From the Rabbi's desk

As I write this, the High Holidays have not yet arrived. By the time you receive this newsletter, we will be in the midst of the "asseret y'mei teshuvah" — the ten days of repentance between Rosh HaShannah and Yom Kippur. These days are also called Yamim Noraim, "Days of Awe." Why are they so awesome? Nowadays, "awesome" has come to mean "wonderful," "great," or "cool." But *nora* in Hebrew comes from the root meaning 'fear." In this context, awesome means frightening, fearsome or serious, because this is the time when God judges us. There is still time however, to change our fate. We do this with acts of teshuvah, (repentance), t'filah (prayer), and tzedakah (charity). Tzedakah (charity) is often thought of in monetary terms. Yet tzedakah comes from the root of the word tzedek, or justice. There are many ways to work for justice that do not require you to open your wallet. Tzedek is doing the right thing. Tzedek is treating others with dignity. When you communicate love. concern, support, and compassion, in a way you are practicing tzedek.

I would like to encourage you to practice this version of *tzedek* at TBS. We can even make it easy for you. Participate in our "Lift Someone Up" program. In the past few years the number of members who can no longer drive is increasing.

We need caring. compassionate members to offer a ride to synagogue. Most likely, there is someone very close by and you don't even have to go out of your way. Please e-mail me at rabbi@templebethsholom.org or Deirdre Weliky, our Caring Committee chairwoman dwangel1@gmail.com and we will match you up with someone close by. You don't have to commit to every week; just once in a while is more than enough.

Another way to practice tzedek is to use the opportunity to continue to donate to our Temple Beth Sholom food bank. We will be providing paper bags during the High Holidays. Please fill these bags with unopened, unexpired non-perishable food items and toiletries and place them in the marked container that will be outside the sanctuary.

Finally, I would like to remind you that I am once again offering the wonderful Chai Mitzvah program of guided and self-directed learning. This year's topic will be the Ten Commandments. We meet monthly; check your emails for dates.

Walter and I wish all of you a sweet and healthy New Year!

September Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, September 9th, 2019 after President Fay Schildkraut led an evacuation drill and discussion of steps to take during an active shooter event. Additional drills will be rolled out as part of new security measures. President Fav Schildkraut reported the new air conditioner in the Library has been fully paid for, in part due to donations by The Flushing Jewish Community Council (Paul Engel), Geri Weiss and David Chenkin and the 2019 Chai Mitzvah class. Justin and Seth White donated the money raised through their Mitzvah Project to the Building Fund,

Jeff Cohen, whose term as Men's Club President had expired, has agreed to remain in office until January. Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we now have 121 member units. The Board approved the August Financial Report as submitted by Treasurer Charlene

Rabbi Sharon Ballan reported on recent services. She circulated a signup sheet for Board members who may be able to give a lift to specific members unable to attend services due to lack of transportation. Cantor Jerry Korobow reported on recent and upcoming services and he has arranged for a Jazz Service on November 1st. He requested all who wish to sing that evening as part of the Choir please contact him.

Pulpit and Ritual Committee reported High Holiday honors are set. Book plates for the new siddurim can be purchased for \$36.00 in honor or memory of someone.

Parents' Association, Sisterhood, and Men's Club provided reports on upcoming meetings and events. Religious School Board Committee Chair Andrea Odintz reported on the new school year events and that there are currently 21 students with more students possibly scheduled to enroll.

The Board approved new member Susan Druss.

Social Action Committee Chair Ilyne Rabinowitz reported they will address immigration reform issues as part of their next meeting agenda. House committee chair Jim Kettig reported renovations to the Women's bathroom are in progress. Ways and Means committee chair Barry Packer reported on progress in plans for the November Chicken Soup Cook-Off, an informational video loop he and Eric Bernstein have been compiling, as well as the spring cabaret performance planned by Renee Katz.

Bazaar is in need of volunteers and merchandize, as well as people willing to make pick-ups. There are now 12,375 pre-sorted books.



How Can I Contribute to TBS without Spending?





Cantor's Corner

HELP WANTED! I need energetic and enthusiastic choir members for Temple Beth Sholom's volunteer choir which will sing for Jazz Shabbat on November 1st.

During my tenure here at Temple, in past editions of this column, I've encouraged you to become involved. I've suggested joining a committee, volunteering to work on a Temple project, or joining Sisterhood or Men's Club. These are all wonderful opportunities to get to know fellow congregants, and to contribute to the community.

