From the Rabbi's desk

Chag Urim Sameach!

As I write this, the temperature has dropped; we had our first frost, and we turned our clocks back. It is very dark, and each night it will get darker. As December rolls in, it coincides with the month of Kislev on the Jewish calendar. There are no holidays until the very end of the month, the 25th of Kislev, when we celebrate Chanukah (which begins on the 22nd of December). This year Chanukah almost falls on the Winter Solstice, which will occur on December 21, the day before. The days will be at their shortest, and the moon will be in its last phase as well. No sun and no moon—it will be very dark indeed.

I am reminded of a *midrash* from the Talmud [Avodah Zara 8b] in which Adam, the first human was afraid when he noticed the days getting shorter and shorter. He thought, "perhaps because I sinned, the world is getting darker around me, and will ultimately return to chaos and disorder (of the universe before creation). This is the death that was sentenced upon me from Heaven." He then arose and spent eight days fasting and in prayer. Once he saw that the days were getting longer (since the winter solstice had passed), he realized that this is the way of the world, since the days would get longer and shorter throughout the year. So the next year, instead of fasting and prayer, he set up an eight-day festivity, for the sake of Heaven.

This may have been the rabbis' explanation of why there are so many festivals of light during the dark time of the year, and alludes to our current festival of Chanukah. Chanukah is а celebration of the miracle of the oil and the Maccabees' victory over King Antiochus. Both were miracles, yet simple things such as the ebb and flow of the seasonsthe light and darkness we experience each vear—are miracles, too. Chanukah gives us a chance to bring more light into our lives, acknowledge these daily miracles, and to sit by and admire God's works.

Our Family Chanukah Service will take place on Friday, December 27th. I encourage you to bring your favorite *chanukiyah* so that we may we light them together. Each year when I see all the beautiful *chanukiyot* glowing, I am reminded of the miracles around us that light up even our darkest moments.

May our *chanukiyot* illuminate our days as well as our hearts,

November Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, November 11th 2019. President Fay Schildkraut conveyed the Board's condolences to the Fevola-Bobrow family for the loss of Rosemary Fevola, Louis' mother and Joy's motherin-law.

Jazz Shabbat was remarkable, Chicken Soup Cook-Off was our biggest one yet, and our Election Day Rummage was another success.

The agreement with Temple Gates of Prayer has been approved by the Attorney General and they will be closing on the sale of their building in December. The current projection for them to move in to our building is around June. She reported progress on the Security Grant, with the help of JCRC. Temple Staff now has completed mandatory annual Sexual Harassment Training.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we now have 119 member units. The Board approved the October Financial Report as submitted by Treasurer Charlene Metz.

Rabbi Sharon Ballan reported on recent services. This year's Interfaith Thanksgiving Service will be held at St. Andrew Avellino Church on Monday, 11/25/19. Cantor Jerry Korobow reported on the very successful Jazz Shabbat and stated all the musicians who participated said they would be happy to do it again. He thanked all who helped to make it a success and those who have contributed to the Music Fund.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit and Ritual Committee Chair, reported 10 book plates for the new siddurs have been purchased. They are looking forward to coordinating "No Shush Shabbat" service in the spring with Suzanne Fertig, to accommodate children with special needs. A committee has been formed to plan a Gala Event in June to celebrate Rabbi Ballan's 10 year anniversary with TBS which coincides with TBS' 70th Birthday.

Stephanie Rosenberg, Parents' Association President, reported the Rummage Bake Sale raised \$78.00. Pancake Breakfast planning is underway for 11/24/19. Geri Weiss will be manning the Religious School Book Sale on that date as well.

Membership Committee Chair, President Schildkraut, presented new member Wendy Yasgur, who is returning to TBS, to the Board and the Board approved her.

Sisterhood President Barbara Gandelman reported the Election Day Rummage sale raised over \$1,300.00. Men's Club President Jeffrey Cohen reported close to 18,000 books have been sorted for Bazaar. Men's Club made a \$250.00 contribution to Temple towards the Ballroom window renovations.

Religious School Board Committee Chair Andrea Odintz reported on an initiative to encourage donations of used WIFI-enabled tablets and laptops for school use. The students are preparing for the upcoming Pancake Breakfast.

Social Action Committee Chair Ilyne Rabinowitz reported they welcomed new members in October and are working on a Queens immigration activity and providing holiday gifts/supplies for refugees and border detainees. House committee chair Jim Kettig reported on progress toward the Ballroom windows renovation project. He and Eric Lustig are looking into ways to repair the stair lift. He is in correspondence with NYC DEP which contacted TBS regarding installation of a "rain garden" along one of our street frontages. This was attempted last year and they determined we do not qualify, so he will resend that correspondence for clarification.

Ways and Means Committee Chair Barry Packer and committee member Suzanne Fertig reported on the highly successful November Chicken Soup Cook Off. Significantly higher attendance was recorded this year (over 200) and this year's gross was \$3,577.00. We had good media coverage and the community was well represented.

Bazaar is in need of volunteers and merchandize, and they are looking for vendors. Adult Education had a successful Veteran's Day event and is looking forward to the next event in January.


I would like to take a moment to thank everyone who was able to get a certificate or merchandise for Bazaar. Your help is truly a mitzvah!!





