From the Rabbi's desk

"Be Happy, It's Adar I?"

This winter has been a difficult one. Between the weather and COVID, January was spent mostly on Zoom. But we had some really good attendance and fun as we held our 2nd annual Tu Bishvat Service and Seder on Zoom, Now, it's on to the next holiday, Purim. Normally it falls just four weeks after Tu Bishvhat, on the 14th of Adar. This year however, is a little different, as it is a leap year. Since the lewish months are directly related to the cycle of moon's orbit around the earth, we would lose 11 days a year. Before long, we would be celebrating Passover in December and Chanukah in the summer, which we can't do because we learn in the Torah (Ex. 23:15) "You shall observe the Feast of Matzot...at the set time in the month of Abib" (literally "Spring"). Seven times within a 19 year cycle we add an entire month to the calendar, which works out to every two to three years or so. This extra month becomes Adar II. the 13th month on the calendar. Adar I begins on February 2nd, (Ground Hog Day)! Purim will be celebrated in Adar II, which will fall on the evening of March 16th. Essentially there are no Jewish holidays in Adar I except for "Purim Katan" or "Little Purim" on the 14th of the month. In traditional circles. prayers of supplication (tachanun) are not read and fasting and eulogies are prohibited. That's about it.

There are a few explanations as to why we celebrate Purim in Adar II, at the end of our calendar cycle. One is that our sages wanted to keep the time period between Passover and Purim the same linking the redemption of Esther with the redemption of the children of Israel at the Sea of Reeds. Another comes from a midrash found in the Talmud [Shabbat 88a]: "And they stood under [at the foot] of the mountain" (Ex. 19:17). R. Avdimi bar Hama said: This teaches that the Holy One suspended the mountain upon them, like an inverted vat, and said to them: If you accept the Torah it is well; if not your burial will be right here. R. Ahah bar Jacob said: This story would justify a claim that Israel accepted the Torah under duress [thus nullifying the covenant with God]! Rava said: Nevertheless, the people of Israel freely accepted the Torah in the days of king Ahaseurus, as it is written: "The *Iews established and accepted"* (Esther 9:27), meaning established in their time what they had accepted at Sinai.

We come full circle from the first month (Nissan) and Passover, to the last month and the celebration of Purim. An extra month in the calendar, gives us an extra month to prepare. Please let me know if you would like to participate in reading the from the Megillah.

Last year we heard many of you chant and I'd like to hear from even more of you! Send me an email and I will send you a line or two and the sound files so you can practice.

Cantor's Corner



My dear friends, I hope you're all staying nice and warm. As I'm writing this column, it's less than 20 degrees outside, and the wind is blowing. It is most definitely winter time here in the New York metropolitan area.

Many of us, especially our older folks, tend to hunker down in the winter time. The temperature, snow, ice and general dreariness can certainly be off putting. But, since the advent of COVID, things seem to have gotten that much worse.

I was having a conversation with a woman at work yesterday. She and her teenage daughter recently recovered from COVID. She has her elderly mother living with her and her husband, and her mom had a minor stroke just a few months before she and her daughter got sick. The mom also suffers from arthritis. And the mom, like the daughter, is originally from Iraq.

Tough circumstances, to say the least. But what is tougher for my work friend is the fact that her mom is basically not eating. Apparently, she was always a picky eater, and rather health conscious. Now, a few bites, and that's it. She feels nauseous, or disinterested, or who knows what.

Is the mother ill? Is she depressed? It's very hard to say. Does she have friends? She used to be in touch with a few women, and they sometimes went out to dinner, but now....I suggested that my friend call her mother's doctor, and see what he might suggest to stimulate her mother's appetite. Also, might there be anything available to enhance her mood?

We're now drifting into our third year of the pandemic. I'm sure none of us imagined that things would play out as they have. Yet, I consider myself one of the very lucky ones. So far, none of my family members have gotten sick. I've been able to continue working both as an attorney and a cantor. Zo and I have gotten to visit with our children and grandchildren. We're in touch with our friends. So far, so good.

But others, like my work friend's mom, are perhaps not so lucky. She needs contact, she needs stimulation, and she needs some sort of activity. My friend is trying, but she also has a husband, children, and work obligations.

I usually try and write something light or funny or interesting in my columns. Somehow, I just didn't feel that way after my conversation with my friend. Do you know someone in similar circumstances? Are you in similar circumstances? Reach out to someone, and ask for or provide the human contact so essential to each and every one of us. Call someone you haven't spoken to in a while. Write someone a letter, or send a text. Check in on or check in with others.



January Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, January 10th, 2022. via Zoom.

