As we enter November, Rabbis and Cantors all over the world typically express a sigh of relief. We have just begun the month of Cheshvan, (which arrived this year on October 26), and it does not have a single Jewish holiday in it! To many, that is a little sad, so it is also known "Marcheshvan," or sad/bitter Cheshvan. I am of the opinion that this nickname is taken sarcastically among clergy. We need one month where nothing special happens! Of course, that really isn't the case many important events are taking place in November at Temple Beth Sholom—Shared Shabbat November 4. as well as Men's Club Shabbat on November 11.

And, there is also Thanksgiving, which most people don't associate with Judaism. Did you know that the Pilgrims based this holiday on our festival of Sukkot, the fall harvest festival? #### From The President

To My Temple Family,

As I sit writing this article, wearing socks, I know that fall is really here! We had wonderful and inspiring High Holy Day Services, and it was a joy to welcome so many of our Temple members to the sanctuary. Thank you to all who participated in, and attended, the services. The Rabbi and the Cantor provided inspirational services and Geri Weiss worked diligently making sure so many congregants took part and that it all went smoothly. And a heartfelt thank you to Natalie for putting up with all of us and ensuring that we had all the lists, paperwork, memorial booklets, etc. that were needed!

In my last month's column, I had included what I thought would be my remarks for Rosh Hashanah morning. However, the day before Rosh Hashanah I read beautiful words written by a rabbi which I instead shared with the congregation. The gist of my remarks was to remind everyone that we need to strengthen our telling children bv them about the accomplishments of the Jewish people over the ages and that we need to stand tall and proud, openly celebrating our faith. We cannot hide! We need to be unified. We need to make sure that our Temple continues to stand so that we can be here for all who need a place to gather and be a part of a something grand and glorious. We NEED your support in all ways thinkable - volunteering, spiritually and financially.

I am pleased to report that due to a lot of hard work by Jim Kettig and Eric Lustig (and myself) Temple Beth Sholom was awarded \$144,020 in federal funding from the FY2022 Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP) for target hardening activities to protect our building. Funding for this grant is provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and is subject to both New York State and Federal guidelines and regulations. We will need lots of help from our Temple Family to make sure that every I is dotted and every T is crossed as we proceed with obtaining all of the necessary contractors, etc.

#### October Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2022, via Zoom.

President Joy Bobrow thanked the Membership Committee for the recent Open House as well as the Religious School Board committee for assuring things went smoothly. She thanked Rabbi and Cantor for the wonderful Rosh Hashanah services and the Tech Team for helping them be Zoomed for those who did not attend in person. She reported on efforts to introduce TBS to our neighbors and let them know of the non-sectarian work we do to serve the community. She thanked all who have come out to help sort books. She reported we are waiting for official notice of our receipt of the Homeland Security Grant. She wished all a meaningful fast.

September Minutes were accepted as presented.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we now have 108 member units. There was no financial report to discuss this month.

Rabbi Ballan reported on High Holiday Services. Volunteers were needed to help set up the new, very large, Sukkah that Temple Gates of Prayer has purchased for both congregations to use. She wished all a G'mar Tov and sweet new year. Cantor Korobow added his thank you to Larry Gold for the portable sound system that worked very well for outdoors services.

Geri Weiss, Pulpit and Ritual Committee Chair, reported on High Holidays attendance and thanked everyone who contributed to the coordination of the services.

Elaine Larkin, PA Co-President reported for both Religious School and Parents' Association. She reported on upcoming services and holiday events including Pizza in the Hut on October 9<sup>th</sup>.

Fay Schildkraut, Membership Committee Chair, presented the Lothammer family, Nancy and Jacob and their sons Walter and Trevor, for membership. The Board unanimously approved. She also presented Stuart and Vicki Belsky, past members of TBS now residing in Florida, for Virtual Affiliation; the Board approved. There are other potential members she is in contact with. She thanked all who helped, donated, and attended the "truly wonderful" Open House.

Barbara Gandelman, Sisterhood President, reported the Paid-Up event is on Thursday, October 27th. Bingo will continue Thursday, November 10th at 8:00 pm, and the next book club is Sunday, November 20th on Zoom at 10:30 am. I hope you all enjoy a very Happy Thanksgiving.






