From the Rabbi's Desk

Passover, like our other festivals (Sukkot and Shavuot) is dual in nature. That is, we both an historical have component as well as a seasonal or agricultural aspect to our celebration. Historically, we recall the Exodus from Egypt. We physically act out the story of Passover during our seders. For me, the very act of cleaning, cooking and preparing for the holiday enables me to feel a little bit like it must have been to be a slave!

All kidding aside, experiencing both slavery and freedom is what Passover is all about. Passover is also known "Zeman Heiruteinu" the as "Time of our Freedom." Sometimes external forces enslave us-we become slaves to our environment, our surroundings and entrapments, but sometimes we can be our own worst enemies and we enslave ourselves. Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel taught that true freedom "is the liberation from the tyranny of the self-centered ego."

Agriculturally, we learn in the Torah that Passover must take place in the month of *Aviv* (spring), and is also referred to as *Hag Ha-Aviv*. Alas, as of this writing, it doesn't feel much like spring, as there is still half a foot of snow in my yard!

Is there a connection between *"Hag Ha-Aviv"* and *"Zeman Heiruteinu?"* 

The Israelites, who were enslaved by Pharaoh, and seemed destined for degradation and perhaps annihilation, break forth out of Egypt into a new life towards the land of milk and honey, just like new growth bursts forth from the hard, cold ground into the warmth of spring.

Rabbi Michael Strassfeld writes in The Jewish Holidays. "The watchwords of both spring and Pesach are *rebirth* and *hope*. Thus, the spirit of renewed optimism aroused by the sights and smells of spring are reinforced in a Jewish context by Passover with its trumpeting of the possibilities liberation. Passover of reminds us annually that no matter how terrible our situation, we must not lose hope."

I know I saw a few crocuses popping up out of the snow. I am not losing hope that there *will* be a spring, rebirth and growth!

Walt and I wish you a joyous and *zissen* Pesach!

Notes From Cantor Kathy Barr

#### Shalom!

April brings Spring (hopefully), warmer weather and lots of flowers. It also brings Pesach. Pasach means to pass over, as the Angel of God passed over the houses of the Jews in Egypt, sparing them the last plague, the slaving of the first-born. There is a special trope for the Song of Songs, which we read on Pesach. It is reserved for the three festivals, and is known as RES trope, or Ruth, Ecclesiastes and Song of Songs. Each scroll we read instead of the haftarah on the designated day of the festival is chanted in this special trope. As Pesach begins on the first full moon of the New Year; the month at that time of Aviv (Spring), it is appropriate to sing of flowers and love. During Pesach, we also repeat the readings from the Torah about the first Passover, and the flight from Egypt.

Pesach is my favorite holiday. I even love Matzah! When I was a little girl, our seders went on forever. We always had at least one scholar, a few religious school teachers, and as much family and friends as we could fit (it was really tight!). Most children would be hiding under the table, but I loved every second. Hearing our friend, Jean Moldovan, sing some of the prayers, is what inspired me to become a cantor.

April 22nd also will be the Cantor's Cabaret. This time, it will be on a Saturday night. We will of course be serving dinner, have a cash bar, and it will be lots of fun. This is definitely NOT a "cantorial" concert! There will be torch songs and love songs, rock songs and Broadway songs, solos and ensembles — comedy and sing-alongs too. All the fun starts at 7 pm. 




