From the Rabbi's desk

As I write this, we have just finished the holiday of Tisha B'Av. Tisha B'Av commemorates the destruction of the 1st and 2nd Temples in Jerusalem. The book of Lamentations is chanted in a special melody or trope, and there is a 25hour fast. Reform Jews haven't had a strong connection with this holiday. Many, like me, have a 'love-hate' relationship with it. It is a sad day in history; however without the fall of the Temple, Judaism as it is practiced today would not exist. This year, a consortium of Jewish social action groups, led by "T'ruah: The Rabbinic Call for Human Rights" and including the Reform movement's Religious Action Center, heard the call of United We Dream, the largest immigrant youth-led community in the country, who asked allies to take action to close immigrant detention camps. This year, Tisha B'Av had new meaning for us. This year, we not only mourned for our historic losses, but also for all the immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers who are suffering in these camps. I am proud that TBS held its first ever Tisha B'Av service where we heard the moving stories of eye-witnesses. We chanted, sang and prayed together. It was very inspiring. Sometimes prayer can move us to action. I hope that this small act of protest and solidarity will make a difference, and that we will make this service a new TBS tradition.

The shabbatot following Tisha B'Av include prophetic readings that are meant to console us and lead us to prepare for the High Holy Days, and the promise of reconciliation.

This year, the Jewish and secular calendars coincide this month, as the first day of Elul and September fall on the same day. That means that we have the entire month of September to prepare as we celebrate Rosh Hashanah on Sunday evening, September 29. Prayer, or T'fillah is one way to for us to prepare ourselves.

I am pleased that we can now prepare and pray with our very first TBS prayer book, Siddur Beit Shalom. We will formally dedicate it and start using it on Friday, September 6th. It took a lot of work and time, but I think that it was well worth the wait! I thank everyone on the committee who helped proofread and all those angels who made it possible. I hope you will join us for Family Shabbat Services at 7:30 pm and the special dedication.

August Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, August 12th 2019. President Fay Schildkraut reported Temple Gates of Prayer has agreed to share space with us while their new synagogue is under construction. They are waiting for approval from the State Attorney General and will be letting us know when that happens. She reported on progress by the Security Committee which is working on evacuation procedures.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary reported that we now have 120 member units. The Board approved the July Financial Report as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz.

Rabbi Sharon Ballan reported on recent services. She presented the new siddur, which will be dedicated on Friday, September 6th.

Cantor Jerry Korobow reported on High Holiday plans; David Close will be joining us for at least 6 services and "Akiva the Believer" for at least 3 services.

Pulpit and Ritual Committee reported they thanked all Lay summer service leaders and said the 7:30 pm start time was well received.

Selichot services will be on Saturday September 21st at Temple Tikvah of New Hyde Park beginning with dinner at 5:30pm, followed by a short program, and a service at 8:00pm.

Parents' Association, Sisterhood and Men's Club provided reports on upcoming meetings and summer events that were held, as did the Religious School Board. Jeff Cohen reported 11,275 books sorted - as well as several thousand mixed media items.

Barry Packer reported on the Chicken Soup Cook-Off planning progress and that he and Eric Bernstein are completing a video project to show off during upcoming Open House Membership Events.

The Board approved new member Marissa Ruffus and her young family.

Social Action Committee Chair Ilyne Rabinowitz reported on planned Get Out the Vote events and emphasized that the Committee and TBS do not endorse or support specific candidates.





Moses, King David, Anne Frank, Louis Brandeis, Maimonides, Marc Chagall, Judas Maccabeus, George Gershwin, Steven Spielberg, Barbara Streisand, Ralph Lauren, Jonas Salk, Henrietta Szold, Albert Einstein, Sandy Koufax, Red Auerbach. This is just a small portion of the list of the 'Top 144 Heroes of the Jewish People', released by the Israeli Museum in May of 2016.

So, what makes a hero or a role model? In 1993, when recording a commercial for Nike, Basketball Hall of Famer Charles Barkley said "I'm not a role model… Just because I dunk a basketball doesn't mean I should raise your kids."

My parents' kids (me and my sister) were raised by two of my heroes and role models. For not only do I bear a resemblance to them physically, and have taken on many aspects of their personalities, traits and beliefs, I so admire what I witnessed in the last couple of months. As many of you know, my mother took a very serious fall on July 2nd. And, we are so lucky that her physical capabilities of being a ballet dancer for almost her entire life have helped make her recovery show steady progress. But, for the past six weeks, my father, also my mother's lifelong partner of almost 60 years, has picked up the pieces and has done everything that she has done throughout their lives together to keep their daily routine going. What role models and heroes for me.

Just like my in-laws, Rose and Isidore. It has been almost three years since Rose spent about two months in the hospital and rehab getting a pacemaker. And, while it takes her longer to do things than before, always with that signature smile, she perseveres---as does my fatherin-law. Despite growing massive zucchinis, tomatoes and cucumbers in his garden, he has started to slow down. When we ran an errand the other day, I asked him if he wanted me to go in. In kind, he responded that he would take care of it and said "I'm never giving up." And that's why he was at Temple's Defensive Driving class last month. What role models and heroes for me.

Which obviously is where Renee gets her tenacity. For when she was the victim of the much-publicized horrific incident 40 years ago, she said if her father could survive all of the atrocities of the Holocaust, she could survive what happened to her. And she has. What a role model and a hero for me.

For as one can see by Renee's comments when she was only 17 years old, role models do not have to be older. Case in point--my niece Madison, who will be 15 years old 14 minutes before 9/11. Last week as a C.I.T. at the day camp that she has gone to for seven years, one of her campers, a seven year-old girl, was having an epileptic seizure. Without hesitation, Madison, a star student-athlete, picked up the girl and ran in the direction of where she could get the best help the quickest. The following day the girl's mother called the camp to talk to Madison and thank her, through an interpreter, as she is an Israeli and was speaking When my parents praised Madison, she Hebrew. responded, "isn't that what everybody would do?" What a role model and hero for me-and how blessed we should all be to have heroes and role models like mine.






