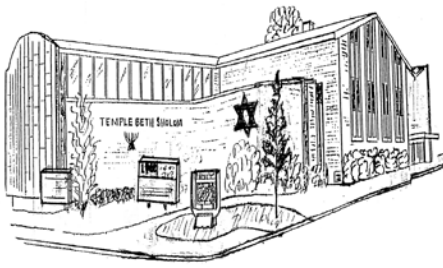

## From the Rabbi's desk

We begin this month with Shabbat Across America. Perhaps by the time you receive this edition of *The Voice*, it will already have taken place (I hope not!), since it falls on March 1<sup>st</sup>. This is always a special time at TBS as we celebrate together with our temple family. This year it coincides with the first of four special *parshiyot*, (Torah readings) that are tacked on to the regularly scheduled Torah readings during Adar, the last month of the Jewish calendar. The first of these portions, *Shabbat Shekalim*, is read on the Shabbat preceding Rosh Hodesh Adar (or Adar II in a leap year), which occurs this year on March 7<sup>th</sup>.

*Shabbat Shekalim* refers to the Torah portion taken from the beginning of *Ki Tisa* (Exodus 30:11-16). It refers to the half Shekel that each Israelite was to donate, in a sense acting as a census. Later, it became a tax given to the Temple in Jerusalem. We learn in the Mishnah "*On the first day of Adar they give warning of the Shekel dues. On the 15<sup>th</sup> thereof, they read the Megillah in walled cities (meaning the scroll of Esther); and repair the paths and roads and pools of water*" (Shekalim 1:1). Nowadays, it signals that we start to get ready for Passover.

The second special Shabbat in Adar is *Shabbat Zachor*, which always falls on the Shabbat before Purim. We read three verses from Deuteronomy, (25:17-19), a repetition of the account of the attack of Amalek, just after the children had left Egypt (Ex. 17:14-16). "*Remember what Amalek did to you on your journey, after you left Egypt—how, undeterred by fear of God, he surprised you on the march, when you were famished and weary, and cut down all the stragglers in your rear. Therefore, when the Eternal your God grants you*

*safety from all your enemies around you, in the land that the Eternal your God is giving you as a hereditary portion, you shall blot out the memory of Amalek from under heaven. Do not forget!"*

Amalek is said to be an ancestor of the evil Haman. We are also commanded to blot out Haman's name as well—with the noise of our graggers every time we hear his name during the Megillah reading. It's an interesting paradox: we are to blot out his name, yet never forget. What can this mean?

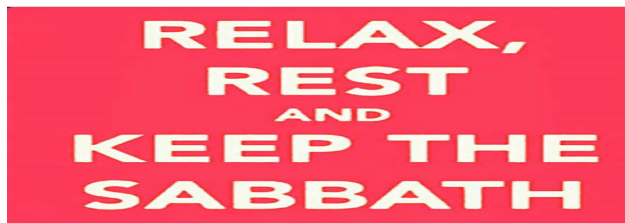
We learn in the *Iturei Torah* (Aharon-Ya'akov Greenberg, d. 1963): "If the community of Israel had not forgotten these stragglers, but rather, had brought them close under the wings of God's Presence in order to return them underneath the clouds of glory, that they would be together with all the house of Israel, then Amalek would not have overcome them and beaten them. But because these stragglers were left behind, that is, you let them be left behind and you forgot them... this is the forgetting. The people of Israel were "weary, tired and not God-fearing" and forgot these brothers and sisters so Amalek was able to cut them off. Therefore, the Torah commands us to remember Amalek. And with this, warned us never again to forget our brothers and sisters in need of support and help, keeping them within the camp. Never Forget." It is our responsibility to work to end oppression; to help the weakest among us.

Please don't forget our Purim Shpiel, on March 20<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. It is not too late to join the cast of "The Muppets Take Shushan: The Gonzo Megillah." We will have two or three rehearsals, please e-mail me if you would like to participate.

## February Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2019. President Fay Schildkraut welcomed new Board members. Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we have 122 member units. Charlene Metz, Treasurer, presented the January Financial Report, which was approved as presented.

Rabbi Sharon Ballan reported on recent and upcoming Purim service and events. She noted the passing of Past President Seymour Scharf and said he will be greatly missed. Tu B'Shevat seder last month was very well attended and enjoyable. Cantor Jerry Korobow reported David Close and Akiva "The Believer" Wharton will return to TBS as guest musicians for the March 1<sup>st</sup> Shabbat Across America Service and they wanted him to extend a thank you to congregants who have welcomed them so warmly.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit & Ritual Committee Chair submitted report that included information about plans for a special service for Yom HaShoah on May 3<sup>rd</sup> and progress on the new prayer book that Rabbi Ballan has been working on. Erica Bernstein, Parents' Association Co-President submitted report on the Purim Bingo event on March 10<sup>th</sup> and events scheduled later in the spring. Andrea Odintz, Religious School Board Chair, reported on upcoming Purim events.

