From the Rabbi's desk

Shalom,

This month, January, coincides almost entirely with the month of Tevet on the Jewish calendar. Tevet has only one "holiday" in it, Asara B'Tevet, the 10th of Tevet, which is a minor fast day, commemorating the siege of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar II of Babylonia in 588 BCE. Most of us do not observe this fast—a sunrise to sunset fast.

On the secular calendar, we usher in a new decade, and that is hard to believe! Enter the '20s! We entered a new decade on the Jewish calendar. too-the '80s-5780 that is, but we did that on Rosh HaShannah. As we took stock of our year during the High Holy Days, many people do this again this time of the year. I don't usually "New Year's resolutions" because I use the Jewish New Yearthe High Holidays—to do this. But really, I think that there is nothing wrong with doing teshuvah more than once a year. After all, we learn in Pirkei Avot that we should make teshuvah one day before our death, in essence, every day. The secular New Year, then, is a good time to make an assessment of our progress. Since we began a new decade on both calendars, I am looking back on the entire last decade, because I have spent it with you, the congregation of Temple Beth Sholom. I am proud, grateful and a little amazed that it has been more than ten years that I have been with you!

During the High Holy Days, the process of looking back is called cheshbon hanefesh, an accounting of the soul.

I would like to do a cheshbon hakahal an accounting of our congregation. I think that we have come a long way in ten years. Ten years ago, at my installation, I spoke about TBS becoming a holy community, a K'hilah Kadoshah, and that I entered into a covenant with you, a holy partnership.

In a holy partnership our destinies are joined; our successes and disappointments are not ours alone, they are shared. As in marriage, (also a holy partnership) we don't make decisions alone, but make them with our partners. A holy partnership is about forming relationships; of being there for one another through simchas (the joyous times) and tragedies, and every lifecycle event in between; and it most importantly, it is creating a vibrant community, a k'hila kedoshah a holy community.

I think we have indeed become a vibrant, k'hilah kedoshah. We are doing relatively well financially, and I believe that we are spiritually in a good place, too. Our congregation has come together to help and support our members through our caring committee, and Sisterhood, strong Parents' Association and Men's Club. Our worship services have been well attended, musical and uplifting. Our children are learning all about Judaism and menschlekite in our Religious School. We may be a little smaller, but I think our congregation is all the more stronger and cohesive. May we continue to thrive in the years to come.



I would like to take a moment to thank everyone who helped with Bazaar this year. We had a successful Bazaar and could not have done it without your help.


We will be having another Book Club on Sunday, February 9th at 10:30 am. The book is *Lilac Girls by Martha Hall Kelly*.

December Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, December 16, 2019. President Fay Schildkraut reported the President of Temple Gates of Prayer told her they have signed the contract to sell their building so they have to vacate and plan their temporary move with us very soon.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported membership is now at 118 member units after the sad passing of Bernice Berman. The Board approved the November Financial Report as submitted by Treasurer Charlene Metz.

Rabbi Ballan and Cantor Korobow reported on upcoming Chanukah services and events. Pulpit and Ritual Committee Chair Geri Weiss reported on recent analysis of High Holiday attendance compared to last year and noted increased member participation. Siddurs with dedications will be identified with a binder dot for distribution at services.

Sam Rosenberg was thanked for always beautifying our Synagogue with flowers and his many contributions to TBS. The committee planning the Gala in honor of Rabbi Ballan's $10^{\rm th}$ anniversary with us and Temple's $70^{\rm th}$ birthday in June is making progress.

Membership Committee Chair Fay Schildkraut presented new members Amy Edelstein and Michael Gross to the Board for unanimous approval. Sisterhood President Barbara Gandelman reported the next book club meeting is on Sunday, February 9th; the book is *Lilac Girls by Martha Hall Kelly*.

The Board approved a motion to enable the Religious School Board to present Karen Feit with a 2-year contract renewal as Religious School Principal. Men's Club President Jeffrey Cohen reported they are doing the Super Bowl 50-50 pool again this year. He reported on post-Bazaar book sale related updates, and a connection made this year with a man who collects sports memorabilia and may want to work with Men's Club on doing a Collectables show at TBS; possible date May $15^{\rm th}$.

Religious School Board Committee Chair Andrea Odintz reported after several fund raisers, they still need funding to pay for a flat-screen TV for the school. Stephanie Rosenberg volunteered to donate the difference and purchase it so it can be installed in January. Long time teacher Rob is leaving the school to pursue a Nursing career. There are some plans in place to cover for him while they seek his replacement.

