From the Rabbi's desk

Shalom,

It is hard to believe that it is 2017. Where did the year go? To prepare for the High Holy Days, we make resolutions, look inward and strive for change. Many of us also make resolutions for the secular New Year. Probably the most common resolution is to go on a diet to lose weight. "Dieting" is difficult, and hence by mid-January many have already given up. I am no stranger to dieting myself. It is one of the hardest things to control because unlike other "vices" we need food to survive. We cannot stop eating. Food and Judaism are profoundly linked. There are foods we are forbidden to eat; our holidays and festivals are marked with special foods and treats.

Abraham of Slonim in Torat Avot (p. 195) writes, "Contrary to what one might think, it is possible sometimes to come closer to God when you are involved in material activities like eating and drinking than when you are involved with 'religious' activities like Torah study and prayer. Because when the heart opens up due to the sense of pleasure, and there is a feeling of satisfaction and happiness, then is the fit time to come close to holiness."

So, too we learn in *Darkei Tzedek*, "The main service of God is

through eating — so have I heard from my masters, and it is similar to prayer." Rather than beginning a diet this New Year, perhaps we should focus more on making the seemingly mundane act of eating one of specialness and sanctity. You may have heard of "mindful" eating. This is stopping for a moment to reflect on the food we are about to eat. Where did it come from? How did it get to my table? Judaism has a unique way of making eating a spiritual act through our recitation blessings, or berakhot.

This year, why not take on the ritual of saying a blessing before you eat a meal or a particular food? Of course we all know the blessing for bread: Baruch atah Adonai, Elo-heinu Melech ha'olam hamotzi lechem min ha-aretz. "Blessed are You, Eternal our God, Ruler of the universe, who brings forth bread from the earth." There are other blessings for different types of food that do not include bread. For food that is not bread that includes grains: Baruch atah A-donai, Elo-heinu Melech ha'olam borei minei mezonot. "Blessed are you, Eternal our God, Ruler of the universe, who creates various kinds sustenance." For fruit that comes from a tree: Baruch atah A-donai, Elo-heinu Melech ha'olam borei pri ha-eitz. "Blessed are You, Eternal our God, Ruler of the universe, who creates the fruit of the tree."

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, December 12, 2016. President Adam Gandelman spoke on how Bazaar brings the TBS family together, and what a true pleasure it is every year. Thanks to the Bazaar Co-Chairs, Joy Bobrow and Gandelman as well as to José Urbino, José Santos, and Alberto, and to all the others who labored to make Bazaar 2016 a successful event. Financial Secretary Gail Olenick reported we now have 128 Membership Units. The Board passed the November Financial Report presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz. The Pulpit and Ritual Chair Geri Weiss reported the Committee is working on ways to make next year's High Holidays even more meaningful. Rabbi Sharon Ballon reported this year's Interfaith Thanksgiving Service on Monday, November 21st, hosted by TBS, was very successful and \$644.00 was collected at that service for donation to the Food Pantry. The Nominating Committee presented the Board with a proposed slate of Nominees to bring to the January Congregational Meeting. This list will need to go back to committee for revision, as one of the proposed nominees is not currently a member in good standing, which is a requirement. The Rabbi and Cantor Contract Committee reported they will meet with both Rabbi Ballan and Cantor Barr prior to the next Board of Trustees meeting, in advance of the January Congregational Meeting.



"My Grandfather Would Have Shot Me" by Jennifer Teege



At age 38, Jennifer Teege happened to pluck a library book from the shelf—and discovered a horrifying fact: Her grandfather was Amon Goeth, the vicious Nazi commandant depicted in Schindler's List. Reviled as the "butcher of Płaszów," Goeth was executed in 1946. The more Teege learned about him, the more certain she became: If her grandfather had met her—a black woman he would have killed her.

Teege's discovery sends her into a severe depression—and fills her with questions: Why did her birth mother withhold this chilling secret? How could her grandmother have loved a mass murderer? Can evil be inherited?

Teege's story is cowritten by Nikola Sellmair, who also adds historical context and insight from Teege's family and friends, in an interwoven narrative. Ultimately, Teege's search for the truth leads her, step by step, to the possibility of her own liberation.

Happy secular New Year. January doesn't bring any holidays (only a fast on the tenth of Tevet, when the siege of Jerusalem started in 586 BCE), but we still have many things going on at Temple Beth Sholom. I continue to work with the talented b'nei mitzvah students, and singing with everyone.

On Friday, January 13th, I will be presenting the music of Debbie Friedman during the service. Her English yahrzeit is January 9th. (The Hebrew yahrzeit is the 4th of Sh'vat.) Debbie Friedman was a prolific composer, song leader and cantorial soloist. She was raised with music all around her. Influenced by the music of Peter, Paul and Mary, Peter Seeger and the like, she quickly realized that by setting prayers to folk music, she could reach many more people. Although she started as a camp song leader, she quickly graduated to leading services in synagogues, conducting choirs and composing music for many different temple venues. Her Mishebeirach is perhaps the most well known of all her compositions, as it is used everywhere, and re-added the prayer to the Reform service. Other staples sung world wide are L'chi Lach and her Havdalah. Please come and hear her music and pay tribute to this colossus of Jewish prayer.

Purim - on March 11th we will have a short service including a short Megillah reading, followed by our annual Purim Ball - not to be The next morning, March 12th, the missed. 
