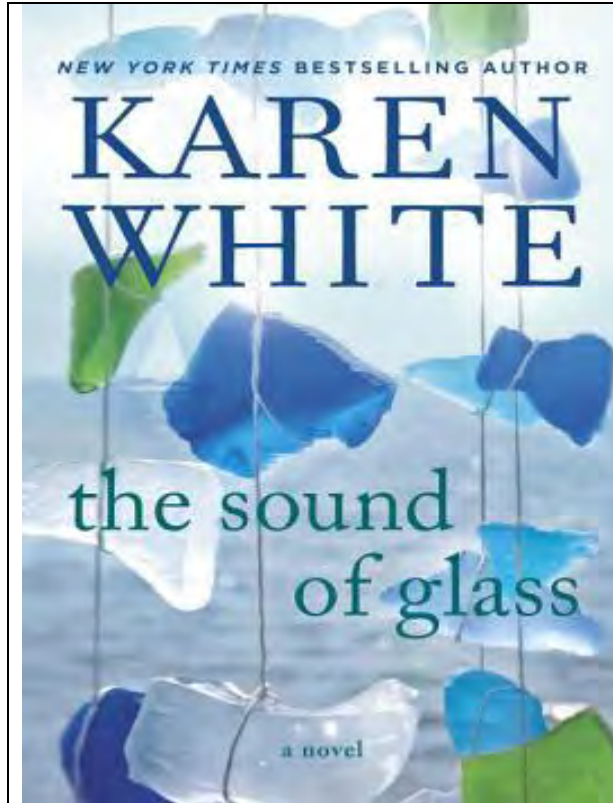
