March Madness

Shalom:

No, I'm not talking about the NCAA tournament, rather our celebration of the holiday of Purim! The story and customs of Purim are paradoxical. On the one hand, as we learn in the Talmud (Megillah 7b) "Rava said, 'It is a person's duty to intoxicate themselves on Purim until they cannot tell the difference between 'cursed be Haman' and 'blessed be Mordecai." We dress in costume, and we are permitted to be silly. The story itself can be viewed as farce, as everything is larger than life. Yet, on the other hand, it is very serious. It is a story (whether or not you believe it actually happened) about a plan to exterminate the Iews. And, as we approach the holiday in preparation, we are obligated to read the passage in the Torah about what Amalek did to us when we left Egypt (Deut. 25:17-19); how he snuck up on the Israelites and cut down the infirm and weak who were in the rear. This is Shabbat Zachor, the Shabbat of Remembrance that occurs on the Shabbat preceding Purim. I often wonder why there are so many 'opposites' in this story. But perhaps that is the point. Life is a series of opposites

as well. We are forced to laugh in the face of sorrow, pain and even fear. In the words of Bobby McFerrin, "Don't worry, be happy!"

Perhaps, as well, the masks that we wear have dual purposes as Nina Beth Cardin writes, "They can both conceal and create. They hide what we choose to hide and show what we want to reveal... Costumes permit us to assume styles that might otherwise clash with the persona we normally project. Properly selecting and acknowledging our daily masks is a hard-won skill of the well-adjusted. On Purim, we are allowed to push the envelope even further."

At this time of year the weather can also waffle between winter and spring. One day it will snow, and the next day it may be 60 degrees outside. Hopefully it won't get in the way of TBS' Purim celebration which falls on Saturday evening, March 11. Come down at 6:30 pm for the Megillah reading and service, and stay for the Purim Ball. Our kids will have a chance to party it up at their own Purim dance on March 5, and a Purim Spiel on March 12. Details are in this month's bulletin.



February Board of Trustees Meeting

The New Board of Trustees had its first meeting of the Fiscal Year on Monday, February 13, 2017. After President Adam Gandelman welcomed new and veteran Trustees, Lee Temares reviewed the basics of Robert's Rules of Order. The Temple Bylaws had been distributed via email and, per the Bylaws, President Gandelman read Article III, Section 4 to the Board. Financial Secretary Gail Olenick reported that our current number of membership units is now 124. The Board passed the January Financial report as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz. Rabbi Ballan and Cantor Barr reported on recent and upcoming services and Purim holiday events. David Chenkin will Chair a Bylaws Committee that was formed in response to the need to propose amendments to the Bylaws to have fewer Trustees serve on the Board. Lee Temares, Jim Kettig, and Barry Packer will be on this committee.

The Board considered the request by Paul Engel, Executive Director of the Flushing Jewish Community Council (FJCC), that the Temple building be the site of a monthly food pantry. The food (all non-perishable) would be delivered on an afternoon, and on the following day there would be a FJCC volunteer staff available for security and to manage distribution of food from the Ballroom. Distribution would take from two to three hours. This request was approved on a trial basis.

Jim Kettig, House Committee Chair, presented updates on Cooling Tower maintenance and ongoing required testing, the leaks in the Skylight over the Bimah, and decisions regarding the replacement of all Temple lighting to LEDs. Karla Bonné reported that analysis of the last two years of electrical bills demonstrate a significantly higher bill to Viridian than Con Edison. Joy Bobrow will follow up with Cantor Sandy Goodman, the Viridian representative.

During her report, Cantor Kathy Barr clarified to the Board that she is now in a position to negotiate a new contract. The Board, however, voted not to enter into negotiations with Cantor Barr. There will be a Special Congregational Meeting called in order to present this recommendation to the Congregation. Options were discussed, and will be further explored by the subcommittee, to bring to this Special Congregational Meeting.

Notes From Cantor Kathy Barr

Shalom!

March brings Purim, the story of one of our greatest triumphs over tyranny. On Purim, we are commanded to hear the Megilah read. A megilah is a scroll, and there are actually five of them. They are Ecclesiastes, Esther, Song of Songs, Ruth, and the Lamentations of Jeremiah. Each are read on different holidays - Sukkot, Purim, Pesach, Shavuot and Tisha B'Av, respectively. The one we read on Purim is the book of Esther. It is also the one we customarily read from a scroll. There is a special trope for Esther. It is very different from the regular Torah trope we hear on Shabbat, or haftarah trope, or High Holiday Torah trope. There is as well a special trope for Ruth, Ecclesiastes and Song of Songs, known as RES trope, and another one for Lamentations. In Esther, we have what are known as detours. These are certain passages that are sung differently, such as 1:7, and 2:6, where these passages are rendered sadly, reminiscent of the trope used in Lamentations. Others are exultant or agitated. There are all in all eighteen detours in the ten chapters of the book of Esther.

This Purim, I will be chanting from Megilah Esther in Esther trope, from our Megilah, which we keep in the display in the upper lobby. Megilahs are very often kept in a special canister, and the attached scroll rolls out of the canister, like ours. I've seen them made out of silver and wood. The scroll, like the Torah scroll, is handwritten by a sofer, on parchment made from Kosher animals. Other ways of making megilot are simply rolling up the scroll and placing it in a canister. I encourage you to come see the Megilah and to hear it chanted on Saturday night, March 11th, before the Purim Ball. We will also be having a Purim service for the religious school the next morning, during which I will chant from the scroll again. Then, the children will present the Purim spiel. This year, it is called Peter Pansky. The children are having a lot of fun, and it will be a very enjoyable morning. Come hear the silly melodies of the prayers too, as on Purim, we are supposed to be irreverent and have fun.

On March 17th, we will present a Pop Shabbat. Most of the melodies of the prayers will be pop tunes you (Continued on page 7)