President Fay Schildkraut reported the Membership Committee is busy making plans for Shabbat Across America and the Purim Ball. Barbara Gandelman, Sisterhood President, submitted report on the next Book Club scheduled in May. They will be reading "The Girl Who Wrote in Silk" by Kelli Estes. Jim Kettig, House Committee Chair, updated the Board on his efforts to get bids for Ballroom window work. Joy Bobrow submitted report on Use of Building, Ballroom is now booked through Nov. 2019, summer camp is returning in July and part of August. The Board voted unanimously to approve a one-year contract with Cantor Jerry Korobow for the contract year starting July 1<sup>st</sup> to be presented to the Congregation at the May Congregational Meeting to vote to ratify it.

Jeff Cohen, Men's Club President, reported they are donating \$250.00 proceeds from the Super bowl pool. They are co-hosting a summer baseball game in June (stay tuned) and he reported 2,400 books have been pre-sorted for Bazaar 2019. Deirdre Weliky, Caring Committee Chair, reported on their efforts to create awareness of mitzvah opportunities to drive non-drivers to and from services and other Temple events. Barry Packer, Ways & Means Committee Chair, reported on wrap up activities pertaining to the Chicken Soup Cook-Off and offered good ideas for publicity utilizing the video clips of major TBS events to date. Eric Bernstein, Adult Education, reported on change in time for Game Day and March Breakfast and Movie plans. He added that Men's Club had ordered a case (36) of Yom HaShoah Candles from the FJMC and working on figuring out how to distribute them. Yom HaShoah is Wednesday evening, May 1<sup>st</sup>. Temple will be having their service on Friday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Monthly bowling sessions continue at Jib Lanes in Flushing, the second Thursday of every month (through June) at 8:00 p.m. For \$15.00, you get two games of bowling, free shoe rental, and the opportunity to interact with members of the congregation. Bowling is not restricted to men's club members. The next two bowling sessions are Thursday, March 14<sup>th</sup> and Thursday, April 11<sup>th</sup>.

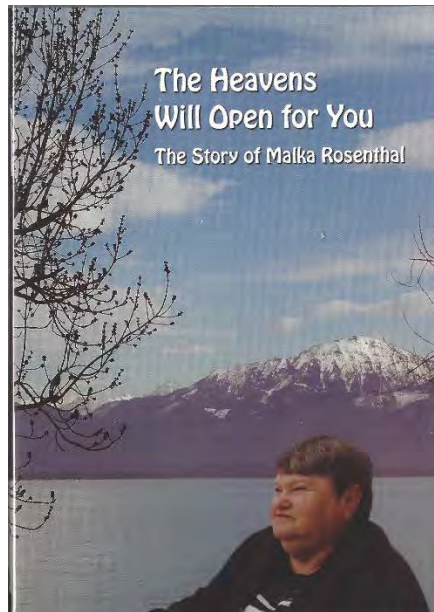

## Scoop's Schmooze

What is in a name and what is in a number?

The day was Sunday, January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2019. As “my” New England Patriots had beaten the Kansas City Chiefs the week before to clinch their spot in Super Bowl LIII; and there was the usual two-week respite between the Conference Championships and the Super Bowl, it was a quiet Sunday morning. With no real football on that day, I was reading Sunday’s Newsday and flipping through the television channels when I stopped at New York 1.

There, in honor of International Holocaust Remembrance Day, Cheryl Wills was interviewing 85 year-old Brighton Beach Holocaust survivor Toby Eisenstein. She spoke of hiding for years in a small backyard barn, living off of livestock and day-old bread and her family being among the 31 total survivors in Chodorov before making it to the American Zone, and then to the United States following the war. And, because of when these horrific events took place, the number of survivors in 2019 continues to shrink, as according to the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, the Registry of Holocaust Survivors currently totals 195,000. Yet, to listen to Toby’s words, or to see the determination and motivation of my father-in-law, Isidore, and his brother, Frank, both who are survivors in their nineties; and to know the pride they get from being Jewish and for the state of Israel, it is all so inspirational.

As were the words from the Patriots’ Julian Edelman, who became the first Jewish Most Valuable Player in the history of the Super Bowl, when New England beat the Los Angeles Rams the following Sunday.

After the game, ESPN’s Sal Paolantonio asked Edelman how he felt about earning the MVP award. “It sounds crazy, it sounds crazy. 2018. L’Chaim!” he responded. What’s in a number? The 2018 National Football League season that culminated with the Patriots’ Super Bowl Championship and L’Chaim. L’Chaim—To Life.

While the phrase was used by Julian Edelman following the Super Bowl, let’s bring it back a week earlier to that Cheryl Wills interview of Toby Eisenstein to commemorate International Holocaust Remembrance Day. However, that was not the only event that makes that date stand out.

January 27<sup>th</sup> is also the day that in 1945 the Soviet 322<sup>nd</sup> Rifle Division liberated those who remained at Auschwitz-Birkenau. It was the date in 1973 that the Paris Peace Accords officially ended the Vietnam War. In 1944, on January 27<sup>th</sup>, the Siege of Leningrad was lifted. It was the day in 1967 that the United States, the Soviet Union and the United Kingdom signed the Outer Space Treaty, which banned deployment of nuclear weapons in space.

And along with the likes of Mozart, Mikhail Baryshnikov Lewis Carroll, and William Randolph Hearst, Jr., January 27<sup>th</sup> is the date of my birthday. Me—Barry Steven Packer; or in Hebrew, Baruch Shalom—translated to Blessed Peace.

So, I ask once again, *what is in a name and what is in a number?* Actually, quite a lot.
