

May Board of Trustees Meeting

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, May 8, 2023, via Zoom.

President Joy Bobrow reported a new fundraising activity by using Bing as a search engine. The Congregational Meeting is Wednesday, May 24. She thanked Eric Bernstein and everyone for advising on website updates, and she thanked Rabbi and Walter for making the changes. The date planning meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, June 14.

April minutes were accepted as presented and corrected by Recording Secretary Gail Tishcoff. Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported our member units remain at 108. Statements were sent out to those who are not on payment plans who still have outstanding balances. The Board approved the April Financial Report as presented by Treasurer Charlene Metz.

Rabbi Ballan reported on current and upcoming services and the results of Sofer Neil Yerman's inspection of our Torahs. We will have a dairy dinner at the end of this month, preceding our Shavuot/Shabbat/Yizkor Service and the reading of the 10 Commandments. Geri Weiss, Pulpit & Ritual Committee Chair, still needs volunteers to lead summer Shabbat service.

Elaine Larkin, Parents Association Co-President, reported on the recent May 5 Parents Association/Shared Shabbat Service. Ben and Matthew Cohen unveiled the two leaves that have been dedicated to their father, Jeff Cohen. One leaf was dedicated to Jeff from PA and the other leaf was dedicated to Jeff by his mother. She added, "Jeff was a huge part of not only PA, but of TBS in general. By honoring Jeff, we also honor his legacy (Ben and Matthew)." Elaine Larkin reported for the Religious School Committee. The school held the annual Lag B'Omer picnic this past Sunday, May 7. At this time the students also did the walk-a-thon for Mitzvah Day. After class, families participated in a softball event to honor former TBS member Jeff Cohen. The next School Board meeting will be on May 10, via Zoom, at 8:00 pm. Barry Packer, Ways & Means Committee Chair, reported on the Jeff Cohen Memorial Softball Game yesterday and said it may become an annual event with the Lag B'Omer Picnic. The raffle was extended through the Board Meeting for anyone who wanted to participate who had not had a chance to at the picnic. The prizes included minor league baseball and basketball tickets. Letters are being drafted to past Chicken Soup Cook-Off vendors as well as new businesses which may want to participate, to let them know that the event will be on November 11. As suggested, an inquiry has started to see if there would be interest in breaking the Yom Kippur fast together at Temple.

Eric Bernstein, Adult Education Chair, thanked the committees for their feedback and the Rabbi and Walter for taking the time to update the Temple website. Although it is tedious work maintaining the website, it does help the marketing of our congregation. June 4 Adult Ed will screen a documentary on Chiune Sugihara, a Japanese diplomat and consul to Lithuania during World War II who helped thousands of Jewish families escape through Asia.

President Bobrow, Bazaar Co-Chair, reported that at the May 5 service, we received a \$9,000 check from Evan Cohen, in lieu of having books as part of Bazaar, and she thanked the Cohen family for this donation. Good and Welfare was shared, and winning raffle tickets were pulled. Temple raised \$170.00 from the raffle.




