

From the Rabbi's desk

Shalom!

As I write this, we have turned our clocks back and had our first frost. the weather has While been fluctuating between warm and cold. one thing is sure—the nights are longer and will continue to get even longer. The longest night of the year, the winter solstice—falls December 21st, a few days after Chanukah ends. Kislev, the Hebrew month that usually coincides with December, is the darkest month of the year. Since the festival of Chanukah occurs on the 25th of Kislev and lasts eight days, we always celebrate Rosh Chodesh Tevet, the new month and new moon, where there is virtually no moon in the sky. I don't think it is a coincidence that we have the festival of Chanukah to light up the dark, cold nights of winter with the glowing lights Chanukiyot from our (Chanukah menorahs).

This year has been darker than most. We have had to learn to adjust to Zoom and social distancing. It has been hard for many, but at TBS we have been able to maintain crucial connections and we have started to hold services once a month in our sanctuary. Things are getting brighter. Although Chanukah is most associated with light, the word Chanukah does not mean "light," nor anything related to it. Chanukah means "dedication." The word was first used in conjunction with the dedication of the Mishkan, the portable sanctuary that the children of Israel used as they wandered in the desert.

For twelve days, the Israelites celebrated this "chanukat ha-miz-bey-ach" the dedication of the altar that was within the *Mishkan*.

After the Maccabees found the Temple in shambles and desecrated (around 164 BCE), they cleaned it up and wanted to re-dedicate the altar after it was purified. They established an eight-day holiday. The tradition of lighting the *Chanukiyah* followed later.

Chanukah then, can be seen as a holiday of dedication and renewal. I would like to thank those dedicated people in our own congregation who have been working tirelessly to keep TBS going and the lights on. Everyone has been working hard during these very difficult times. It takes a lot of effort to hold in-person services these days-our next planned inperson service will take place on the 2nd night of Chanukah, December 11. It will be our "family" Chanukah service. Even if you can't join us in person, please have your Chanukah menorahs ready so that we may all see each other light them together!

May you experience light and joy (*orah v'simcha*) during this holiday season.

November Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, November 9th, 2020 via videoconferencing (Zoom) due to COVID-19 restrictions.

President Joy Bobrow opened by stating how wonderful it was to have services Zoomed from the sanctuary last month. She stated that the effects of COVID have resulted in significant budgetary strain and she announced a new fundraising initiative, Monthly Mensch. She requested that email blasts be better planned to avoid overwhelming congregants.

October minutes were accepted with corrections. Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we have 113 member units. Treasurer Charlene Metz reported the October financial report, which the Board approved as presented.

Rabbi Ballan reported on the successful October Shabbat services from the sanctuary and thanked Eric Lustig for setting up the audio/visual system; we hope to somehow set up permanent equipment for the future. The next Sanctuary Service was scheduled for November 20th. There was an interfaith Thanksgiving service this year via zoom from The Church on the Hill, Monday evening November 23rd. She will be attending a Rabbinic Conference via Zoom. Cantor Korobow added that they have met with Andrea Odintz and finalized dates for Shared Shabbats through May.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit & Ritual Committee Chair, also reported on the well done and well received services from the sanctuary.

Elana White, PA Co-President, reported on an upcoming fundraiser at Five Below in New Hyde Park and they are working on a date for a fundraiser at the Carvel next to the Temple. Andrea Odintz, Religious School Chair, updated the Board on school dates and issues and stated the next Shared Shabbat was November 27th with Karen Feit on Zoom.

Past President Fay Schildkraut, Membership Committee Chair reported that the committee was very impressed by how well Geri Weiss had the sanctuary engineered for social distancing and they are brainstorming on how to attract new members during these difficult times.

Barbara Gandelman, Sisterhood President, reported the November book club went well and had some new guests. Their next one will be on Sunday, February 21st reading Floating in the Neversink by Andrea Simon, with the author joining the meeting. The last Women's Discussion group was on Wednesday November 18th; the next one will be on Wednesday, December 16th. Thanks to Deirdre for her continued support for this group. Virtual Bingo was a rousing success and raised \$400.00. She thanked Lori Lustig and Natalie Strauss who worked hard to make it a success. The next Virtual Bingo will take place on Wednesday evening, December 9th.

Jim Kettig, Nominating Committee Chair, presented the following slate for presentation to the Congregation at the January Congregational Meeting: For 3-Year Trustee Positions: Barbara Gandelman, Larry Gold, Karri Kaufman, Andrea Odintz and Geri Weiss.

