From the Rabbi's desk

A frequent lament of mine is how quickly the time flies. Already the calendar reminds me that it is time to prepare for Passover, even as Purim has not yet occurred, and I am writing this article in February! For those of you who need reminding, the first night of Passover falls on Friday, March 30. The last time Passover fell in March was five years ago, in 2013.

Passover is my favorite holiday, so I should be getting extra excited. since it comes 'early.' Yet, the preparations are not my favorite. I have to contemplate cleaning, cooking and shopping. It is very physically draining, to say the least. As I get older, I try to think of any way that I can take a shortcut through this process. I have come to realize that perhaps all of this work has a purpose. It is to remind that nothing comes easy, especially 'freedom.' It reminds us that Passover is an experience not just a simple celebration.

I wonder though, about our attention to the removal of *hametz*, 'leaven.' It seems almost obsessive. To some, this *hametz* even seems 'evil.' It has been compared to the *yetzer-hara*, the 'evil inclination.' *Hametz*, leavened bread, is 'puffed up,' and is often compared to pride or one's ego. But according to Rabbi Michael Strassberg, some in our tradition do not consider *hametz* inherently evil.

"It asks, Why is something permissible fifty-one weeks a year suddenly prohibited? Why are we not only forbidden to eat *hametz* but even to possess it? The answer may be that we are prohibited from owning *hametz* to remind us that slavery lies among our possessions. The things we possess often possess us."

I don't prefer to view *hametz* as inherently 'evil,' either. Why are we reminded that, "You shall not abhor an Egyptian because you were a stranger in Egypt" [Deut. 23:8]? Perhaps as Michael Strassberg points out, "to continue to hate the Egyptian would mean to be enslaved by that hatred. We would be stuck to each other in a way that allows neither of us to move on." Sometimes it is necessary to let go, even for just a little while. We remember that we were slaves, but we shouldn't be permanently enslaved.

As a reminder, the first night of Passover will fall on a Shabbat. Since the Passover *seder* is primarily a home observance, we will **not** hold a formal Shabbat service at Temple Beth Sholom on March 30. If you or anyone you know needs a place to come for a *seder*, please let me know.

Walt and I wish you a joyous and *zissen* Pesach!

February Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, February 12th, 2018. New President Fay Halpern Schildkraut opened the meeting with her vision for TBS, to increase membership, maintain our outreach efforts and enhance our Temple building. Lee Temares reviewed the fundamentals of Robert's Rules of Order.

Financial Secretary Gail Olenick reported our current membership is 119 family units. The January Financial Report was accepted by the Board as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz.

Rabbi Ballan welcomed the new Board of Trustees. She thanked Cantor Korobow for the well-attended Gospel Shabbat – we had over 100 participants, not including the St. John's Gospel Choir. She also thanked Cantor for reviving the Adult Choir. She and Cantor are thinking of alternative times to have Tot Shabbat, due to declining attendance. The Torah scroll we use for Rosh Hashanah has been sent out for repair. Cantor Korobow thanked all who participated in the Gospel Shabbat and relayed how much the Voices of Victory singers enjoyed and appreciated the experience. They have said they'd like to return. He shared many great ideas for future musically themed services and fund raisers, but cautioned that we need to coordinate carefully with the overall TBS building calendar.

The Pulpit and Ritual Committee has requested the Board consider allocation of funds for Organist (Maestro David Close) to play one service per month. The Board will be considering this opportunity. Past President Adam Gandelman reported the Queens Herald Summer program will return this August and there will be a new mixed-martial arts class held in the building on Tuesdays.

Jim Kettig updated the Board on the recent outcome of the City Hearing regarding Cooling Tower issues. At this time, all requested items have been addressed. Sisterhood, Men's Club, and Parents Association Presidents (Barbara Gandelman, Jeff Cohen, and Erica Bernstein, respectively) reported recent and upcoming events. Several potential fund raiser events were presented by Ways and Means Committee Chair Barry Packer, and new Trustee Deirdre Weliky presented on the goals and focus of the Caring Committee.