Now, I want to focus on the volunteer choir we're putting together for our Jazz Shabbat service on Friday, November 1st. Our musical guests that evening will include Maestro David Close on keyboard. We'll also be joined by a marvelous trio of professional jazz musicians on keys, bass and drums. But we are the ones who have to provide the sung Hebrew prayers that are the backbone of the service. You may recall the wonderful job our ad hoc choir did at our Gospel Shabbat service in January of 2018. Here's another opportunity to sing out!

We need you (both adults and children) to sing with us. Neither experience nor ability to read music is required. Most of the material you already know-prayers and tunes from our regular Friday evening service. We'll just "jazz them up" a bit.

We're not looking for a long-term commitment - just for folks to participate in this one event. We'll have three or four rehearsals so that everyone can feel comfortable and prepared (October dates are reflected in the Voice calendar). Don't worry if you can't make every rehearsal-we still want you. I promise rehearsals will be fun!

Over the years, lots of people have told me that they love music, but they can't sing. Forget about that - come and join us for what promises to be a fun-filled and inspirational Shabbat experience to which we have invited the entire community. Scoop's Schmooze

As I was sitting and putting pen to paper for this edition of Scoop's Schmooze, it was the morning of September 11th 2019; the only commemoration of a day that doesn't need anything but numerals to be identified---9/11.

I was watching one of the many sobering specials on television that featured the alphabetical reading of the names of those who tragically perished on that late summer day of Tuesday, September 11th, 2001. Depending on which channel you were watching, as the names were read, the bottom of the screen scrolled by identifying the victims with their hometown, photos and age on that indelible day.

By the time the alphabet was only about one-third done, there were three people of the 2,977 victims who lost their lives to these senseless acts who I knew of or who I actually knew personally.

Garnet "Ace" Bailey, I observed from afar when he played hockey for the Boston Bruins when I was watching them as a child in the late 1960s and early 1970s, winning the Stanley Cup in 1970 and 1972. On 9/11, he was a scout for the Los Angeles Kings in Manchester, New Hampshire and was aboard United Airlines flight 175. Carlos Dominguez's wife, Maureen, was a member of the East Meadow New York Sports Club where I was the General Manager. Carlos had been an independent contractor for Marsh & McLennan for three years, became a permanent employee on September 10th, 2001 and wanted to be early on his first day as a regular worker. Michael Horn was from a traditional Irish family, worked for Cantor Fitzgerald and was the 27 year-old brother of my friend Christine. Often when I would see Michael, he would jokingly imitate his mother with an accomplished Irish brogue.

And, while I was watching the specials, I wondered how long it would have taken to list the names of the six million Jews lost in the Holocaust. While I knew three people from 9/11, more than that were taken from my father-in-law, Isidore, and his brother Frank; as they lost their mother Rivkah, sister Chavah and their two brothers Martin and Tibor in the senseless and heartless destruction of the Jewish people some 60 years before 9/11. I have been truly and honestly blessed to know other survivors and children of survivors. And, when one speaks of these horrors and atrocities, the most mindboggling thing in talking about the total devastation of both tragedies is that all of the people who tragically perished on 9/11 equal the alarming percentage of 0.000049616666 of the Jews who lost their lives in the Holocaust.

With all of that being said, there is no place in our world for any venom, vitriol or violence. There is no need for disdain, belittlement or hatred. People should not be judged by the God they pray to, the country they were born in, the color of their skin, the people they choose to love, or the amount of wealth they have.

For the wealth one has is not only measured in dollars and cents, but more so in the make-up of one's heart and soul. So, as we come upon our High Holidays, let us not just wish each other a Happy New Year, an Easy Fast and a L'shanah Tovah. But, may they all be filled with good health. May they all be meaningful. May they all be peaceful. And may we always remember the 6,002,977.



The best seats Lisa Kohn ever had at Madison Square Garden were at her mother's mass wedding, and the best cocaine she ever had was from her father's friend, the judge.

Born to hippie parents and raised in New York City's East Village in the 1970s, Lisa's early years were a mixture of encounter groups, primal screams, macrobiotic diets, communes, Indian ashrams, Jefferson Airplane concerts in Central Park, and watching naked actors on off-Broadway stages during the musical *HAIR*. This is the fascinating tale of a story rarely told in its full complexity.


