You know, actually writing these articles each month is no problem. I've always enjoyed writing, and it generally comes easily to me. More often, the big issue is what to write about. Fortunately, outside help sometimes appears just when you need it.

This morning, I opened Newsday and started to browse. On page 15, I saw the following headline: "Dispatcher Not Ready to Slow Down at 100". The two-column article told all about Mary Brenner, who volunteers as a dispatcher for the Huntington Community First Aid Squad. She sends ambulance crews to emergencies with calm efficiency, and will have turned 100 the day after this article was published.

Mary was quoted as saying "I enjoy it. I don't plan to retire, I'm staying until my body gives out and I can't do it any longer." This remarkable lady has been doing this public service since December 1977!

I don't know Mary Brenner, but I'm fortunate to know folks like her. That is to say, I'm proud to have friends who, despite being quite advanced in age, have remained impressively engaged. I've written about some of them before, but as to one "old" friend, an update seems appropriate.

I met Drew Smith maybe ten years ago through playing music with banjo legend Roger Sprung. Roger passed away last August at the age of 92. He had continued to play concerts until a few years before that. Drew often played with us, demonstrating stunning virtuosity on the autoharp.

Drew is now 96-years-old. And, though he finally gave up his Harley Davidson motorcycle about 10 years ago, he continues to make music. Though he doesn't get out much, he's enthusiastically jumped onboard the "Zoom" train. I recently had the great good fortune to catch up with him on a Sunday afternoon Zoom folk music session, and he's still playing, singing, and enjoying himself and others. Despite health challenges and age, the man remains engaged.

And that, my friends, is what it's all about. Each Friday morning for the last year or so, I've led Shabbat Services at a nursing home in Great Neck. I very much look forward to those services, and I believe the residents there do as well. I encourage them to sing, clap, ask questions, and make comments. I want them to be, and to remain, engaged. That, my friends, I believe to be the key to aging well and gracefully. Find things to stimulate yourself, and jump right in. That's what I hope to keep doing for the foreseeable future. What about you? Hope to see you at services in the near future, and hopefully, for a long time to come.




