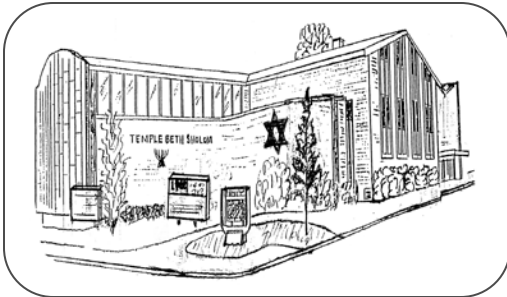

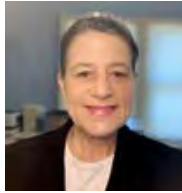

## From the Rabbi's desk

Having just completed the holiday of Pesach, we are now in the period of the "omer" which began the second night of Passover and continues until Shavuot. The *omer*, which literally means "a measure," was an offering of the first of the grain or barley harvest, which was brought to the Temple. We learn in the Torah to count seven weeks from the time of the offering of the omer. The Hebrew word for week is 'shavua' which is derived from the word for seven, *sheva*. Shavuot is the plural of shavua, literally meaning 'weeks.' Thus, because of this ritual counting, the period between Passover and Shavuot became known as the *omer*. Shavuot, like Pesach and Sukkot, the other two holidays of the *shalosh regalim*, is dual in nature. It is both agricultural and historical. Passover celebrates our liberation from Egypt and slavery, and Shavuot celebrates our receiving of Torah at Sinai. It can be hard to connect the agricultural aspect of the *omer* period to our modern lives. But, perhaps in our counting the *omer*, we can symbolically connect liberation with the idea of Torah, and to change the focus to one of preparing ourselves to receive Torah and committing to heal and repair the world.

One way to start is to participate in our Mitzvah Day on May 5. You can help our Religious School students raise money with a Walk-A-Thon for Temple Beth Sholom; donate blood or help with our Blood Drive; spruce up the Temple as we help garden and plant spring flowers.

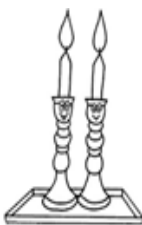

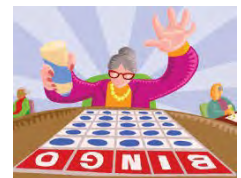

Why sing? What does singing do for me, or for anyone? What is it about music? I suppose that after all these years, I could write a very lengthy dissertation to try and answer those questions.

But first, I wanted to let you all know that our wonderful volunteer choir will be participating in our Yom HaShoah Shabbat Service on Friday night, May 3 at 7:30 pm.

Now, I want to get back to the questions at hand. Rather than trying to wax poetic, I thought I would pass on some interesting commentary sent to me over a period of time on Facebook. While I don't have attributions for most of them, they are all very much worth sharing.

## *April Board of Trustees Meeting*

The Board of Trustees met on Monday, April 8, via Zoom. President Joy Bobrow welcomed new trustee Beth Dulberg to her first Board Meeting. She thanked Lori Lustig and Geri Weiss for assembling and delivering Shalach Manot baskets. She discussed ongoing ways to avoid parking lot issues. We need a new Social Action Committee Chair since Ilyne Rabinowitz cannot chair at this time. She wished all a Happy Pesach.

Gail Tishcoff, Recording Secretary, presented the March minutes which were accepted. Robin Myers, Financial Secretary, reported we now have 111 member units as we added two family units, but lost one member who recently passed away. There was no Financial Report this month.

Cantor Korobow reported on recent and upcoming services. He hopes as the weather gets better, that in-person attendance will improve as well. The volunteer TBS Choir will sing at the Yom HaShoah Shabbat Service on Friday, May 3. Rabbi Ballan reported on recent and upcoming services. Purim Services were lovely and well-attended. Religious instruction is going well. Our next Bar Mitzvah is Seth Bernstein in May, followed by Melanee Heisler in June. Our next Chai Mitzvah is on the topic, "Because We Were Slaves: The Jewish Struggle for Justice in Making America Home" will take place on Monday, April 15 at 7:30 pm. She wished all a Zissen Pesach in advance and she added she hoped all were able to experience the solar eclipse earlier that day.

Lori Lustig, Membership Committee Chair, presented new member Maria DeFrancesco, who was approved by the Board. The committee is starting to plan the September Open House, tentatively planned for September 6, which is the Friday after Labor Day. Geri Weiss, Pulpit and Ritual Chair, reported we have started screen-sharing the Prayer for Israel during services. The April 19 Shabbat Service will feature pre-Shabbat appetizers. The Yom HaShoah service will include the congregational choir. As there are new reprints of the Shabbat Service book, we will offer the opportunity to buy a book plate again to insert in the front cover for \$36. She said it's not too early to start thinking about leading a summer service.

Elaine Larkin, PA Co-President, reported there will be a virtual Passover cooking event led by Nancy Lothammer on Saturday, April 20 at 6:00 pm. PA and Men's Club have booked the area at Cunningham Park for this year's Lag B'Omer event, to be held on Sunday, May 19, starting at 10:00 am. Elaine also reported for the Religious School Committee. The next Shared Shabbat will be on Friday May 17 at 7:30 pm. On Wednesday, April 10 Religious School students will be going to the Forest Hills Jewish Center from 3:00 - 6:00 pm to help prepare Passover bags. Religious School Model Passover Seder will be on Sunday, April 14 at 10:00 am.
