# From the Rabbi's desk

Once again, I marvel at how quickly the year has gone. I can't believe it is 2018 already! On the Jewish calendar, however, it is still 5778. Our secular month of January this year encompasses the Jewish months of Tevet and Sh'vat. Tu Bishvat (or the 15th of Sh'vat) falls on the very last day of January this year, so we do get to claim that a Jewish holiday falls in January. Very often Tu Bishvat, the New Year for Trees, falls in conjunction with Shabbat Shira, (Sabbath of Song) and the Torah portion Beshalach, which includes the account of the parting of the Sea of Reeds. Moses, Miriam and the Children of Israel rejoice in song after the sea closes up on Pharaoh's army and they are destroyed. We are grateful for being redeemed at the Sea of Reeds, yet we acknowledge that in order for that to happen, many had to die on our account. Should exult in others' we misfortune?

Our sages also wonder how God felt as the sea enclosed on Pharaoh's army. In a midrash found in the Talmud (Sanhedrin 39b) on the 'Song of the Sea' passage in the Torah, we learn that "the ministering angels desired to recite a song before the Holy Blessed One. The Holy One said to them: The works of my hand, (the Egyptians) are drowning in the sea, and you are reciting a song before Me?" Apparently, God is not happy. The angels are not allowed to rejoice in song; only those who actually experienced the deliverance are allowed to celebrate. This passage, "Shirat HaYam" the song at the sea, is recited daily in our traditional

morning liturgy, and part of it, the "Mi Chamocha" we recite every morning and evening. We are thankful and grateful that we were redeemed. However we, like God, are saddened that many had to die on our account, and so it is our obligation to repair the world—to work for justice and righteousness. We remember that we were slaves in Egypt and what it was like to be a stranger.

Many communities hold a special musical Shabbat service on Shabbat Shira, which falls on January 26. This year, TBS is observing Shabbat Shira in a unique way. We will be hosting a Shabbat" "Gospel service conjunction with The Voices of Victory, St. John University's Gospel Choir. (Thanks to Cantor Korobow!) In this way, we will celebrate both Shabbat Shira and Martin Luther King Day. As Martin Luther King Jr. said, (December 24, 1967 in Atlanta, GA) "If we are to have peace on earth, our lovalties must become ecumenical rather than sectional. Our loyalties must transcend our race, our tribe, our class, and our nation; and this means we must develop a world perspective."

I hope that you will join us on this momentous occasion as we celebrate and sing praises to God together. May it reaffirm our commitment to social justice and peace.



## **December Board of Trustees Meeting**

The Board of Trustees met on December 11, 2017. Our current number of membership units is 120 family units and nearly all members are now paid in full. Financial Secretary Gail Olenick is working hard to assure that all members are in good standing and that over \$18,000 is still owed in Membership Dues (which includes a substantial amount of Religious/Hebrew School tuition/fees) and must be paid by January 31st.

The November Financial Report was accepted by the Board as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz. The Board also approved the proposed 2018-2019 Budget to be presented at the January Congregational Meeting for Members to vote on.

Cantor Jerry Korobow read Rabbi Ballan's report, as she is on vacation. Cantor reported on the upcoming January 26th Gospel Shabbat which will include the Voices of Victory from St. John's University, his Sermon in Song, and singers from our Temple who responded to his request for volunteers. Vice President Joy Bobrow reported that Bazaar did better than last year and thanked everyone for their support.

Sisterhood President Barbara Gandelman reported they are donating \$3,000 to Temple. She announced Robin Myers and Lori Lustig will take over Sistergrams from Sharon Katz, since she will be moving. She reported that the Religious School is negotiating a 2 year contract with Principal Karen Feit. Vice President Fay Halpern Schildkraut, Membership Chair, reported on upcoming Purim Ball and Shabbat Across America plans. Parents Association Co-President Erica Bernstein presented a \$500 check to Temple. She reviewed upcoming events and noted that the Purim Carnival plans to be held offsite in 2018 at Jib Lanes on March 4th.

## Religious School News

The Jewish people are defined by three pillars: Torah, God, and Israel.

As a child raised in a shul-going community, I always saw the Torah from a distance. It took on a mystical aura for me. I was in awe of the men who went up to it and actually touched it; and I was especially in awe of the Torah reader who read with such speed and haunting melody. Simchat Torah was my favorite holiday because it was the time we girls could get closer to the Torah. We danced during the Hakafot!

I was part of one of the first generations of Jewish girls who became Bnot Mitzvah. We got nowhere near the Torah, however. We chanted Haftarah and gave little speeches. Torah was still off limits. I went to Hebrew School six hours a week. I was in synagogue on Friday nights and Saturday mornings. We stayed home from school on all major holidays and went to services. I know much of the Shabbat and holiday liturgy by heart...

None of this made up for the fact that the Torah was off limits. It is truly the embodiment of our link to history, to tradition, and perhaps to God. The ancient scrolls are written in unvocalized Hebrew written expertly by scribes who dedicate their lives to their work.

I had been teaching Hebrew and preparing Bnai Mitzvah for years before I ever got to read from a Torah scroll myself. There are no words to describe the adrenaline rush I felt as I chanted. My best friend, sitting in the congregation watching me said the look on my face was amazing. The rush has not diminished in the years since I started reading Torah over twenty years ago. This is an experience I would like to share with our students here at TBS.

The key to enabling students to participate in a Jewish community and in communal prayer anywhere in the world in the ability to read Hebrew. I have stood at the Kotel, on the women's side listening to many minyanim of men pray aloud. Often I didn't know the melodies, but I always could recognize the words! It made me feel a part of something greater than myself. I have sung Hebrew songs with people from all over the world. It's an awesome feeling to belong!

All of this came back to me yesterday at our Chanukah celebration. After seeing "Full Court Miracle," which included Hebrew prayer and blessings, we lit the Chanukiyah, we ate sufganiyot and latkes...we sang songs and blessings. Our Hebrew was the thread that wove it all together. This is why we spend one of our two sessions a week on Hebrew. This is why we teach prayer skills in Junior Congregation. This is why we individualize instruction in prayer, Torah and Haftarah for Bnai Mitzvah. This is why we have computer components at all levels of Hebrew instruction to accompany our textbooks. We want to enable our students to connect with our people, our prayers, our history and traditions. The basic skill of Hebrew reading is the key. Some may (Continued on page 8)






