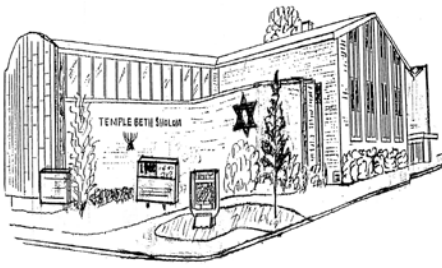

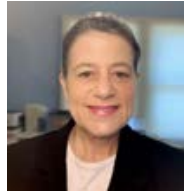

From the Rabbi's desk

This month, the Jewish calendar is almost in sync with the secular calendar. The month of Sivan begins on May 31st, so June is essentially Sivan. The only holiday to fall in Sivan is Shavuot, the last of our three major Jewish festivals. Another name for Shavuot is *Z'man Mattan Torateinu*, the time of the giving of our Torah. Our Torah, our most precious and sacred possession is at the heart of Shavuot, one reason the Reform movement has built a ceremony around it, the Confirmation Service.

We will celebrate with our Confirmands on Shabbat evening, Friday, June 3rd (which is almost Shavuot). This year we will return to the synagogue to celebrate with Dara Bernstein, Aviva Kaufman, Justin White and Seth White and their families in person. They will be leading us in prayer. I hope you join us!

On Sunday, June 5th, join us on Zoom for our Shavuot and Yizkor Service at 10:00 am, where we will hear the chanting of the Ten Commandments.

As June/Sivan winds down and we look forward to graduations, summer vacations, and taking it a little easier in the hot months to come, know that at Temple Beth Sholom we are busily preparing for next year. If you get a call asking to participate in our High Holy Day services—please say yes!

May Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, May 9th, 2022, via Zoom.

President Joy Bobrow reminded all to attend the May 25th Congregational Meeting, where the proposed By-laws amendments will be reviewed for vote to ratify. The minutes of the last meeting were accepted as presented.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported that membership is 112 member units after the passing of Ruth Schorsch and removal of another family unit for no payments since February 2020. Statements were mailed out. Treasurer Charlene Metz reviewed the April Financial Reports and the Board accepted them as presented.

Rabbi Ballan reported on the successful Mitzvah Day. Next week we will celebrate Lag B'Omer in Cunningham Park. Shabbat Services have been well attended; both in person and Zoom. She asked all to attend the Parents' Association/Shared Shabbat this coming Friday. The final Bar Mitzvah of the season is on May 21st. She will be taking vacation the weekend of May 27th and we will be "in good hands with the Cantor." Sisterhood will be leading the service that Friday. Cantor Jerry Korobow reported the 7th Day of Passover Service with Yizkor in April went well, as did the Shabbat/Yom HaShoah Service on April 29th. This past Saturday, May 7th, we celebrated the Bar Mitzvah of Seth Hellman who was poised and confident. David Close will not be available for the Confirmation Service on June 3rd. Akiva "The Believer" Wharton will be with us for Shared Shabbat on Friday, June 17th.

President Bobrow presented the additional proposed Amendment to the By-laws concerning the Clergy Membership category which had been circulated to the Board prior to this meeting. There were no objections to it by Clergy. The Board voted to approve the motion to present By-laws Amendment concerning refinement of Membership categories to amend the definition of a family unit and to add a new Member category relating to Clergy Members by changing Article II (Section 2 and 3) at the May Congregation Meeting.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit and Ritual Committee Chair, reported they are reviewing the service dates for next year, to schedule shared Shabbats, maybe a special service arranged by the Cantor. Summer services are scheduled, and some have been reserved already; open dates are the last three weeks in July, August 5th, and 26th.

Elaine Larkin, PA Co-President, reported on May events and thanked all involved in Mitzvah Day activities. Parents' Association will help lead the Shared Shabbat with the Religious/Hebrew School students on Friday May 13th. On Sunday, May 15th, there will be a Lag B'Omer celebration at Cunningham Park after Religious School.

Andrea Odintz, Religious School Board Committee Chair, reported on Shared Shabbat and Family Education events as well as May and June events. She announced her intention to step down as Religious School Committee Chair at the end of the school year and stated it has been an honor to serve Temple in this capacity.

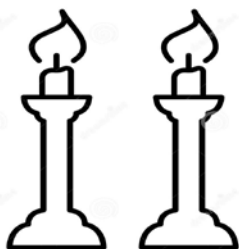

Bush proclaimed May as the month for "paying tribute to the generations of Jewish Americans who helped form the fabric of American history, culture and society," over 350 years.
