# From the Rabbi's desk

"Be Happy, It's Adar!"

To T.S. Eliot, "April is the cruelest month" yet in my mind, it surely was this past January. What will February bring? Weather-wise, we cannot be certain. What we can be sure of is that we are moving into the month of Adar, which falls on February 15-16th. In elementary school I learned the familiar adage, "March comes in like a lion, and goes out like a lamb." How many of us know the Jewish adage, "From the beginning of Adar, we increase our happiness?" The rabbis of the Talmud (Ta'anit 29a) coined this phrase as they discussed the holiday of Purim that they so loved and so looked forward to. Purim comes early (do the Jewish holidays ever come on time?), Wednesday evening, February 28th. Why were the rabbis so enamored with Purim? Could it be that it stems of the strangest commandments in Jewish law, the commandment to get so drunk as to no longer tell the difference between blessed Mordechai and wicked Haman? Perhaps it is also because we listen once again to the story of Purim as the Scroll of Esther is read with revelry and noisemaking. Perhaps it is that we are officially allowed to act "silly" once a year; to completely let our inhibitions go, to act larger than life.

In fact, we mimic the story of Purim itself. If one looks closely at *Megillat Esther*, the Scroll of Esther, we see that everything in it is larger than life: King Achashverosh is a bumbling fool who dismisses his Queen because of what the people in his kingdom would think if they

found out his wife wouldn't listen to him; Haman is a caricature of the "evil prime minister" plotting to take over the world; Mordechai and Esther are our virtuous heroes. Everything is exaggerated: The king parties for six months; Esther gets pampered with make-up and perfumes for a whole year; even the gallows Haman is hanged on is an astounding 75 feet high!

But just as we can read the Scroll of Esther as a farce, we can also read it as a very dark and distressing story. After all, Haman plotted to commit genocide and exterminate all the Jews in his country. (Where have we heard that before?) The edict could not be overturned, so the Jews were allowed to fight for their freedom. Haman and his ten sons are hanged, and the Jews kill 75,000 of their enemies.

Is it right to make light of such a serious topic? Obviously, the rabbis thought so. But just as we are commanded to observe this day with unbridled joy, we are also commanded to be charitable to *everyone* in need. On this day we send gift baskets (*mishloach manot*) to each other, but we also must take care of the needs of the poor. No one is to be refused *tzedakkah*.

On Saturday evening, February 24<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 p.m, come to TBS for our own Purim Ball. Come in costume! Come and be silly! Don't forget our *Megillah* reading on Wednesday, February 28<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m, which begins with a short service and is followed by our Purim Shpiel led by our Religious School. A light dinner (pizza and salad) will be served.

I am looking forward to celebrating with you all.



### January Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, January 8th, 2018. As this was the last Board Meeting with Adam Gandelman as President many reports began with heartfelt thanks to President Gandelman for his steadfast leadership over the past 6 years.

Financial Secretary Gail Olenick reported our current membership is 119 family units with over 87% now paid in full. We have outstanding (i.e., unpaid dues) of over \$13,500 which includes over \$4,000 in school fees. The December Financial Report was accepted by the Board as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz.

Rabbi Ballan reported on the importance of remaining optimistic in one's thoughts and words regarding how synagogues can serve in positive ways and make positive changes. She also shared a disturbing phone call she and other area temples received on Christmas Day – which she reported to local law enforcement, the ADL and to local press as well. She spoke on the importance of having sound security practices. She also reported on upcoming services.

Cantor Korobow reported on further plans and TBS adult choir formation in preparation for the January 26<sup>th</sup> Gospel Shabbat, which will include the Voices of Victory from St. John's University, his Sermon in Song, and singers from our Temple.

The Board approved a donation from the Music Fund to be directed to the Voices of Victory Gospel Choir. Sisterhood will fund a special (pizza) Oneg after the service. Religious School Chair Barbara Gandelman reported the School Board has negotiated a 2-year contract with Principal Karen Feit and the Board approved the contract.

Adult Education Chair Eric Bernstein reported on a successful lecture by Rabbi David Kalb on Jewish Gangsters and the suggestion was made that we record these special lectures for internal use by those unable to attend the lecture. Marchel Gillin reported that the Food Pantry will need to end after this month, due to lack of funding. A Cantor's Contract Negotiating Committee will be formed.

Purim is coming!! Look for details in the Voice about the upcoming Purim Ball.





