From the Rabbi's desk

November is a time when Rabbis and Cantors all over the world typically express a sigh of relief. The chagim (holidays) are over, and Cheshvan, which arrived at the end of October, does not have a single Jewish holiday in it. It is also known as "Marcheshvan," or sad/bitter Cheshvan, and I am of the opinion that this nickname is taken sarcastically among clergy. We need one month where nothing special happens! Of course, that really isn't the case many important events are taking place in November at Temple Beth Sholom.

On Friday evening, November 10th, we will be commemorating Kristallnacht, the "night of broken glass." On November 9, 1938, violence broke out in Germany and Austria. Over 1000 synagogues were burned or damaged, thousands of Jewish businesses were trashed and looted, dozens of Jewish people were killed. and **Jewish** cemeteries, hospitals, schools, and homes were looted while police and fire brigades stood by. Many consider this night the actual beginning of what we now call the Holocaust.

I hope you will join us that Shabbat as Temple member Larry Schwarz will speak about his father's experiences during this tragic period in our history. The service begins at 8 p.m.

November also brings the season of Thanksgiving. The Pilgrims based this holiday on our festival of Sukkot, the fall harvest festival. Each year, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, Temple Beth Sholom holds its annual Pancake Breakfast in conjunction with a Blood Drive. One way to give thanks is to perform the lifesaving *mitzvah* of donating blood, which is always in high demand.

I encourage you to begin a practice of being thankful for the good things in your lives. One way to achieve this is attending Shabbat Services, where we often celebrate joyous occasions with each other.

I, for one am thankful for the wonderful community here at Temple Beth Sholom. May we go from strength to strength.

October Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on October 9th, 2017. Our current number of membership units is now 123 family units. Financial Secretary Gail Olenick reported at this time 74% of all members have paid their dues in full. The September Financial Report was accepted by the Board. Rabbi Sharon Ballan thanked all who participated in and helped out with the High Holiday services, which have been wonderful.

There are 8 students in the combined Confirmation and post- B'nei Mitzvah class. Chai Mitzvah class will be starting October 17th at 7:30 p.m. Cantor Jerry Korobow also thanked all who attended and contributed to High Holiday services.

Past President David Chenkin reported for the Bylaws Committee, who presented 5 motions to make changes in the Bylaws. All were unanimously approved by vote. These proposed changes will be presented to the Congregation for vote at the Congregational Meeting on October $24^{\rm th}$.

These changes propose to reduce the number of Trustees and Officers on The Board, as well as several corrections to typos and adjustment to make pronouns gender neutral. The Board elected 5 members of the Nominating Committee (Jim Kettig, Jeff Cohen, David Chenkin, Sharon Katz, & Eric Lustig). Six additional Temple members will be elected at the Congregational Meeting on October 24th for the Nominating Committee.

Dr. Fay Halpern Schildkraut presented 3 new members for approval: Pamela & Robert Abrams and daughter, Donald Weston, and Cindy Weiss. They have added a family to Jewish Start, which now have 4 families with 6-7 children in attendance. She reported she is getting daily calls of interest. Reports for Religious School, Sisterhood, Men's Club, and Parents' Association were briefly made.

Barry Packer, Ways & Means Chair, reported on the Chicken Soup Cook-Off planning progress. Eric Bernstein reported on upcoming Adult Education events. Ilyne Rabinowitz reported 90 people attended the very successful OFA-NY "Syria Supper Club" on October 8th at TBS, which raised \$2,100.00 to help support recently settled Syrian refugee families.



Here's another quiz. See how you do on this one:

Cantor's Corner

I recently received a telephone call from a friend of mine inviting me to a party. I always look forward to hearing from my friend Roger Sprung, who is an 87-yearold national banjo champion.

When was the last time you saw Carly Simon, Tina Turner, Temple Beth Sholom of Flushing, and Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur and Sukkot *ALL* used at the same time?

Well, the answer is this fall, the Jewish New Year of 5778. For one can take the song titles, *Nobody Does It Better* and *That's The Way I Always Heard It Should Be*, both by Carly Simon and Tina Turner's *Simply The Best*; and end up with what was recently seen, heard and felt at our own Temple Beth Sholom. It didn't matter if it were Rosh Hashanah, Kol Nidre, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, or Simchat Torah, there was the atmosphere that those three song titles spoke of.

These sentiments were duplicated and the comments were plentiful when people were leaving services, at the October Board of Trustees Meeting or at Pizza in the Hut, which was wonderfully attended by approximately five dozen people children and adults alike, at 5:30 on a Wednesday afternoon during the first week of October. The services seemed to give everyone the same emotions and feelings of happiness, joy, excitement, and warmth. For many, it seemed to hearken back to the times when the rows of pews in the sanctuary were filled so much to capacity that extra chairs, numbering in the hundreds, had to be set up and people would actually sit on stages or on bay window sills. There were the indelible images of everyone wearing brand new suits or dresses that were purchased just for the holidays; and the anticipation of spending that extra-special time with family and friends. And as you sat back and listened to Rabbi Ballan and Cantor Korobow chanting the prayers, the sounds of such beautiful and traditional music once again could not help but being permanently etched in one's memory bank.

It was not "just a service." So many people participated throughout the holidays. Whether it was one of your fellow congregants who read from the torah, carried and dressed the scrolls, or

recited readings; who were mothers and daughters opening the arks, taking part in the genuinely emotional Healing Service or everyone watching the children sitting on the bimah with their eyes and ears affixed on Religious School Director Karen Feit, it was all what temple is supposed to be. And, nearing services' end, the trio of shofar blowers of Rabbi Ballan, Jennifer Schecter-Lonborg and Adam Galchus; it seemed as though the congregation was hoping that the melodious and lengthy Tekiah Gedolah, that "is meant to give hope and inspire," would last right into next year's services.

However, between this year's Havdalah service at the conclusion of Yom Kippur and when 5779 arrives, it is inevitable that as sure we will be watching the likes of Amy Freeze, Janice Huff and Al Roker talking about low pressure and wind gusts, sleet and blizzards, our chills will be removed from freezing temperatures. Let this be done by reliving the memories and the warmth that were delivered during this New Year, as well as by the image that we got as we looked through the roof of the sukkah to see only sun and the clear blue sky, while listening to Cantor Jerry Korobow lead everyone in The Byrds' *Turn, Turn, Turn, with* the last line of its concluding stanza so appropriate:

To everything (turn, turn, turn)
There is a season (turn, turn, turn)
And a time to every purpose, under heaven
A time to gain, a time to lose
A time to rend, a time to sew
A time for love, a time for hate
A time for peace, I swear it's not too late