President Joy Bobrow, Use of Building, reported on the LFCC reopening plan and it may be possible that they may begin to use the Ballroom-only in mid-December. The Children's Day Care Center that was hoping to use space in the building has been unable to get required license. They expressed a desire to try again next year if the space is still available.

Jim Kettig, House Committee, acknowledged the hard work that Louis Fevola has been doing to benefit the building.

Jeff Cohen, Men's Club President, reported Jib Lanes has reopened but wants Men's Club to do bowling a different night. Regular participants have been polled and want to wait until 2021. The annual post-Thanksgiving "Turkey Trot" was on Friday, November 27th in Little Bay Park (socially distanced and with masks). He outlined accepted media that can be donated. He reported that Skylar Bonne has been named New Yorker of the Week on NY1, and he was featured at the Veterans Day event on November 15th.

Deirdre Weliky, Caring Committee, reported on the ongoing successful Zoom Schmooze program and telephone outreach efforts. The Food Pantry continues to provide much-needed food to the community once a month.

Gail Tishcoff reminded all of the Pre-Thanksgiving Blood Drive that was held on November 22nd and will report more details next month.

Ilyne Rabinowitz, Social Action Committee, reported their meetings will resume on Thursday, December 10th and will identify areas of need in the community to which we can lend support. All are welcome.

Barry Packer, Ways and Means, reported on a potential Zoom show by Renee Katz and her pianist. He is working on a fundraiser with Ben's as well.

Eric Bernstein, Adult Education Chair, reported Ron Schwarz' event went well and was well attended - the video recording is available to interested TBS members if they wish to contact Natalie Strauss for the link. He reviewed a weekly cooking event that is hosted by TGP that he and his family participated in recently. He is working on a fundraiser with Ben's as well.

Joy Bobrow, Bazaar Co-Chair, reported on the upcoming raffle and Chef Adam Soup sale.

Scoop's Schmooze

While all of us have been wrapped up in the events of Tuesday, November 3, 2020---otherwise known as Election Day; no matter which way you voted, your vote did matter. And, as the results were made known by the media, late the ensuing Saturday morning and showed that Joe Biden defeated Donald Trump, the almost 150 million people who cast their ballots for President of the United States were all entitled to their own sentiments and emotions with the final results.

However, this column is not a political commentary, nor to talk about the answer of who will reside at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue NW in Washington, D.C. and who will lead the United States of America.

Presidential. ---Leadership. During the last several months these two terms have become extremely popular in our daily lexicon. But, what do they actually represent?

And in the Autumn 2008 edition of CONTACT, Chairman, Michael H. Steinhardt wrote "What is true leadership? It involves creativity, ingenuity and a willingness to challenge the status quo in the interest of progress towards a larger goal."

For in the handful of years that I have been honored and privileged to serve on the Temple Beth Sholom Board of Trustees; as well as in the roles of Vice-President, Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee and as a piece of the Membership Committee, I have truly been blessed with the good fortune of serving up close under the Presidential terms of Adam Gandelman, Dr. Fay Schildkraut and Joy Bobrow.

There have been exciting and inspirational highs and unfortunate and heartbreaking lows; yet Adam and Fay and Joy, no matter the situation, have remained unflappable, level-headed and tirelessly dedicated to Temple Beth Sholom in its entirety---its edifice, its congregation, its staff, its tenants, its guests, and to all of us on the Board of Trustees.

COOKING WITH... The Bernsteins

Eggplant "Meat"balls
(A Weight Watchers Recipe)

<u>Ingredients:</u>

- 1 Large Eggplant
- 1 Cup of Bread Crumbs (Panko recommended)
- 1 Egg

Cooking Spray

Season to taste (as you would season a meatball)

Kitchen items needed:

Large Mixing Bowl

Casserole dish with cover

Parchment Paper

Colander

Sheet Tray or Baking Pan (9x13)

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375.
- 2. Peel and dice 1 large eggplant (small dice)
- 3. Put diced eggplant into microwavable casserole dish and submerge eggplant
- 4. Cover the dish and microwave for 8 minutes
- 5. Drain the eggplant in a colander; let the eggplant sit for 20 minutes to cool drain excess water
- 7. Place the eggplant in a mixing bowl and mix in egg and bread crumbs
- 8. Lay parchment paper on sheet tray; spray with nonstick cooking spray
- 9. Form eggplant into balls and place onto the parchment paper.
- 10. Bake for 25 minutes

About 2 Points per "meat"ball. Enjoy!