Scoop's Schmooze

The date was January 27th, 1945 and the Red Army liberated the Auschwitz and Birkenau concentration camps.

The date was January 27th, 1973 and the Vietnam Peace Treaty was signed, ending the Vietnam War.

The date was January 27th, 1962 and I was born, given the name Barry Steven Packer and the Hebrew name, Baruch Shalom. How ironic that I come into the world with the name that translates to "Blessed Peace" on the same day as those two iconic events that almost 30 years apart helped bring peace to the world.

The date was January 27th, 2005 and the United Nations General Assembly designated this date as International Holocaust Remembrance Day.

The date was January 27th, 2018 and as the calendar turned from the 26th to the 27th, Temple Beth Sholom of Flushing was just concluding its first Gospel Shabbat Services with the united effort of the TBS Choir and the St. John's University Voices of Victory Gospel Choir; where peace and joy, happiness, compassion and love were felt throughout the entire building by the more than 100 people who were there--listening and admiring, singing and dancing, totally enamored by everything taking place.

This also happened to be the Shabbat, 43 years ago, that I became a bar mitzvah with, ironically, the longest haftarah portion of the year. And in the haftarah for *Beshallach* (Judges 5:9) it says: "Libi l'chok'kei Yisrael hamitnad'vim ba-am barchu Adonai."

That phrase translates to: My heart is toward the lawgivers of Israel that offered themselves willingly among the people, (saying,) 'Bless the Lord.'

So, as this portion, in a way, speaks of giving one's heart to Israel, there is another bit of irony that this column is due to Michelle the day before Valentine's Day. And, while, for the most part, it is a non-religious holiday that is known more for its commercialized stature of romance and cards, chocolates and flowers, stuffed animals and perfume; as we all know, its symbol is that of the heart.

However, it is not necessary to give of one's heart only on that day. And, giving of one's heart is not just by purchasing a gift or a card; nor is giving one's heart to someone else just limited to a husband or wife, boyfriend or girlfriend, parent or sibling, spouse or partner. Right here in our very own Temple Beth Sholom, there are so many people who we spend time with, who we talk to, who we laugh with and cry with, who we look out for--and who in turn do the same for

us. Because so many of these actions take place so frequently, and while they are so natural and commonplace, it is so important that they are not taken for granted and for each of us to realize that when we make a phone call or pay a visit, send a message or write a note, engage in a handshake or a hug, share a bowl of chicken soup, a pizza, an ice cream sundae or a glass of wine--we are actually sharing our hearts with one another.

And, the importance of the sharing of the heart between two people, and what the heart represents, is not relegated to February 14th. Quite the contrary. And, having done some extensive research, I am sure one might find it very interesting to see that there is actually medical proof that this exists and that this philosophy came from Dr. Andrew Freeman of National Jewish Health on the organization's website in a piece entitled *Why Do We Connect Love With The Heart?*

"Most heart doctors never talk about love. Why is love associated with the heart? Love and the heart go hand in hand. Data suggests people who have supportive connections in life - a spouse, a family member, or even a dog - they do better. They have fewer heart attacks. They survive heart attacks better. Believe it or not, there is an emerging field of science showing the heart-love connection."

So, take some time every day to share your heart with at least one other person from your family, from your group of friends, from our TBS family. Know that each day, with every connection that contains even the smallest of interactions, your heart gets bigger and bigger. And, it means that that person's day on the receiving end just got a whole lot better.


For as Rabbi Ballan wrote in her weekly message on the day of the Gospel Shabbat Service, called *It's HowYou Look At It*, "sometimes we are so focused on the details, that we never look up and see the miracles surrounding us. Maybe we will never experience a miracle such as the parting of a sea, but there are small miracles all around us. All it takes is slowing down and opening our eyes in order to see them."

And, may we all share at least two daily miraclesthe compassion of our hearts with one another every day and to be blessed with the translation of my Hebrew name forever.


