# From the Rabbi's desk

As I am writing this, it is only mid-May. It is hard to believe that it summer is almost here and we are winding down the year and planning for the next.

Shavuot, the last of our three major Jewish festivals, occurs this month on Sunday, June 9th. Another name for Shavuot is Z'man Mattan *Torateinu*, the time of the giving of our Torah. The Torah, our most precious and sacred possession is at the heart of Shavuot. We also read the book of Ruth. Last month, I had the privilege of joining the Women's Discussion group, where we talked about the book of Ruth. particularly focusing women's relationships. Naomi and Ruth developed a special bond as they struggled through poverty widowhood together, ultimately finding redemption. The book of Ruth is linked to Shavuot for a number of reasons. First, it takes place during the barley harvest, about the same time as Shavuot. Second, we see Ruth, a Moabite woman choose Naomi's family and Judaism. She becomes the first "convert." Shavuot celebrates the Israelites' receiving the Torah at Mount Sinai. We get the opportunity to personally accept the Torah and reconfirm our commitment to Judaism. What is not obvious in the connection between Ruth and Shavuot is the Book of Ruth's focus on chesed, or lovingkindness. Chesed seems to be missing the story of the Ten Commandments, but we see it in Ruth's kindness towards Naomi and Boaz's kindness to Ruth. Perhaps this intentional, pointing out the importance of doing *a'milut chasadim*,

acts of loving-kindness that are implicit in the Torah.

There are many opportunities for *g'milut chasadim* at TBS. Our religious school students made over 100 sandwiches and lunch bags for the Corona Men's Self-help Center last month for Mitzvah Day. *Kol hakavod!* Consider offering a ride to Temple to someone who isn't able to drive, or donate to our food and toiletries drive. Visit someone who is ill, or pay a condolence call to someone in mourning.

Finally, it's a mitzvah to make a minyan! Please join us for Yikzor & Shavuot services in the Frank S. Greene Room on June 9th at 10:00 a.m. Celebrate Shabbat with our Religious School students on June 14th. They will help lead services and hold their closing exercises that Sisterhood will lead evening. services and install their officers on June 21st. Our "last" Shabbat service before the summer will take place in Little Bay Park on June 28th at 6:30 p.m. Bring a picnic dinner and share some desserts with us.

#### May Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, May 13th, 2019. President Fay Schildkraut reported on progress toward arrangements with Temple Gates of Prayer and briefly outlined the lengthy process involved. There will be no disruption to our calendar events. She reported on progress by the Security Committee which is working on evacuation procedures.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we now have 121 member units. The Board approved the April Financial Report as presented by Treasurer, Charlene Metz. Rabbi Sharon Ballan reported on recent services and Mitzvah Day events and thanked all who participated. Cantor Jerry Korobow reported the last Musical Shabbat will be on June 7th. They both also reported that copyright permissions for the new prayer book have been favorable.

Erica Bernstein. Parents' Association President. reported the PA bake sale made \$125.00 to be donated for use by the Religious School. They are working on organizing a Defensive Driving Event for August, pending confirmation. They are still waiting for good weather to do the Mitzvah Day planting and Religious Service Burial. 

#### Scoop's Schmooze

After the Ten Plagues, we all know that Moses was selected by God to lead the Jewish people out of Egypt and across the Red Sea, to the base of Mount Sinai, where he received the Ten Commandments. But, why Moses? On askMoses.com, Rabbi Ari Shishler says "Moses, as a perfect Jewish leader, was the icon of humility."

Humility—Humble. Modest. Unpretentious. They are qualities that speak so highly of those who possess them. And, on this Passover, as we drove four hours to Boston before reciting the Ten Plagues, instead of wandering for 40 years in the desert after them; it was then when I came across multiple depictions of humility that I always knew were there, but want to share those observations of others.

Before we got to my parents, we stopped at a florist in the town I grew up in. My father owned a pharmacy in Randolph for over 30 years before working for Walgreen's for another 23 years. As I was talking with the shop's owner, Laurie, whose husband's mother was a longtime customer of my father's; she said her mother-in-law, Pat, who died eight years ago, said my father "was the kindest, most unbelievable person." When he went to Walgreen's, whenever she called for *anything*, she would *only* talk to my father.

And, talking is what my 14 year-old niece does quite well—to everyone on the softball field. Madison, who as a freshman in high school has all A's and one B in the classroom, is also one of the best 14 year-old softball players in a town where that sport is a religion. This season, on the freshman team, she has 24 hits in 26 times at bat; to go along with being selected in the top three out of more than 50 players for her summer travel team. On the night before Passover, I went to see one of her games, and watched as she had a couple of hits, scored twice, stole a base or two, and played stellar defense. And about modesty, every time she was up, she would hold casual conversations with the opposing catcher and the umpire, who, knowing my niece's personality, after one of her teammates was hit by a pitch joked about Madison, "if it was 'Mad Dawg' who was hit, I would have called it a strike." As she made her way around the bases, the Mayor of Taunton Softball talked with each person at every base. And then more of that humbleness shone through the next night at the Seder when, before she "found" the afikomen under the tablecloth, my sister (her mother), secretly told her where it was. When my dad went to give her the money for finding it, she politely pushed it away and said she couldn't take it because Elana told her.

And, that was also around the same time in the Seder that my brother-in-law's mother, Gail, who had never met my mother and father-in-law, said that based on the person who she has gotten to know over the years in Renee, her parents, Isidore and Rose, must be the most wonderful of people.

My father, my niece, my in-laws—whether it has been built up with a reputation and integrity over decades, or but a few years, I am proud to say that on Passover and through the year, just like Moses; they all are icons of humility.