### Scoop's Schmooze

As I sit here to pen this piece, Temple Beth Sholom of Flushing's first Gospel Shabbat is exactly two weeks from tonight. Whether it is coincidental or not, the same night and weekend that St. John's University's Voices of Victory Gospel Choir will be gracing TBS's congregation and guests with the beauty of its music, just happens to be Shabbat Shirah: otherwise translated to Sabbath of Song.

It is also the Torah portion Beshalach. And, the ironic point with all of these details is that this is the anniversary of my Bar Mitzvah. The irony behind that is that for those who "have had the pleasure" to sit around me during any of the Shabbat or holiday services: while I thoroughly enjoy listening to, and even chanting, especially the traditional melodies that I grew up with, there will never be any confusion of my musical talents with my namesakes by the last names of Manilow, White or Gibb.

And, even though I live in a home with my wife Renee, who, as many of you know, is an incomparable performer, and who has musical bloodlines that have been traced from her grandmother's family members who were cantors, to her mother the composer, to her, her brother and her son as singers; for me, those traits have not rubbed off and those talents still remain very well-hidden.

Yet, at this time of year, I reflect back to the thrills which I enjoyed and the memories that were created on January 25<sup>th</sup>, 1975. And, even though it is far from melodious, in my mind, I hear myself singing the prayers before and after the Haftorah and even still remember the first line or two of Beshalach. And, then I take the opportunity to sit back and look at my Bar Mitzvah photo album. I am blessed to be able to re-live that day.

I see pictures of my family, of friends of my parents, and of some of my friends who, to this day, I have known for virtually my entire life. And then there are vibrant photos of others who, unfortunately, are no longer with us; yet, whose memories of times and conversations, laughter and tears shared are permanently ensconced in the back of my mind. For no matter the age of those special people who leave us, they always seem to leave us far too soon. Thus, the title of Rabbi Harold Kushner's 1981 book, When Bad Things Happen To Good People, dedicated to his son who lost his life to progeria at age 14, rings so true. For whereas nobody ever knows what is going to happen in someone's life, being nice and kind and genuine to someone, and taking the opportunity to visit with someone, talk to someone, write to someone, should be the easiest thing to do and one should never wait until it is too late to do so.

To that point, a story was told to me the other day that spoke exactly to that. As my parents were attending the funeral of a dentist and temple member in the Boston

suburb that I was raised in, they went into the family room prior to the service and spoke to the dentist's wife. She said part of the eulogy would sound familiar.

While he was not the dentist that I, my parents or my sister went to, he was that of my mother's parents. My grandparents had been married almost 60 years when my grandmother passed away in 1995. We knew that her loss would take an immeasurable toll on my grandfather, who then was in his late 80's. While we lived minutes away from him, and were always there for him, he occasionally wanted someone else to talk to. So, however frequent it was and he needed it to be, he would go to see this dentist, complaining that his dentures were not feeling right. This dentist would take the dentures to one of the other examination rooms, put them in a cup and come back and talk with my grandfather for 20 or 30 minutes or an hour, or however long he wanted. He would then go back to get the dentures and give them back to my grandfather--without having paid an iota of attention to the dentures and with my grandfather not having paid one red cent.

"How do they feel?" the dentist would ask; to which my grandfather responded, "much better."

Instead of seeing other patients and putting more dollars in his pocket, for this doctor, there was nothing more valuable than the time spent with my grandfather.

It took nothing more for him to be nice.

Just as it took nothing for Rabbi Ballan and Adam and Jose and Rita to be nice when recently our family unexpectedly suffered a loss of a family member; and all that they could do was to reach out to us and help us out with their kindness, thoughtfulness and compassion in any way possible. Just as it took nothing for the dozens of people from Temple to be nice in supporting Renee's recent comeback into the cabaret world. Just as it took nothing for Lisa to be nice in giving of her time and talent in videotaping and producing Chicken Soup Cook-Off DVDs and saying that if anyone wants a copy, she doesn't want any of the money and just wants to make sure it is donated right back to Temple.

Just as it takes nothing for the members of the Temple Board of Trustees, the Executive Board and the assorted committees to be nice in coming together, meeting occasionally and coming up with ideas that will help TBS flourish and thrive for years and decades into the future. Just as it takes nothing for so many members of the TBS family to volunteer their time, effort and suggestions in coming up with, and being a part of so many of our special events. Just as it took nothing for Cantor Korobow to be nice in coordinating and running Temple Beth Sholom's Gospel Shabbat.

It takes nothing to be nice. But being nice is truly something.




