From the Rabbi's desk

Chag Urim Sameach!

I am writing this article on Election Day. We just turned the clocks back—although I enjoy the extra hour of sleep, I really don't like the early evening darkness. It hasn't seemed much like fall, as temperatures have been very mild. I still have tomatoes growing! This is a first for me. Usually, my garden is done by mid-October. Nonetheless, I expect by the time you read this, it will be colder, and yes, much darker. This year, the Winter Solstice will fall during the holiday of Chanukah, which begins on the evening of December 18th. On the Hebrew calendar, Chanukah begins on the 25th of Kisley, and ends on the 2nd of Tevet. This means that we will celebrate a Rosh Chodesh (a new month and a new moon). So the days will be at their shortest, and the moon will be just a sliver if visible at all. No sun and no moon—it will be very dark indeed.

I am reminded of a midrash from the Talmud [Avodah Zara 8b] in which Adam, the first human, was afraid when he noticed the days getting shorter and shorter. He thought, "perhaps because I sinned, the world is getting darker around me, and will ultimately return to chaos and disorder (of the universe before creation). This is the death that was sentenced upon me from Heaven." He then arose and spent eight days fasting and in prayer. Once he saw that the days were getting longer (since the winter solstice had passed), he realized that this is the way of the world, since the days would get longer and shorter throughout the year.

So the next year, instead of fasting and prayer, he set up an eight-day festivity, for the sake of Heaven."

This may have been the rabbis' explanation of why there are so many festivals of light during the dark time of the year and alludes tο our current festival Chanukah. Chanukah celebration of the miracle of the oil and the Maccabees' victory over King Antiochus. Both were miracles, yet simple things such as the ebb and flow of the seasonslight and darkness we experience each year—are miracles, too. Chanukah gives us a chance to bring more light into our lives, acknowledge these daily miracles, and to sit by and admire God's works.

December brings lots of activity to Temple Beth Sholom. Bazaar!!! This year, we are having a special Shared Shabbat/Simchat Shabbat right before Bazaar on December 2nd. Please note the different time—services begin at **7:00 pm**, and if you come at 6:30, a pizza Shabbat dinner will be served. It will be an extra musical Shabbat, as we will have Maestro David Close joining us on keyboards, in addition to Karen Feit, Cantor Korobow and me.

The Board of Trustees met on Monday November 14th, 2022. via Zoom.

President Joy Bobrow began her report with a moment of silence to remember Carl Rabinowitz, long-time TBS member and past Board Member, who passed away this week. She updated the Board on the complicated process of obtaining the Homeland Security Grant funds that we were approved for.

October minutes were approved by the Board as presented.

Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we now have 110 member units with one re-instated member and a new family that joined. The Board approved the October Financial Report as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz.

Rabbi reported from Norwalk, CT at her rabbinic retreat on the topic of Building Community. She reported on recent services that have gone well. She has started some in-person tutoring for B'nei Mitzvah students and is happy to be back in person for Hebrew School on Wednesdays. She expressed her hope to continue to serve this Temple Community well into the future. Cantor Korobow reported on recent services and also said what a great job Aviva Kaufman and Justin White are doing volunteering to support Religious School students. He reported David Close, and Akiva the Believer, will each be joining us next month on December 2nd and December 23rd, respectively. He is in contact with Gathering Time, which wants to join us for a service in the spring.

This is the night we would be gathering at the abode of Suzanne and Bret Fertig; and Suzanne has been the "hostess with the mostest" for every one of Team Chicken Soup's meetings throughout the years---gracious with her time and space, snacks and drinks. 
