

*From the
Rabbi's desk*

Shalom!

Over 2,100 years ago, the Temple in Jerusalem was in shambles. It was the darkest of times—literally and figuratively, as the days are at their shortest and the nights are at their longest during the winter solstice. The Maccabees must have been shocked to find the Temple defiled and in disarray. How would they go on? They cleaned and purified, but needed enough sanctified oil to light the great Menorah. After searching high and low, legend tells us that they did find one last cruse of oil that was undefiled, but it was only enough to last for one day. The Maccabees were faced with a choice: to not light the menorah and wait until they could procure more pure oil, or light the menorah anyway. Rather than sit in the dark and cold, the Maccabees took a chance and opted for light—they chose to keep going. Miraculously, the oil lasted eight days, enough time to make more oil and keep the lamp burning continually.

The oil then, represents optimism in the face of defeat; our commitment to fight for righteousness and peace; to continue to do *tikun haolam* — repair the world, and to spread light and warmth during these

cold, dark days.

As I write this right before Thanksgiving, I am reminded that Chanukah was also a celebration of thanksgiving. The Maccabees were unable to celebrate Sukkot (a holiday of ingathering and thanks) at its proper time and celebrated it on the 25th of Kislev instead.

I, for one, have much to be thankful for. My sincerest thanks go out to everyone in our temple family who was so supportive of me in the days after my surgery. I truly was at a loss for words, and it brought tears to my eyes. I am feeling much better and once again thank you for all the love and support. We are indeed a caring community. This is what temple is all about.

This year, we are blessed to be able to celebrate Chanukah two times in the synagogue together. The first is during our Family Chanukah service on December 23. The second is on December 30, the seventh night of Chanukah. Bring your favorite Chanukah menorah to the synagogue so we may light our menorahs together and sing holiday songs. Bring the whole family. I assure you it will be truly beautiful to see all of our glowing chanukiyot burning brightly during our service, lighting up the dark winter night.

May you experience light and joy (*orah v'simcha*) during this holiday season.



Bazaar, Chanukah, vacation from school, cold weather (?), snow (?), did I say Chanukah? Lots happens in December. For those of you who are new to Temple Beth Sholom, Bazaar is our biggest fund-raiser of the year. The ballroom is converted to a wonderful shop, with booths selling many things – clothes, makeup, notions, new electronics, toys and food. The schoolrooms sell slightly used items – as is, electronics, furniture, toys, etc. In the Frank S. Greene Room, we have lots and lots of books for sale – a whole library! I will be selling some of my things as well – tallitot, kippot, and earrings, all hand-made. Please come, and tell your friends – it is not to be missed!

Chanukah is celebrated at TBS in a very special way. On December 18th, the Religious School will have Chanukah stations – Sufganyot (jelly doughnut making), games, dreidles, music and more. Religious School News

Sometimes I really hate driving to Queens on a Friday evening. The Long Island expressway is at its worst, and so am I. This is the time of day when my energy flags, and I would rather be sitting quietly with a nice cup of coffee. To help cope with the traffic, and with the setting sun in my eyes, I bring a cup of coffee in my commuter cup, or a bottle of unsweetened ice tea, or maybe a lemon drop or two and listen to the news on NPR. Then something magical happens.

I arrive at Temple Beth Sholom and drag myself down the stairs...and everything changes. First I hear a garble of happy voices as I approach the FSG Room. There, I see dear and familiar faces chatting and playing together. By the time I see the Shabbat candles ready to be lit, the Kiddush cup nearby, and I place the challah on the back table, my trip is forgotten.

I marshal some students and parents to help rearrange the chairs and get the prayer books. I retrieve my guitar from the office and hurriedly try to tune it. I call everyone into our circle, and suddenly it is Shabbat...and we are a warm and welcoming extended family/community ready to celebrate together.

We have developed a truly sacred and caring Junior Congregation community. Parents and children return month after month...We represent more than 50% of the students enrolled in the school. We count the leadership of the PA and the Hebrew School Board among our regulars. We welcome back post B'nei Mitzvah with their younger siblings and preschoolers with the older sibs. This past Shabbat we welcomed Lauren Lazarus and Noah Sokol, who had moved to Commack over the summer. We have created a kehillah kedusha, a sacred community, who play an active role in our school and our congregation. This is what a Religious School is all about. This is what synagogue life is all about. This is a great source of pride and joy to me, as it should be to all of you. If you have not had the opportunity to share Shabbat with us, please join us. It might just be the high point of your week, as it is for me...and you don't have to drive that far!

Our online Hebrew program is up and running...All students can enter and play Hebrew games and review lessons...even if they are not assigned...try it out! It's fun!