Religious School News

Having moved through the cycle of Jewish Fall holidays, we are eagerly anticipating Thanksgiving and Chanukah as I write. Here at Temple Beth Sholom, we are re-energizing after our Rummage Sale and Chicken Soup Cook-Off while gearing up for Pancake Breakfast and Bazaar. Why do I mention ritual celebrations with fun raisers and fund raisers, you might ask? The answer is that both religious ritual and communal ritual set wonderful examples for our students on the importance of participation in Jewish community and Jewish life.

In the observance of religious holidays, students learn the history of our people, the lessons of Torah and the liturgy of worship. The lessons of the classroom come to life in the sounds of the shofar, the scent of an etrog, and the beauty of the Sukkah. The lessons of Shabbat become part of their lives at shared Shabbat and family Shabbat services.

Our students join with their parents in another set of mitzvah based activities as they help set up for Rummage, as they participated with the PA in the Election Day Bake Sale, and as they shared in the fun of the Cook-Off. They look forward every year to singing at the Pancake Breakfast. Many of them also help setting up and working at the Bazaar. In each of these non-religious activities, they are learning valuable lessons about what makes us a Jewish community. We live in a world where we recognize that "All Israel is responsible for each other." We need a place to come together to pray and to learn. Therefore we work to support our synagogue. As a song we used to sing at Solomon Schechter teaches,"Im en kemach, en Torah; im en Torah en kemach." (Without flour, there is no Torah; Without Torah there is no flour.) Substitute sustenance for the word kemach and we learn that we need resources in order to study, and we need to study in order to live a full life. Our parents who bring their children to the Temple for classes, for prayer, and for fundraising activities are raising children well-schooled in Jewish learning and Jewish life. They teach through their own examples. We believe in helping those in need. While our Rummage sale benefits Beth Sholom, it also provides a source of modestly priced clothing for lower income families.

My favorite teaching from Ron Wolfson, a pre-eminent Jewish educator and communal professional is that, "Ritual makes normal." What our children learn in class, at services, and in congregational activities such as those mentioned above and also including Mitzvah Day, Blood Drives, and the Chanukah Toy Drive, make doing acts of loving kindness and charity, prayer, and the study of Torah, the rituals of a normal Jewish life. Yasher koach to all who set such good examples for them! May it always be so!

Scoop's Schmooze

The night was November 9, 2019. And as I was able to watch the re-airing of WPIX Channel 11 News at 2:00 in the morning, newscaster Kaity Tong and Team Chicken Soup's Jeff Cohen echoed sentiments of what one of the main goals of Temple Beth Sholom's Annual Chicken Soup Cook-Off is. For as Kaity said, "organizers of this event say it's all about bringing people together" and Jeff shared that "it really fosters community." And both are so true.

For this event was founded years ago after my wife, Renee, and I saw the 2014 movie called, The Deli Man; a documentary showing the rise and fall of the Kosher delicatessens, and in particular following a Houston, Texas deli owner named Ziggy Gruber throughout his daily routine and many of the aspects of his personal and professional life, including him partaking in one of his local events called a Chicken Soup Cook-Off. I brought the idea to the Board, was told to run with it and see what developed. And, after building a team that, from the beginning, featured Jeff, Suzanne Fertig, Karla Bonne, Lori Lustig, and now, Sam Rosenberg, that was the start of bringing people together.

And, little could I have imagined that about five years after that initial proposal, and the first of many meetings over the years at the Fertig home, that on this November day, I would have walked in to TBS at 11:00 in the morning, and the incomparable team of Jose and Santos would have already had the entire ballroom fully set up; complete with 16 competitor and food donor tables, judges' tables on the stage, entrance tables outside the ballroom and a raffle table set up upon entrance into the ballroom. And then going on last year's premise of us having about 150 guests, and knowing that the number of people attending the event has grown from year to year, they set up 17 round tables with 10 chairs around each. However, as the night carried on, and the visitors kept coming, the seating for 170 was not enough as they needed to set up two more tables; which, when adding those who were standing and serving and walking, brought this year's event to well over 200 people.

200+ people being brought together for chicken soup, bagels and ice cream started with Suzanne always offering her home for meetings, Jeff designing all of the fliers and banners and executing the public relations and marketing efforts, Karla putting together the volunteer schedule and getting all of the decorative centerpieces, Lori creating the aprons and judges' gift baskets, and Sam acquiring raffle prizes. And, then, we were able to bring so many more people together by reaching out to our fellow Temple Beth Sholom family members and staff, who are always so generous with their time and enthusiasm, and who helped to transport and serve the soup, who sold the raffle and admission tickets, and who did the electrical set-up and photography of the event; all made the event more successful. Fostering community. 33 of the 46 vendors who participated—whether by competing, by donating food or by contributing raffle prizes have been past participants; and several of the new ones have said that they will be back for year five. Fostering community. Of the 21 different raffle prize winners, more than onethird were not Temple Beth Sholom members; meaning that whether by advertising, marketing, public relations and media sources, repeat visitors, or word of mouth, guests, like the vendors, are coming from near and far.

And, as we congratulate the Judge's Awards, Harpell's Pharmacy and Natural Market, Tropical Revival and Chef Elvis and the People's Choice Awards in Ben's Kosher Deli, Tropical Revival and Chef Elvis for finishing first, second and third, respectively, we all know that chicken soup is not just "Jewish Penicillin," but that it also brings us all together; which is something we can always use.
