### From the Rabbi's desk

"Ben Bag Bag taught: 'Turn it, turn it, for everything is in it.'" [*Pirkei Avot* 5:24]

This is a favorite verse of mine from Pirkei Avot, the "Ethics of our Fathers," and not just because of the funny name of the rabbi to whom it is attributed. (Ben Bag Bag, also known as Yochanan ben Bag Bag, lived in the first century B.C.E in Palestine and was a student of Hillel. He is thought to have been a convert to Judaism.) I love this verse, because Ben Bag Bag is referring to the Torah. Some translate the verse: "Study it and review it-you will find everything in it. Scrutinize it, grow old and gray in it; do not depart from it. There is no better portion in life than this."

It means to me, that no matter how many times you read the Torah, you can always find something new. There is always something to learn. Torah however does not only mean the Five Books of Moses, the Bible, or even the Torah scroll itself, but can refer to all of Jewish tradition and learning. The word "Torah" itself means "teaching."

Formal learning may not be for everyone. It might seem daunting to start a regular practice of Torah study, especially

if we are long past our school days. But I encourage you take on a new mitzvah this year: Join us at TBS and engage in some learning; it's not just for our children. We have a lot to offer— Adult Education lectures. movies and breakfasts; Sisterhood's Book Clubs and our monthly Chai Mitzvah Class. And of course, every Saturday morning at 10 am we have a very lively Torah discussion group. There is no for anv previous knowledge of Torah or Hebrew; just come with an open mind, one that is willing to engage with the text. There is no commitment to come every week, just drop in when you can. In addition to learning Torah, we learn even more from each other!

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, October 8th, 2018. Gail Olenick, Financial Secretary reported that we have 123 member units; \$17,200 in membership dues still outstanding.

Rabbi Sharon Ballan reported on well attended and inspiring High Holiday services; 60 people attended the Sukkot services with fewer in attendance for Simchat Torah. Chai Mitzvah Classes are resuming with 12 members including some returning participants. Cantor Jerry Korobow echoed Rabbi's thoughts regarding recent High Holiday services. He and Rabbi and President Schildkraut all spoke in glowing terms about the recent addition of David Close on the keyboard. He will join us the first Friday of the month and all are urged to come enjoy those musical services.



Our Temple is vibrant and we are jammed packed with exciting events coming up in the next three months.

#### Men's Club


The annual Men's Club service will be on Friday, November 9th at 8:00 p.m. It is also the anniversary of "Kristallnacht," the night when Nazis in Germany torched synagogues, vandalized Jewish homes, schools and businesses and killed nearly 100 Jews. The service will touch on those sad events.

The annual Veteran's Day breakfast follows two days later on Sunday, November 11th. We will be serving a complimentary breakfast and honoring veterans with a screening of the movie "GI Jews". The documentary tells the true story of the 550,000 Jewish Americans in World War II in their own words. Veterans both famous (director Mel Brooks, former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger) and unknown share their war experiences: how they fought for their nation and people, struggled with anti-Semitism within their ranks, and emerged transformed.

Men's Club hosts monthly bowling sessions at Jib Lanes in Flushing, the first Thursday of every month at 8:00 p.m. For \$15, you get two games of bowling, free shoe rental, and the opportunity to interact with members of the congregation – bowling is not restricted to men's club membership. The next two bowling sessions are Thursday, November 1st and Thursday, December 6th.



#### Scoop's Schmooze

Nes Gadol Hayah Sham—"A Great Miracle Happened There".

Now, I am sure we are all aware that this term is, for all intents and purposes, associated with Chanukah, and even though Chanukah is very early this year at the very beginning of December, it is still more than a month away. However, for the purpose of this piece, please allow me to reflect back a couple of weeks to another holiday—Sukkot; which actually is tied to Chanukah. You see, during the war, Sukkot, which was the biggest holiday at that time could not be celebrated by the Jews. When the Maccabees cleaned and purified the Temple, they decided to celebrate with a lulav and etrog for eight days starting on the 25th of Kislev. Today we still say Hallel and light candles every night to commemorate this event.

On September 23<sup>rd</sup>, with Temple Beth Sholom's sukkah constructed in about an hour or two by Jeff and Eric and Eric, the annual Pizza in the Hut celebration was just ahead. Because of the uncertain weather on the horizon, the number of people to prepare for was left for speculation. Erica Bernstein and Elana White of the Parent's Association gave their best guestimates of how many people would be attending. And with clouds overhead, Jose's efforts of initially preparing for five dozen people, bringing out tables and chairs to set in the parking lot were a tall order. But, as usual, the call to him did not go unanswered.

And, as the people started filing in to the parking lot, there was the realization that we were going to need more tables and chairs. The skies started to gray a bit more. And, as Rabbi, Cantor and Karen stood in the doorway of the sukkah, with its roof covering of cornstalks, and conducted the service, with an enthusiastic gathering, the skies grayed even more; and the wind picked up slightly.

And, then as the service continued while the pizzas and salads were delivered from Cascarino's, to be set on the tables alongside all of the desserts, not only was there a need for even more places for people to sit, and not only did the cloud cover increase, but, it started to mist a bit. Yet, nobody left; except for those who went to their cars to get their umbrellas—and then came back to their seats. And, those who did not leave included the plethora of children who were there, the gathering of families and friends, along with so many others including the likes of Betty Zimmerman, who was so dedicated and happy, sitting in the rain with her umbrella, enjoying every minute.

As the service part of the event was starting with the lighting of the Sukkot candles, they actually stayed lit through the end of the Pizza in the Hut, when, for safety reasons, they had to be extinguished; as everybody was departing.

And, some might question as to what is the big deal. Because these candles stayed lit in the wind and in the rain, a great miracle happened there at our own Temple Beth Sholom. Was it the great miracle that so many people, young and old, came to this special event outside and stayed—eating and drinking, laughing, talking and singing, and helping each other out through the wind and rain and dropping temperatures? Or was it that if one is to look

against the fence at where the sukkah was, that from last year's covering that fell, that there is a giant cornstalk that grew in our parking lot?

Whatever the miracle was or is, we don't have to wait until Chanukah to know that a great miracle happened there at Temple Beth Sholom. For every day, whether it is the laughing together on a joyous occasion, the working with one another to make things happen at TBS or the comforting and consoling one another through the difficult times, the candles---whether they be the Shabbat candles, the holiday candles, the Havdallah candles, or the Ner Tamid—those lights in the Temple Beth Sholom family are always burning bright.