President Joy Bobrow thanked the outgoing 2021 Board members. She reminded everyone to let Fay Schildkraut know if you want to order dinner (for pick-up) for the Shabbat Across America (Zoom) dinner/service with A&A. We are still seeking a Temple bookkeeper. She thanked all who continue their "Monthly Mensch" donations, and all who continue to support TBS.

The minutes of the last meeting were accepted with corrections. Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported membership is 112 member units. Treasurer Charlene Metz reviewed the January Financial report, which the Board approved as presented. She reviewed the proposed 2022-2023 Budget, which the Board approved for presentation and approval at the January 2022 Congregational Meeting.

Rabbi Ballan reported on recent and upcoming services as well as Religious School programs, Confirmation classes, and the Adult Beginning Hebrew class. She thanked the outgoing Board members for their service to Temple. Cantor Korobow reported there is continued good attendance at hybrid, Zoom, and in-person Religious Services, great participation in the Children's Services, and on Religious School progress.

Geri Weiss reported the Pulpit and Ritual Committee is re-evaluating on a weekly basis whether to hold services in person or Zoom-only basis. Erica Bernstein, PA Co-President, reported there will be a virtual Paint Afternoon event on February 1st at 3:00 pm. Andrea Odintz, Religious School Board Committee Chair, submitted her report covering Tu Bishvat, Religious School Family Education and the Tu Bishvat Seder which was part of the January Shared Shabbat Service. They are discussing how to proceed with Sunday Religious School classes based on current COVID conditions.

Vice President Dr. Fay Schildkraut, Membership Chair, reported Roger and Sharon Optsbaum have become returning TBS Members. Roger is past President and will therefore be a voting member of the TBS Board. She asked all to let her know ASAP regarding plans to order food for Shabbat Across America to be picked up at Temple.

Barbara Gandelman, Sisterhood President, reported Book Club will be held on Sunday, February $13^{\rm th}$ at 10:30 via Zoom, reading *Eternal* by Lisa Scottoline. Virtual Bingo has been a great success and is held on Thursday, January $20^{\rm th}$ at 8:00 pm and then again on Thursday, February $17^{\rm th}$ at 7:30 pm. The Women's Discussion Group will be held on February $2^{\rm nd}$ and March $2^{\rm nd}$ and she thanked Deirdre Weliky for running this event.

President Joy Bobrow reported on Use of Building that Temple Gates of Prayer is interested in renewing their arrangement with TBS for an additional 2-year option through June 2025. Parties continue to be booked in the Ballroom. Jim Kettig, House Committee Chair, reported he is continuing to work with an engineer and contractor to try to develop a scope of work to do a major overhaul of our heating and cooling systems for an amount that Temple can afford.

This process is taking longer than hoped; it will take some months to prepare documents, have a bidding process, and secure required municipal approvals. The work is best done during the "swing seasons" of spring or fall. Therefore, it may be up to year before work is started, but based on repairs we have done to the existing boiler and AC system, those systems should last us another year.

Jeff Cohen, Men's Club President, reported monthly bowling continues at Jib Lanes. Men's Club is holding its annual Super Bowl 50/50 pool and boxes can be purchased for \$5.00 each through PayPal and Venmo. He has already started to receive donations on Books for Bazaar 2022.

Deirdre Weliky reported on Caring Committee activities to support ill and bereaved members. She reported the Women's Discussion group on February 2nd will be an open discussion. Later in the meeting she reported there have been inquiries for a co-ed discussion group and she will plan to do one in the coming months.

President Bobrow reported that Marchel Gillin emailed that the recent Food Pantry served 1500 people representing 503 households. Barry Packer reported Ways & Means committee continues to work toward planning a Field Day and has a donor who is willing to pay for the park application if we wish to proceed.

Eric Bernstein reported on January 16th Michael Smook, a guest speaker on world Jewry & Israel will be providing a virtual lecture on Scrolls of the Dead Sea and Jewish History. Eric is arranging with the production and distribution company of "Tango Shalom" to set up viewing of the movie for Temple members. After members see the movie, there will be a virtual discussion with the production crew and cast on Sunday, March 20th. He thanked Susan Ecker and Joy Bobrow for helping to facilitate this event.

President Joy Bobrow reported Bazaar 2022 has already started to have book donations and she hoped it will be more like pre-COVID Bazaars.

After Good & Welfare discussion, the clergy were excused. VP Fay Schildkraut presented negotiations with Cantor Korobow. The Board unanimously approved a motion to present to the Congregation for ratification a two-year contract with Cantor Jerry Korobow, from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2024, with annual increase each year and all other terms remaining the same. The meeting was adjourned.


