

Once again, I find myself writing about the future. I am furiously preparing for Passover, but must write about what will happen in May, long after Passover is gone. As we all know, it is impossible to predict the future, but we can still plan. We usher in the month of May with our Tenth (!) Annual Mitzvah Day. I'm happy that this has become a much looked forward to tradition at TBS. We had to abbreviate last year's Mitzvah Day, but this year we are planning to add some new activities. Please join us on Sunday May 1st — you can help our Religious School students raise money with a walkathon for Temple Beth Sholom: donate blood or help with our blood drive; spruce up the Temple as we help garden and plant; help collect toiletries and personal hygiene products for the needy, and much more.

This month we will celebrate two B'nei Mitzvah, as well as Parents' Association Shabbat in conjunction with Junior Congregation's Shared Shabbat. We are back in the synagogue! 



I'm not a big fan of cold weather. I always look forward to winter coming to an end, the trees and flowers starting to bloom, and the weather really warming up.

Of course, the coming of Passover is a good indicator, along with Easter, that we're seriously coming into the spring. But for me, the real serious wakeup call is OPENING DAY of the Major League Baseball season. I sit here at my computer writing this article on that very day!

I've been a baseball fan pretty much my entire life. My dad was a truly excellent athlete, and a lifelong Yankees fan, as am I. He taught me about the game, and taught me to play. He wasn't always an easygoing teacher. The man was a power-hitting shortstop with a tremendous arm, and somehow thought that throwing at me as hard as he could was a good idea. Nonetheless, I survived and played in little league as a catcher for a number of years.

I then went on to play ball in high school and college. When my daughters were younger, they both played girls softball in little league. Their coach asked if I could help out a bit, and I told him I'd be glad to, so long as I didn't have to deal with the parents - I'd work directly with the kids. Somewhere along the line, one of the dads from another team saw me working with the girls and told me I looked like a ballplayer. He asked if I'd like to play some softball on Sunday mornings. I did that for a while, and then one of the guys asked if I was interested in playing "hardball" - meaning playing real baseball again. I couldn't imagine how that would work.

I was then introduced to the Men's Senior Baseball League. It's sort of a "league of their own" for old guys. Incredibly, at the then age of about 42, it was back to baseball. And despite a broken arm, a broken ankle, a broken finger, and various other bumps and bruises, I'd continued to play each season for 11 years. Then, when I'd started to work regularly as a cantor, I'd decided I couldn't afford to get hurt anymore. I do miss playing, but life goes on.

I made some wonderful friends playing men's senior baseball, and they're still my very close friends to this day. Baseball has been like music has been for me - a source of great personal satisfaction which has brought me into contact with wonderful people.

So you see, when baseball season arrives, in stirs up lots of good memories - of my childhood, of my dad, of my friends, and of good times in general. I've got to go now, and watch the Yankees take on the Boston Red Sox. Now that's a classic opening day! Enjoy the spring my friends!!

April Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, April 11th, 2022, via Zoom. President Joy Bobrow wished all a sweet seder and shared some personal reflections on the crisis in Ukraine. The minutes of the last meeting were accepted with corrections.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported membership is 114 member units after the addition of one new member but resignation of another family unit. The next round of statements will go out after the Passover holiday. Treasurer Charlene Metz will review the March and April Financial Reports at the next meeting.

Rabbi Ballan thanked everyone who celebrated her 13 years in the rabbinate with her and AJR, her seminary. She is thankful to be back in the synagogue and had a very wellattended Shared Shabbat/unior Congregation with Karen Feit and Akiva the Believer. The first B'nei Mitzvah since October was celebrated this past Shabbat; two more will be celebrated in May. She wished all a very sweet Pesach. Cantor Jerry Korobow reported Shared ShabbatService on Friday, April 1st went extremely well with special guest, Akiva the Believer with terrific participation from those in the sanctuary. He reported on the fun Religious School/Family Education session in the ballroom to learn about Passover and requested more parents to attend these Family Education events. David Close will likely be available to play for Confirmation Service on Friday, June 3rd, and possibly Akiva will be able to return to Temple for Shared Shabbat Service on Friday, June 17th.

Vice-President Dr. Fay Schildkraut, Membership Chair, presented Anne (Kupferberg) Pepper for acceptance as a virtual affiliate and the Board unanimously approved this. The Open House Welcome Back Dinner is planned for Friday September 16th, 2022.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit and Ritual Committee Chair, reported in-person and Zoom Services are going well. The committee discussed coordination of ushers and Pulpit Officer for upcoming bar mitzvahs and that we need two ushers – one to check in guests at the lobby door, and one to greet and hand out prayer books at the sanctuary door. The scheduled shared Shabbat for May 6th will be moved to join the PA Service on May 13th to allow the bar mitzvah family the honors on May 6th.

President Bobrow discussed a draft of proposed Amendments to the Bylaws concerning Conflict of Interest and Fiscal Policies. This language is required for the preapproval for the security grant we are submitting and is considered standard for organizations such as ours. The wording was discussed, and revisions proposed for clarity. The Board unanimously voted to pass a motion to approve proposed amendments concerning Conflict of Interest and Fiscal Policies to the Bylaws for presentation to the Congregation to vote for ratification at the May Congregation Meeting.

Erica Bernstein, PA Co-President, thanked everyone who participated in the April 1st Shared Shabbat. PA will host a Zoom cooking event on April 17th to make matzo brei and will host a May 15th Lag B'Omer event at Cunningham Park.

Andrea Odintz, Religious School Board Committee Chair, reported on Shared Shabbat and Family Education events. She reported on the upcoming anti-Semitism awareness workshop led by TBS member Roberta Kossoff, on Sunday, April 24th from 10:30 am to noon. Mitzvah Day is on Sunday, May 1st during Religious School class time.

Barbara Gandelman, Sisterhood President, reported the next Book Club is scheduled on May 25th at 7:30 pm to discuss The Star and The Shamrock by Jean Grainger. Memorial Day Rummage Sale needs volunteers and donations. The next Bingo will be on Wednesday, April 28th at 7:30 pm. The Women's Discussion Group will be held on May 4th and June 1st. Adult Discussion group will be held on Monday, April 18th at 7:30. She thanked Deirdre Weliky for running these events.





Ariella Bannon has no choice: she must put her precious children, Liesl and Erich, on that train or allow them to become prey for the Nazis.

Berlin 1939.

When her husband doesn't come home one day, Ariella realises that the only way she can ensure her Jewish children's safety is to avail of the Kindertransport, but can she bear to let them go?

A thousand miles away, Elizabeth Klein has closed herself off from the world. Losing her husband on the last day of the Great War, and her child months later, she cannot, will not, love again. It hurts too much.

But she is all Liesl and Erich Bannon have.

Thrown together in the wild countryside of Northern Ireland, Elizabeth and the Bannon children discover that life in the country is anything but tranquil. Danger and intrigue lurk everywhere, and some people are not what they seem.

From the streets of wartime Berlin, to the bombed out city of Liverpool, and finally resting in the lush valleys of the Ards Penisula, *The Star and The Shamrock* from USA Today bestselling author Jean Grainger, is unputdownable.