Jim Kettig, Nominating Committee Chair, presented the Board with the following slate from the Nominating Committee: President: Joy Bobrow, First Vice President: Fay Schildkraut, Second Vice President: Eric Lustig, Third Vice President: Barry Packer, Treasurer: Charlene Metz, Financial Secretary: Robin Myers, Recording Secretary: Gail Tishcoff. 3-Year Trustees: Maxine Simon, Ilyne Rabinowitz, Iris Bass, Fran Goldman and Gloria Shapiro. 2-year Trustee: Jeffrey Cohen. This will be presented at the January Congregational Meeting for vote.

House committee chair Jim Kettig reported on progress toward the ballroom windows renovation project, slated to start in March at approximate cost of \$36,000.00. Proposal to make necessary repairs to the Cooling Tower is estimated at \$13,000.00. They are researching ways and costs to replace the stair lift.

Ways and Means committee chair Barry Packer reported they hope to set next year's Chicken Soup Cookoff date as November 7th. Bazaar Co-Chair Joy Bobrow reported Bazaar was quite successful this year but they will need ideas for next year and will be meeting in January.

Eric Bernstein reported Adult Education will have Breakfast and a Movie on 1/5/20 to see "when jews were funny" about Jewish comedy. The Board unanimously approved motions for a one-year contract with Cantor Jerry Korobow and a three-year contract with Rabbi Sharon Ballan. Details will be presented for ratification by the Congregation at the January Congregational Meeting.



Scoop's Schmooze

The street address number is 223.

In Jersey City, New Jersey, JC Kosher Supermarket is three feet away from a yeshiva. It is directly across the street from a Catholic parish. A few storefronts away in one direction is an African hair braiding salon. In the other direction is a mosque. The street that all of this resides on bears the name of one of Israel's greatest friends-Martin Luther King, Jr.; who on March 25, 1968, less than two weeks before he was tragically assassinated, in a speech to the Rabbinical Assembly said: "peace for Israel means security, and we must stand with all our might to protect its right to exist, its territorial integrity. I see Israel as one of the great outposts of democracy in the world, and a marvelous example of what can be done, how desert land can be transformed into an oasis of brotherhood and democracy. Peace for Israel means security and that security must be a reality." And, 223 Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard, where JC Kosher Supermarket is located, just happens to be less than three miles from the most welcoming iconic symbol in the world---the Statue of Liberty.

And, while that area of MLK Boulevard seemed to be the epitome of a prototypical melting pot, on Tuesday, December 10, 2019, it actually turned into a war zone.

Heartbreakingly, in the blink of an eye at the supermarket, Moshe Deutsch, Mindy Ferencz and Miguel Rodriguez; along with Detective Joseph Seals beforehand, fell victim to anti-Semetic and anti-police hatred. That is the same anti-semetism that in New York City, through September, is up 63% compared to the same time period of 2018 and that has made up more than 50% of the City's reported hate crimes. The Mayor of Jersey City, Steven Fulop, who comes from a family of Holocaust survivors, where 35 members of his immediate family were taken to Auschwitz and only seven survived, appallingly and sadly feels the actual target of the attack was the attached to the market yeshiva with 50 children inside.

This unforgivable and insane unspeakable horror took place the day after the conclusion of Temple Beth Sholom's annual Bazaar and a month after our Chicken Soup Cook-Off. And, as I sat and relived all that took place during those two events---the preparation of and the actual happening, I reflected on all of the people who were there; the diversity of vendors, of attendees and, yes, of our Temple Family. And, as was said numerous times by multiple people during the last month---these were special family events for very special people worked by very special people. So many helped out one way or another, so many participated. And, whoever did whatever, for everyone, it was nothing short of a true labor of love.

And, at the risk of leaving people, businesses and organizations out who participated in these events, or having my column run on page after page by listing everyone;

may it just be said that the unbelievably wide array of backgrounds that these wonderful and thoughtful, generous and dedicated people come from indeed make Temple Beth Sholom its own melting pot. Every day we are blessed to share happiness and joy, safety and peace with each other---those who are guests or those of us who make Temple Beth Sholom of Flushing our second home.

So, while none of us have probably ever met Moshe Deutsch, Mindy Ferencz, Miguel Rodriguez, or Detective Joseph Seals, I know that they will never be forgotten by our TBS family.


