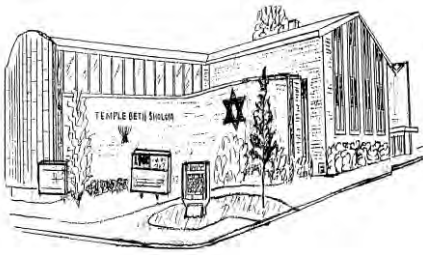

From the  
Rabbi's desk

For the first time in a long while, all of the High Holy Days as well as the *chagim* (Sukkot and Simchat Torah) fall in October! That means October is a busy month. You may well receive *The Voice* on the eve of Rosh Hashanah. The weather should be cooler; we will see a definite turn in the leaves—from green to yellow, orange and red. Soon the trees will be bare. The change is palpable, and a reminder that we too must change.

Rabbi Michael Strassfeld offers a wonderful Kavanah for the New Year:

"...Rosh ha-Shanah is a call to change, a crying out for hope even in the bleakest landscapes. In response, the people of Israel stir in their sleep, aroused by dreams carried by the music and memories of this season. But then they turn over, pulling the blankets of the familiar more tightly around themselves, hoping to once again fall back asleep. We blow the shofar, that eerie and ancient sound that called our ancestors to battle and to prayer. We blow it over and over again to stir our souls, or in the words of Maimonides about the shofar call: 'Sleepers, awake from your sleep. Slumberers, rouse yourselves from your slumber. Search your deeds and return to and remember your Creator.'

"God still calls to us humans as in the garden: Ayeka?, 'Where are you?'

"The only unknown is which of us will respond: Hineni!, 'Here am

I!"

Hineni! I am here, and ready. I hope you will be, too. Many exciting celebrations and programs are ahead of us. Please join us for Sukkot and Pizza in the Hut, **Sunday, October 16**. Come decorate the Sukkah at 4 pm. Stay for the outdoor Sukkot service and dinner.

Take notice of our newly repaired *Sefer Torah* during our High Holy Day services. Then join us in celebration as we dedicate and put the finishing touches on this Torah with Sofer Neil Yerman on **October 23 at 4 pm**. Sofer Yerman will teach us all about how a Torah is made. A celebratory dairy dinner will be served following the program. Then the Simchat Torah festivities begin with our new Torah! The Torah is our most precious ritual object. I hope you all will join us—to participate, celebrate and "be" Torah!

There are other ways to "be" Torah, and that is to study. I am once again offering the wonderful Chai Mitzvah program of guided and self-directed learning. We meet monthly; check your e-mails for dates. I would also like to offer another beginning Hebrew class. Please e-mail me if you are interested

(rabbi@templebethsholom.org). Times and dates will be determined according to the group's schedules. November should see the return of "Coffee, Tea & Torah!" Watch this space...

The High Holidays are approaching fast. Erev Rosh Hashanah is Sunday night, October 2nd. During the month of Elul preceding, we are reminded by the sound of the Shofar in the mornings. This is meant as a wakeup call. We should be entering a period of introspection. Did we do righteous things in the last year? Have we hurt anyone, accidentally or on purpose? Did we make promises that we couldn't keep? Our holy days begin on Sunday night, but we are told we have ten days to do something about it. For sins against our fellow humans, we must seek them out, apologize, promise to never do it again, and make restitution if possible. For sins against God, we fast and pray on Yom Kippur (October 11-12) and hope that our sincere prayers are accepted.

We figuratively shed our skins, to reveal a new, pure soul, as white as snow. We cover our Torah scrolls in white to reflect this. Rabbi and Cantor wear white robes. Our challahs are round, to reflect the fact that everything is circular - time is continuous, and the years go 'round and 'round.

On the first day of Rosh Hashanah, we go to a body of water, and symbolically throw our sins away. This is done by throwing bread or crumbs into the water. The word for this is Tashlich, from the word in Hebrew 'shalach', to send. We have a lovely ceremony at TBS, at Bowne Park.

On Sukkot, which follows Yom Kippur four days later, we will be gathering for a service and a pizza dinner, and everyone will get a chance to shake the lulav. The next week, our sofer, Neil Yerman, will be here at 4:00 pm. We will put the finishing touches on our newly restored Torah scroll, followed by a pot-luck dinner and a wonderful service during which we will unwrap one of the newly restored Torah scrolls around the Sanctuary, and we can all hold it and we will be reading from each book. I leave you with an haiku:

May you be inscribed  
for the best new year ever  
L'Shanah Tovah

## **Religious School News**

I'm so excited! Our first week of school was a rousing success at TBS! The building filled quickly with familiar faces...although they came on taller and bigger bodies. Veteran teachers and students greeted each other enthusiastically and our newest addition, Zilpa Nasirov, returned to TBS after several years' absence and some time as our go-to sub.

Our year began with a morning service in the FSG room attended by parents and students together. Rabbi Ballan and Cantor Barr set the tone for our year with a meaningful prayer experience and the sounding of the shofar. These services will be a regular element of our Sunday program, in rotation with music with Cantor Barr and scheduled visits to the library.

In response to requests from parents of students in various grades, and in an attempt to provide the best opportunities for our learners to improve their skills, we have joined the Behrman House Online Learning Center. This enables students in grades 2-6 to review their Hebrew lessons with an online component that includes games and exercises. Their teachers are also able to track each student's progress in the OLC. Our seventh and eighth graders, who are also studying prayer in anticipation of becoming *Bnai Mitzvah* with Cantor Barr, asked to have a modern Hebrew language component added to their studies. Their text does not come with an online component, but instead is accompanied by an audio CD to enhance their learning experience.

We hope to have our post *Bnai Mitzvah* who are attending classes become *madrichim*, student assistants and leaders, under the direction of Rabbi Ballan and Karen Feit. We are exploring various community service projects for our Academy students as well as potential book and film programs for them.

I look forward to a year of experiential learning, individualization with our online component, camaraderie, creativity, and cooperation.

May we all also welcome a new year of blessing, health, happiness, and peace.
