June Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, June 13th, 2022, via Zoom.

President Joy Bobrow reported all the amendments to the by-laws that the board approved were passed by the Congregation. She submitted the Department of Homeland Security Grant by the deadline on May 31st. She thanked Jim Kettig and Eric Lustig for their help. She expects to receive notification in late September. The PPP Loan forgiveness application was submitted and approved meaning that the \$61,000 that we received will not have to be repaid. She reported Andrea Odintz is stepping down from Religious School Chair and there have been some willing to "step up" but will need more volunteers to support the school. She thanked Walter Constanza for getting our computers back up and running.

The minutes of the last meeting were accepted as presented. Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported membership is down to 110 member units after the resignation of 2 member units. Treasurer Charlene Metz reviewed the May Financial reports and the Board accepted it as presented.

Rabbi Ballan reported on the final Bar Mitzvah of the season, and on June 3rd, the first in-person Confirmation service in two years. Confirmands Dara Bernstein, Aviva Kaufman, Justin White, and Seth White made us all proud. Friday, June 17th will be our final Shared Shabbat with special guest Akiva. Our outdoor service will take place at Crocheron Park on June 24th. Her vacation starts on July 1st but she will be available in an emergency by cell phone. Cantor Korobow can assist if needed and she will forward the names (and numbers) of two colleagues in the area who can fill in if needed. Cantor Jerry Korobow reported on recent and upcoming services and echoed the Rabbi.

Fay Schildkraut, Membership Committee Chair, reported a new member will be presented at the next meeting. They are working on details of an Open House on Friday, Sept $16^{\rm th}$ at 6:00 pm. They hope to raise money for the meal and offer it as a free welcome back open house dinner from the Temple. Membership would like to work with the Pulpit Committee on getting more people to participate in Shavuot.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit and Ritual Committee Chair, reported there were 2 more dates open for Shabbat Lay Leaders this summer. They are working on honors for High Holiday services.

Elaine Larkin, PA Co-President, reported on June events and acknowledged Andrea Odintz for her hard work and dedication in heading up the Religious School Board these past few years. Andrea Odintz, Religious School Board Committee Chair, reported on end of school year events and Shared Shabbat plans. She discussed plans for the next school year. She thanked the Board for their attention these past five years.

Barbara Gandelman, Sisterhood President, submitted the report on the next Book Club scheduled on July 14^{th} at 7:30 pm to discuss <u>The Emerald Horizon</u>, sequel to <u>The Star and The Shamrock</u> by Jean Grainger.

Deirdre Weliky, Caring Committee Chair, submitted report that calls are being made to several older members, most of whom are homebound. Get well and condolence cards have been sent as needed. Adult Discussion group will meet Monday, June 20th at 7:30 pm via Zoom to discuss "How Gender Roles Have Impacted Me".

President Bobrow reported the Food Pantry continues to serve many local families. Gail Tishcoff, Blood Drive Captain reported the next blood drive is scheduled for Sunday, November 20th, otherwise known as "The Sunday before Thanksgiving". There is a big need for donations and all who can are urged to find a site to donate this month and next prior to our next drive.

Ilyne Rabinowitz, Social Action Committee Chair reported they met on June 9th and discussed connecting with local charitable organizations such as domestic violence shelters, WomanKIND, and places that care for foster children. There is a significant need for goods and resources for foster children who age out of the system at 18 years old. They discussed the possibility of starting a seasonal donation drive about four times per year for these organizations, collecting new and gently-used goods from the TBS community to then donate. Committee meetings will be held monthly. The next meeting will be on Thursday, July 7th at 7:30 pm.

Barry Packer, Ways & Means Committee Chair, reported on follow up ideas to use Renee's Zoom show as a fundraiser. Eric Bernstein, Adult Education Committee Chair, reported on a 6-hour on-line defensive driving course, which would potentially raise some funds for Temple

President Bobrow, Bazaar Co-Chair, reported sorting of items for Bazaar will start soon. Books for Bazaar is going well. She hopes Bazaar 2022 will be more like Bazaars of old. All were reminded that the Calendar Planning meeting will be on June 15th at 7:30 pm via Zoom.
