From the Rabbi's desk

On the heels of Sukkot and Simchat Torah, the Jewish month of *Cheshvan* gives us a break from holidays, which is why our rabbis and sages refer to it as "*Marcheshvan*," or sad Cheshvan—there are no Jewish holidays at all in this entire month!

On the secular calendar, since the holidays were over by October 1, I would say that October should be "Mar October!" But seriously, the most important holiday on the Jewish calendar occurs every week, and that is Shabbat. We also start reading the Torah from the beginning again, and that is always exciting. After everything is over, after we have made amends and have forgiven, we start fresh. It is a little ironic that at the same time we are learning about creation and re-birth, outside the leaves are turning colors, and the earth is getting ready for the dormant winter. Maybe that is intentional. Life and death are always around us, reminding us how fragile life is.

We don't need to wait for the High Holidays for renewal, however. Each day gives us an opportunity. Our daily prayers begin with a blessing for the renewal of our souls. "Elohai neshamah, shenata bi t'hora hi. My God, the soul you have given me is pure. We wake up with a clean slate, and another chance. In a midrash from Tanna devei Eliyahu Zuta (1:5) we learn, "Every day a

person is formed by God, every day a person is born; every day a person lives, every day a person dies; every day a person's soul is taken from them (during sleep) and deposited with the soul's True Owner; every day a person is fed out of the fruit of their deeds, just as the infant is fed out of their mother's breast."

One of the ways I experience renewal is by learning new things. There are many possibilities for learning here at Sholom. Temple Beth encourage you to join us for another year of Chai Mitzvah learning. This year we will be exploring *mussar*, a Jewish path of character development and spiritual growth leading to wisdom. awareness. and transformation. The first class begins on Wednesday, October 3 at 8 pm and meet once a month. No Hebrew or prior Jewish education is necessary, just an open mind.

September Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Thursday, September 6th, 2018. President Fay Halpern Schildkraut opened the meeting with update on A/C repairs to be ready for next summer and announcement that Ballroom Dancing will restart on Wed, September 26th, from 7:00–8:00 p.m. Gail Olenick, Financial Secretary, reported that we have 119 member units; \$23,000 still owed. A letter was sent to families with children in Religious/Sunday School that School Dues are due by registration on September 16th, 2018.

The August financial report was approved by the Board as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz. Cantor Jerry Korobow reported the recent Selichot Service went well but with a low turnout; he recommends trying to find other congregations to team up with, as this is a common issue among temples at Selichot. Shirathon will be held Sunday, October 28th at the Flushing-Fresh Meadows Jewish Center. After discussion regarding the number of special events in late October/early November, it was decided to postpone the Jazz Shabbat on November 2nd to a later date. He and Karen Feit have coordinated dates for events with the religious school.

Rabbi Ballan reported she and the Cantor are looking forward to inspiring High Holy Day Services. Sukkot falls on Sunday evening, September 23rd —join us for Pizza in the Sukkah. She is planning on going to Main Street on that Sunday afternoon to buy Lulavs and if anyone wants to join her, let her know.

The following Sunday, September 30th is Simchat Torah. Watch for e-mails for the upcoming Chai Mitzvah program. Pulpit & Ritual Committee Chair Geri Weiss thanked Rabbi for the Selichot service-about 30 attended. She requested to all committees when planning an event with food – please arrange for the food to be either dairy or meat, not a combination of both.

The Board approved 4 new family units: Debra Leffe, Laura Goldsmith, Sharon Miller, and Salena and Jason Ehrlich and son Damon. Parent's Association, Men's Club, and Sisterhood all reported on upcoming events. Jim Kettig, House Committee Chair, reported on updates concerning the air conditioning and replacement to the front entry mats.

Eric Bernstein, Adult Education Chair, reported Game Night (for adults) will be returning on the 2nd Wednesday of the month with the exception of October, (Tuesday, October 16th). He has scheduled a two part lecture by Paul Rabinowitz (Founder and Executive Director of Arts by the People) on Sunday, October 21st at 10:00 a.m. - *Jews of Catalonia, Spain* and on Sunday, October 28th at 10:00 a.m. - *Origins of Jewish Cuisine.*

Barry Packer, Ways & Means Committee Chair reported on plans concerning the Chicken Soup Cook-Off to be held on November 10th, from 6:30–9:00 p.m. The Vendor Showcase, scheduled for Wednesday, Oct. 24th from 4:00–9:00 p.m., has 8 vendors expressing interest. A Cabaret Night will be held on Saturday, November 3rd, from 7:00–9:00 p.m. to include snacks and drinks, followed by Renee Katz's show. VP Joy Bobrow, Bazaar Committee Co-Chair, reported on plans concerning Bazaar.







