From the Rabbi's desk

Shalom!

Every time I get to November, which usually coincides with the Jewish month of Cheshvan, I take a sigh of relief. Why? Because all of the chagim (Jewish holidays) are over! Ironically (at least for me), Cheshvan is often referred to as "mar cheshvan" or the "bitter" month, for Cheshvan is the only Jewish month without any Jewish holidays in it. Yet November is a busy time on the secular calendar. A very important Presidential election is coming up (please make sure to vote!) at the beginning of the month with Thanksgiving at the other end. It is also a busy time for us at TBS. We have Men's Club Shabbat, Rummage & Pancake Breakfast, just to name a few

At the time of this writing, I am looking out at my Sukkah. Sukkot was the Pilgrims' inspiration for our modern holiday of Thanksgiving. What better way celebrate their survival and their harvest than to model it after Sukkot, our fall harvest festival in which we give thanks to God?

Judaism however, does not reduce "thanksgiving" to God to just one holiday per year. In Deuteronomy 8:10 we read "V'achalta v'savata uverachta et Adonai Elohecha al ha'aretz hatova asher natan lach. When you have

eaten and are satisfied, you shall praise Adonai your God for the good land God has given you." This verse is the reason we say Birkat Hamazon, the blessing after meals. We express our appreciation for the food we have eaten and sustains us.

Gratitude is imbedded in our tradition—every day, three times a day, we pray in the Amidah, "Baruch atah Adonai, hatov shimcha ul'cha na-eh l'hodot. Blessed are You, Adonai, Your name is goodness and You are worthy of thanksgiving." We thank God for what we have, for keeping us alive, and sustaining

L'hodot—to thank—is root for the word Yehudi. Iew. To be a Jew is to be obligated to give thanks. I hope that you take the opportunity to say some words of blessing and thanks before eating your Thanksgiving meal-for health, safety, friends and family, and for the abundance we have. We also have an opportunity to say thanks with our fellow congregants and the community of Auburndale at our Annual Interfaith Thanksgiving service. This year, it takes place right here at Temple Beth Sholom, on Monday, November 21 at 7:30 pm. Please offer to help make the service a success. We need people to bake and provide for the collation as well as people to act as greeters and ushers.





It may be Cheshvan, the month with no holidays or fasts, but we're very busy here at Temple Beth Sholom. We have a Kristallnacht commemoration, the fall Rummage Sale, and the Pancake Breakfast among other things - and don't forget the bazaar coming up next month! Last month, as part of my high school class reunion, we had a chance to visit the Holocaust Center at my alma mater, the Bronx High School of Science. It is quite a comprehensive center with posters, maps, lots of books, interactive displays and other memorabilia from that black time. It was the dream of Stuart Elenko, z"l, a history teacher at Part of the social Science. curriculum, is to study at the Center.
