From the Rabbi's desk

This year, Shabbat Across America coincides with Rosh Chodesh Adar II (March 4th). Because we are in a leap year, we add an entire month to the calendar. As was mentioned during February's Shared Shabbat Service the rabbis have a saying, "from the beginning of Adar, we increase our "simcha" — joy." [B. Taanit 29a]. It is doubly true, since we have two full months of Adar, and an extra month to get ready for Purim! There is also perhaps a little extra joy this year as we return to in-person services and celebrate Shabbat Across America. We won't be dining together, but we will be back in our sanctuary after a bit of a hiatus.

Purim is always interesting to me because of all the contradictions and absurdities surrounding it. On the one hand, we learn in the Talmud (Megillah 7b) "Rava said, 'It is a intoxicate person's dutv to themselves on Purim until they cannot tell the difference between 'cursed be Haman' and 'blessed be Mordecai." We dress in costume, and we are permitted to be silly. The story itself can be viewed as farce, as everything is larger than life. Yet, on the other hand, it is very serious. It is a story (whether you believe it actually happened) about a plan to exterminate the Jews. And, as we approach the holiday in preparation, on Shabbat Zachor, we are obligated to read the passage in the Torah about what Amalek did to us when we left Egypt (Deut. 25:17-19); how he snuck up on the Israelites and cut down the infirm and weak who were in the rear.

I often wonder why there are so many 'opposites' in this story. But perhaps that is the point. Life is a series of opposites as well. We are forced to laugh in the face of sorrow, pain and even fear. These times that we are living in are no exception. I suppose, it couldn't hurt to take to heart the words of Bobby McFerrin, "Don't worry, be happy!"

Once again, our Megillah reading will take place during Shabbat Services on March 18th. This way, everyone participate, as this will be a Shared Shabbat Service. We have many people who will be chanting from the Megillah—the scroll of Esther, and through the magic of Zoom, all of you will be able to follow along and view the scroll as we chant! You will also be able to shout and make noise to drown out Haman's name (and we can mute you to stop at the appropriate times). And, Zoom has a built-in silly virtual mask feature as well. Of course, you can still make your own costumes!

In this year of ups and downs, light and darkness, joy, and sadness we are given permission to let go.

I am looking forward to celebrating with you all.

I just came across this article I wrote back in 2010, and thought it was worth recycling. Perhaps it's an example of being able to "reach across the aisle" to someone who may see things a bit differently than you do.

So, a guy walks into a bar. "Oh no" you cry, "he's not going to tell us some old joke, is he?" Well no, I'm not. Actually, the guy was me, and it wasn't exactly a bar-it was a diner in beautiful downtown Kings Park, Suffolk County, Long Island, NY (although they do serve alcohol).

A fellow I met who liked to play guitar had started to run an "open mic" night at the Hokey Pokey Diner on Tuesday nights. He asked if I might come down some time. If you've never been to an open mic, it's something you should experience. The name says it all. Anyone can take a turn singing and/or playing. Some people get up and read original poetry. As you might expect, the ability levels can vary wildly, but there's something sweet about people getting up and trying. Every now and then, you can watch a progression and degree of improvement in a performer that can be stunning.

Anyway, I stopped in on a Tuesday night about a month ago. Charlie, who runs the open mic, greeted me and asked if I would play a few tunes. I said I would later in the evening. After I'd played a few more songs, Don got out his banjo, and we played a set that lasted about 45 minutes (and this after we hadn't played together in perhaps 20 years). The people loved the music, and we had a gas. We really hated to leave at the end of the night, but we both had offices to get to early the next morning.

The interesting thing is that Don and I have never had anything in common to speak of but the music. Our politics, personal taste, friends, outside interests, and backgrounds are completely different. At times, I'm not even sure we could have been called friends. But somehow, now over the course of more than 35 years, we've kept running into each other, and the music remains. Don's not as conservative today as he used to be-you could say he's mellowed. Being married, having kids, working, and living life will do that to you. I've mellowed too. But after all, conservative or liberal, short hair or long, Republican or Democrat, young or old, there's the music. There's always the music!





#### February Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, February  $14^{\rm th}$  , 2022, via Zoom.

President Joy Bobrow welcomed the new Board members: Deirdre Weliky, Elana White, Jim Kettig, Jeff Cohen, and Karla Bonné. She reported that in early March, with the assistance of Temple Gates of Prayer, TBS will have a joint one-hour virtual training with the Community Security Services on how to help protect our community and how to register for the program. She read Article III Section 4 of the By-Laws pertaining to the responsibilities of the Board of Trustees. The minutes of the last meeting were accepted with corrections.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported membership is 113 member units. All accounts were updated with the 2022-2023 dues billing and statements having been mailed out.