Scoop's Schmooze

Long before I knew there was a company that was represented by a smiling stick figure named Jake, created in Boston by the Jacobs brothers, and shortly after that business was founded, while I was on vacation in Aruba, a person by the name of Rafi Maduro would say to me at least once a day three prophetic words that are also the name of that company--- "Life Is Good." And while life is good, unfortunately, it can also be difficult and painful, frustrating, heartbreaking and unexplainable.

And, as these high holy days are upon us, and in particular this Day of Atonement, where we pause to reflect on this past year of 5778, and all of the others that came before, and look forward to 5779, I took the opportunity to dwell on the past and gaze ahead as we were visiting my family in Boston just before the holidays. I went to the cemetery with my parents and visited my mother's parents, my father's parents and my aunt and uncle, all who are located in the same general area of Sharon Memorial Park, in a triangular formation with 27 steps in between each of the three couples' plagues; which, ironically is one of these unique instances that seemingly happen to take place quite often in Judaism, as my sister and I were both born on the 27th of the month. I sat and "talked" with these six people who were some of the greatest influences and role models in my life, and tried to get their sage words of advice and find out why life's things happen as they do.

Could they explain why in exactly a three-week span, our country lost icons Aretha Franklin, John McCain, Neil Simon, and Burt Reynolds. They were some of the greats of the great.

Or could they tell me how Bill Becker, Joel Dubrow, David Fransman, and Murt Gruber were also lost in a four-week time frame from the middle of August to the beginning of September. You may wonder who these four men are, as they are names that I am fairly sure are not known here, yet they touch me in a deep emotional sense. You see, all four of these men were the fathers of people who I grew up with; some of our friendships starting as young as kindergarten and first grade to junior high school, along with my college roommate who is still one of the best friends I have ever had.

The thing is, I am truly blessed that at 56, while so many of my friends my age have lost parents, I not only have one father and mother, but I have two of each; who are all doing relatively well. After recovering from her medical issues last year, my mother-in-law Rose is back playing the piano and walking. My 93 year-old father-in-law, Isidore has grown giant butternut squash that are hanging from the trellis at their Fresh Meadows home; waiting to be harvested and donated to Temple for bazaar. My mother at 80 still teaches ballet and takes lessons twice a week, while my father, also at 80, became a paraprofessional in the local school system, because after more than 50 years as a pharmacist, he couldn't stay retired. So, you can see that God has indeed blessed me like nobody else.

And, on top of all of that, is there anybody luckier than me who has so much gratitude for the so many awe-inspiring members of my extended family who reside here at Temple Beth Sholom. Whether it is the warmth of the services, the excitement of the special events, the pride of our congregation's longevity, or the compassionate camaraderie that exists day in and day out, what takes place here is beyond compare.

However, in digressing, even as a writer, I found it quite difficult to find the words to console my friends. So, I asked my grandparents and aunt and uncle to help me find the words that would best comfort the four of them. And they did.

I hope that they are surrounded and enveloped by their family and friends. I hope that they are warmed by the memories that they created with their fathers, and the rest of their family, and they will all last a lifetime. For even though none of them had their names in neon lights; they were all icons in the hearts and minds of my four friends.

And, as we prepare to honor and memorialize those special people who have left us with our Yizkor service tomorrow, may we all be comforted by those treasured memories that will always be cherished and ingrained in our hearts and minds that nobody can take from us.

Actually, one of those special memories came to my mind as I was reading Newsday last week when I saw the recent obituary of Mrs. Jean Baron. Mrs. Baron was the founder and owner of Long Island Business Institute; where I worked for her from 2003-2005, when she was about 70 years old. On most days, when I was getting ready to leave, it would make no difference if it was 3:00 in the afternoon or 9:00 at night; if I saw her before I was leaving, she would look at me and say, "But, the night is still young and beautiful... and so am I...and so are you."

And, as I look out at everybody here; it doesn't matter if it is the unbridled exuberance of the youth of Temple Beth Sholom, the worldly experience and knowledge of those who have paved the way for us and still live life to the fullest, or everybody in between, we ARE all young and we ARE all beautiful.

So as I wish you an easy and meaningful fast and a wonderful 5779, please remember that no matter the challenges we overcome, the heartache or heartbreak we go through, and the disappointment or the discouragement we endure; whether we are related or not, we all are united as one family and... Life IS good.


