

From the Rabbi's Desk

"Journeys and Milestones"

On the secular calendar, it is the month of June. On the Hebrew calendar, we move from the month of Sivan to Tamuz. In our cycle of Torah reading, we move from the book of Leviticus, to the book of Numbers. In Hebrew, this book is called *B'midbar*, "in the wilderness." In this book, the Children of Israel spend thirtyeight years in this wilderness, wandering.

What was the purpose of this wandering. and why wilderness? The desert is a difficult place. There are no landmarks to indicate how many more miles to go. It is a challenging place; basic needs are hard to come by. Perhaps that is the point—in times of difficulty and challenge we can experience the most growth. The Children of Israel developed into a nation in this vast, empty desert.

Like the Israelites' journeys in the desert, we learn that the most important things in life are neither simple, nor troublefree. Sometimes we need to live 'in the wilderness' where things are challenging and uncomfortable, and even mundane.

But, although the wilderness might feel like a lonely, forbidding place, we are not alone. We have family, friends, and most importantly, our TBS community, sustaining us on our journey.

Unlike "midbar," the wilderness, the month of June does contain milestones and markers. We have journeyed in time to complete a school year; there are graduations and celebrations. On June 2 we will celebrate with Justin Rossman and his family as he becomes Temple Beth Sholom's newest confirmand. Mazal Tov to him and his entire family!

June 9th marks the end of our Religious School year. The Junior Congregation will help lead our Shabbat service and the Religious School will hold their closing exercises. Please celebrate with Sisterhood on June 23rd when they lead us in prayer and install their 2017 Board.

Finally, I would like to wish Cantor Kathy Barr all the best as she leaves us at the end of the month. Good-byes are so difficult. I never thought about it before, but perhaps that is one reason that there isn't a separate word for 'good-bye' in Hebrew. When we say good-bye (shalom) we are really wishing one another peace, and that everything will be all right. So, I wish Cantor Barr shalom rav, much peace.

### May Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on May 8th. Our current number of membership units is now 122 families, after past President Carol Lowenstein's death. March and April financial reports were accepted by the Board, as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz. Rabbi Sharon Ballan reported on recent and upcoming services and Adult Education events. She urged all to attend the Confirmation of Justin Rossman on June 2nd. Cantor Kathy Barr reported on recent and upcoming Bar/Bat Mitzvah students through June, and Jr. Choir events. She expressed how much she has enjoyed working with and teaching the students and Jr. Choir participants. The Food Pantry continues to distribute on the 3rd Tuesday of the month. Sisterhood, Religious School, Men's Club, and the Parents Association reviewed recent and upcoming events. Jeffrey Cohen reported the bi-monthly book sort has now sorted 7,000 books in advance of Bazaar. Jeffrey Cohen has been elected to be the new Men's Club President. Erica Bernstein and Elana White have been elected to be Co-Presidents of Parents' Association. Sisterhood will hold its elections on May 23rd. Sisterhood Shabbat will be on June 23rd and Cantor Kathy Barr will be honored at that service. The Board of Trustees reviewed the one-year contract negotiated with Jerry Korobow to provide Cantorial services, and the Board voted to present this contract to the Congregation for ratification at the May 16th congregational meeting. The Board also approved a motion to create a Contract Review subcommittee to review all TBS contracts to assure they reflect current practice and meet existing law. The Board approved a motion to authorize additional funds to the Membership Committee to fund a mass mailing for the Sept. 8th Open House and Membership Drive. House Committee Chair Jim Kettig emailed a detailed report on the dire condition of our cooling tower and the immediate steps that have been taken to rebuild it and to perform ongoing required maintenance. Rebuilding cost has been estimated at \$15,000.

### Scoop's Schmooze

This is a monthly column by Board of Trustee member, Barry "Scoop" Packer, with the topic for this month being all that Temple Beth Sholom has to offer everyone.

There are two old adages and one phrase that come to mind as I write this column. The terminology is "House of Worship," while the sayings are "What came first, the chicken or the egg?" and "Home is where the heart is."

During its heyday, the synagogue that I grew up in on the South Shore of Boston, which is a handful of years younger than our own Temple Beth Sholom, had 400 families and between 1,100 and 1,200 members. There was a well-attended religious school, Friday night, Saturday and holiday services, weekly Bingo, plays and concerts, USY, and other activities. Unfortunately, the altering demographic in the community and the congregation's changing population led to Temple Beth Am having to shutter its doors and sell its facility. And within the past month, they relocated the remaining congregants, clergy and artifacts to another synagogue in a neighboring town; where, for now, they will co-exist as individual entities and then, in the future, quite possibly merge with that congregation.

And, as all this was taking place a couple of hundred miles away, I pondered how we could make sure this doesn't happen with our synagogue. I reflected on the most recent Board of Trustees and Membership Committee meetings, where the question was raised as to how we increase our membership population, and looked through the last couple of editions of The Voice. This led me to the axiom of the chicken and the egg. For, while there is something for everyone at TBS; do people join and remain members for many years because of the plethora of activities that are there and the family-like atmosphere or do you need more participating congregants to help initiate and grow these and other ventures?

While in its current state, our house of worship is considerably smaller than my former temple was at its peak; the fact of the matter is that no matter the depth of your Jewish beliefs and practices, or what your interests are, TBS has something for everybody. Just look at April, May and beyond.

For the children, the synagogue's future foundation, there has been and will be family services, a religious school seder, the Lag B'Omer picnic, a Shul-In, and a trip to the Lower East Side. For those who have an affinity for music and the arts, Sisterhood has its book club meeting and presented a dinner with the musical group, Gathering Time. There was also the Cantor's Cabaret and the meet-and-greet performance

audition of TBS's cantor-in-waiting, Jerry Korobow. Our Rummage Sale, Blood Drive and Food Pantry work not only for the benefit of TBS, but the community of Flushing and vicinity. Those of us who are sports fanatics have seen presentations from Alan Freedman of the Jewish Sports Heritage Association and boxing aficionado Mike Silver, participate in a monthly bowling completion, and are looking forward to Jewish Heritage Night at minor league baseball's Long Island Ducks. Coupling all of these with past and future events like the Purim Ball and the Chicken Soup Cook-Off, and the possibilities are endless.

And, whether it is Shabbat and holiday services, Simchat Shabbat, Bar and Bat Mitzvahs or the way difficult personal situations are overcome, Rabbi Ballan's motivation, inspiration and compassion help make all of these special and unique to the TBS family.

So, it is plain to see that TBS still has its solid foundation. It has its activities. It just needs for people from all over to be informed and engaged so it can still and again flourish, instead of going in the opposite direction, as my former synagogue unfortunately did; and for people to realize that Temple Beth Sholom of Flushing is actually a "Home of Worship," for, as the saying goes, "Home is where the heart is."