Treasurer Charlene Metz reviewed the February financial report, which the Board approved as presented.

Rabbi Ballan reported she and Cantor Korobow had recently received a draft of COVID safety plan for in-person services guidelines and she raised concerns. It was agreed that a follow-up meeting would be held to address those concerns.

Vice-President Dr. Fay Schildkraut, Membership Chair, presented Roberta Kossoff for membership as a returning member. Membership is working to increase our virtual affiliations. Shabbat Across America will be a hybrid service on March 4<sup>th</sup> and we will have an oneg "to go" and an oneg "to stay." They will be doing outreach to assisted living communities, to see how we may involve their residents in Temple activities.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit and Ritual Committee Chair, reported in-person services will be resuming in March but the Purim/Shared Shabbat will be Zoom only. They will be asking members to review their loved one's names on the mi shebeirach list.

Erica Bernstein, PA Co-President, thanked TBS member Larry Gold for donating a laptop for the school's use. Their annual Purim event will be held on Zoom on March 13<sup>th</sup>.

Andrea Odintz, Religious School Board Committee Chair, reported on Shared Shabbat, which continues to be well attended, and the next one will be combined with the Purim Service on March 18th. Returning TBS member Roberta Kossoff will be offering a Religious School session on anti-Semitism awareness on Sunday April 24<sup>th</sup> to coincide with the week of Yom HaShoah.

Barbara Gandelman, Sisterhood President, reported the Book Club that was postponed on Sunday, February  $13^{\rm th}$  will be rescheduled. Rummage will be in May and will need volunteers. She reported Bingo is very popular and gave the dates for the next Bingo events.

The Women's Discussion Group will be on March  $2^{\rm nd}$  and April  $6^{\rm th}$  and she thanked Deirdre Weliky, who has also introduced an Adult Discussion Group for all on Monday February  $21^{\rm st}$ .

Jim Kettig, House Committee Chair, reported he has not been able to follow up this month but hopes to have building walk-throughs with potential contractors for the HVAC repairs in the coming months.




## TBS Religious School Event Sunday April 24, 2022

#### Scoop's Schmooze

For those of us of a certain generation, close your eyes and hear the voice of Johnny Olsen saying "thank you for playing... and you get the home version of Jewish Geography--a game the whole family can play."

I won the coin toss; so I'll go first.

For instance, who would have known that my mother-inlaw, Rose Katz, and our Temple matriarch, Betty Zimmerman, both spent part of their childhoods in Cincinnati, Ohio - where a familiar connection or two somewhere along the way is almost inevitable? Or that Betty spent time at Brookline, New Hampshire's Camp Tevya; which happens to be the same place that my mother, my sister and I spent the summers of our youth. It's not just knowing the same people; as documented in two reports issued by the Pew Research Center last May, entitled Jewish Community And Connectedness and 10 Key Findings About Jewish Americans, it's an endless array of unique connections.

My college roommate, Merrill, and I met at a Hofstra University Open House in the spring of 1980 at the Boston Marriott Newton. Upon arriving, my parents and I were told to go to *that* table and sit with *that* family---the Dubrows. Little did the six of us know when we introduced ourselves that both of our fathers had served as Presidents of their synagogues, had been deeply associated with nursing homes during their professional endeavors and that Merrill and I were, and still are, diehard Boston sports fanatics. And, most importantly, that more than 40 years later, we would still be brother-like friends.

With a mother who is a ballerina and a wife who is a classically trained vocalist and a Manhattan cabaret star, it has to be serendipity that I share my January 27th birthday with Mozart, Jerome Kern and Mikhail Baryshnikov. Or that, with my Holocaust-surviving father-in-law; January 27th, 1945 was the day that that those who remained at Auschwitz-Birkenau were liberated, and then in 2005, January 27th became International Holocaust Day.

And, that brings me full circle back to Betty Zimmerman. For she, so graciously, shared one of her personally-owned chuppahs with Renee and I, for us to be married under. Thus, we will proudly be connected with Betty for eternity.

And, speaking of Cincinnatians, it has to be more than irony that as our invaluable administrator, Natalie, is putting this edition of The Voice to bed; much of her work on said document will begin around February 14<sup>th</sup>. And, while Valentine's Day is not a holiday appearing on the Jewish calendar, this year it holds special significance. In the winter of 2016/2017, after spending a week-and-a-half at North Shore University Hospital and a month-and-a-half at the Stern Family Center For Rehabilitation; it was five years ago this month that my mother-in-law, Rose, came home. Amazingly, she returned to Fresh Meadows on Valentine's Day after having a life-saving procedure – literally - with the implantation of a pacemaker.




